Fourth Quarter 2023 KHGG-FM Issues Report

KHGG-FM simulcasts a three hour morning news program, "Arklahoma Today-Morning in the Fort from 6a-9am featuring local news, weather, sports, traffic, and public service interviews with non-profits and newsmakers. The program originates on KFPW-AM. Many of the interviews are focused on new developments regarding the new Foreign Mission Sales at Ebbing Airfield. The following is a list of guests appearing on the program Monday through Friday.

Monday, October 1 - Executive Director of the Fort Smith Boys and Girls Club, Beth Presley, outlines fall events at the various clubs, including a fundraising golf tournament, free music programs, and after school tutoring.
