This company town is home to around 2,200 people, and the coal-fired power plant and nearby coal mine are the community's largest employers. But Colstrip's plant is primarily owned by out-of-state utility companies who want to wean customers off electricity generated by coal and replace it with renewable energy. The Obama administration is also making it hard for this town that coal built, with a plan to fight climate change that would force Montana to drastically reduce its carbon emissions. Can the people of Colstrip win the war on coal? Or will this small town be forced to forgo its namesake to survive?
