We also reminded viewers that ballots need to be postmarked or dropped at a ballot box by 8pm on election day.

Health experts think the main culprit is that people think they are buying regular prescription drugs off the street, but many end up being laced with Fentanyl. While it works much like morphine, it is 50-100 times stronger.
