Organ donation could help up to 8 people through organ donation and up to 50 through tissue donation. To become an organ donor, you can either tell them you want to when you renew your driver's license or sign up online @ donatelife.org . Their slogan is "My Heart's For Hunter" and organ donators will now have a heart on their license to represent the slogan. Only
