Beverly Sher has taught over one-hundred semesters of her "Emerging Diseases" seminar. While studying AIDS in the 1990s, SARS in 2003, the H1N1 pandemic in 2009 and the modern COVID-19 pandemic she shared how students realize what public health crises reveal about the psychology and sociology of a nation. Also in this episode, as it was first identified in the United States in 1975, Lyme disease has become the world's most common disease to spread from animals to humans through the bite of infected ticks. The sooner it's treated, the better the possible outcome for the patient. However, current testing for Lyme disease takes weeks. Brandon Justras shared that details about a rapid, at-home Lyme detection test he and his team are developing.


