All tax preparers are trained and certified by the IRS each year to complete Rhode Island and Massachusetts state returns and federal forms. The AARP Tax Aide program is the nation's largest free tax preparation service. Newport County sites open on Monday, Feb. 1, and will continue to operate through April 15.
