The shooter had already killed three nine-year-olds and three staff members when the officers opened fire, killing the 28-year-old shooter. One officer said training kicked in, and he just remembered his oath to serve and protect the community.

Montgomery police are investigating a violent weekend in the Capitol City with 4 separate shootings. A woman was shot just after 4:30 Sunday morning. Police found her with a non-life threatening gunshot wound. Three men were shot in 3 other separate incidents, making this the fourth shooting in three days. All victims survived.

Bond has been denied for 5 of the 6 suspects charged in the mass shooting in Dadeville. All of the suspects except the 15-year-old (who was not in court for the hearing) appeared before a Judge in Tallapoosa County on Tuesday. ALEA Special Agent Jess Thornton testified at the hearing. 80 shell casings from 4 types of handguns were recovered at the scene. One of the guns appears to have been altered for rapid fire.
