## Section I. Issues

The stations have identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. **Ecology:** K2 Radio covers topics and stories about the invasive animals in our community including feral cats, grasshoppers and Mormon crickets, and the wild turkeys. We also talk to experts about invasive plant species not limited to Russian Olive trees.
- B. **Food Insecurity:** K2 Radio covers stories of our local food supply and how businesses are trying to increase more localized food sources through business connections. Casper was once described as a "food desert," but foodpreneurs are working to change that, in tandem increasing community-focused events and partnerships. We talk to several people about gardening in Wyoming both the joys and challenges that come with it.
- C. **Community Awareness:** K2 Radio speaks with local agencies about community issues like crimes related to drugs and alcohol in the community and its impact on residents' safety. We also talked to city council members in the wake of Casper Mayor Bruce Knell resigning.
- D. **Healthcare:** The founder of Jason's Friends discusses the financial costs associated with cancer and how difficult it is to find care in Wyoming. Often, people must travel out-of-state for treatment and it can be quite taxing in all aspects of their life.
- E. **Economy:** K2Radio is dedicated to learning about Casper's small businesses and what's being done to help them thrive. We also talk to Amy White, the director of an organization called Dress for Success, to learn about resources available to women to gain employment.
- F. **Suicide:** For Suicide Awareness Month, we chatted with Carol Salveson about the work she is doing to prevent Veteran Suicide. We discussed the enormous problem of suicide in Wyoming.
