The ladies came in to speak about their experiences with Suicide--- as a survivor or having lost loved ones. They spoke about an upcoming walk on September 17th which will be held at Constitution Park in Camarillo.

Suicide most often occurs when stressors exceed current coping abilities of someone suffering from a mental health condition.

2. Suicide Warning Signs
3. Specific things to look out for
4. Suicide Risk Factors

More young people die by suicide than from cancer, homicide, heart disease, pneumonia, or diabetes.

The Survivor Outreach Program is a national network of volunteers who have experienced the loss of a loved one to suicide and who receive training to visit others who have experienced a similar loss.
