2. Mail the letters via certified mail.

1. All letters must be sent via certified mail.

- 2. If you are a JSA or LMA, the letters must be signed by the licensee of the station. please let an employee of the licensee know this and ask them for their letterhead so you can print the letters.
- 3. Each individual station will need to send out a letter on its letterhead.

4. Copies of the election letters need to go in the public file.

PLEASE SEND THE LETTERS WITHIN 3 DAYS OF THIS EMAIL. PLEASE SEND ME AN EMAIL ONCE YOU HAVE SENT OUT ALL OF THE LETTERS CONFIRMING THAT THE LETTERS WERE SENT SO THAT I MAY KEEP TRACK OF LETTERS SENT.

Barry Faber wrote:

- > a few notes on the upcoming process for making cable retrans elections:
- > 1. the deadline for making retrans elections with cable MSOs for the next retrans cycle (1/1/06-12/31/08) is september 30, 2005.
- > 2. sharron tindal is currently in the process of creating a database for each of our stations containing all cable systems in each market (together with addresses); thank you to all of you for your help in getting this information correct.
- > 3. on or about september 9th, sharron will be e-mailing to each of you the form of letter to be used for retrans elections, together with a mail merge database which will allow you to print out the letters for use in your market.
- > 4. in order to minimize the work the stations have to do, you will only need to send one letter to each MSO in your market; sharron will be including in the materials she e-mails you an exhibit 1 for each MSO (to be attached to the letter you send), which exhibit will list the various communities served by each such MSO; this should be a big improvement over the last time we did this when you had to send out a separate letter to each mso for each system they operated.

- > 4. *we will NOT be sending the elections from corporate*; each station will have to print out these letters for their station(s) and send them out. letters must be sent certified mail and should be sent within 5 business days of your receipt of the letters from sharron.
- > 5. copies of the election letters must be placed in your public file.
- > 6. if any of the letters you send out come back to you because of problems with the address, you should try to get a more current address so you can resend them prior to the september 30 deadline. if you can't get a more current address, please let sharron know.
- > 7. if you have a station in your market which we program pursuant to an LMA or TBA or to which we provide services pursuant to a JSA or outsourcing agreement, we will still be preparing the files for the election letters, but the letters must be signed by the licensee of the station. please let an employee of the licensee know this and ask them for their letterhead so you can print the letters out when sharron sends them for the licensee's signature.
- > please let sharron or me know if you have any questions regarding any of this. thank you.
