Among retailers with the highest interest rates are Staples with 28 percent and at Sales Jewelers you'll have to fork over 29 percent. Even when stores offer a discount for signing up, watch out. Let's say a consumer makes only the minimum payments on a thousand dollar balance on the average store credit card, it would take them 72 months to pay it off. That's about a year and a half longer than on a typical credit card. According to the experts, you should only use a retail credit card if you pay your balance off at the end of every month.

				<p>mammograms at the age of 45. That's five years later than its previous recommendation of 40. So women between the ages of 45 and 54 - who have an average risk of developing breast cancer - should have a mammogram once a year. But after the age of 55 a mammogram should be done every other year. The new guidelines are based on increasing evidence that mammography often produces "false positives" in younger women. Results that lead to an additional testing and surgery are often unnecessary. But at least one other influential group still recommends starting at 40. And another says mammograms aren't necessary until 50. Those are the new guidelines. The American Cancer Society also dropped its previous recommendation that women have a manual exam, so doctors can feel for abnormalities.</p>
SALUD	DESPIERTA AMERICA	26-oct	20ss	<p>Bacon, hot dogs and other processed meats are linked to cancer, un health agency says.</p> <p>Bacon, hot dogs and cold cuts are under fire: The World Health Organization threw its global weight behind years of experts' warnings and declared Monday that processed meats raise the risk of colon and stomach cancer and that red meat is probably harmful, too. Meat producers are angry, vegetarians are feeling vindicated, and cancer experts are welcoming the most comprehensive pronouncement yet on the relation between our modern meat-eating lifestyles and cancer. The WHO's International Agency for Research on Cancer in Lyon, France, analyzed decades of research and for the first time put processed meats in the same danger category as smoking or asbestos. That doesn't mean salami is as bad as cigarettes, only that there's a confirmed link to cancer. And even then, the risk is small. The results aren't that shocking in the U.S., where many parents fret over chemicals in cured meats and the American Cancer Society has long cautioned against eating too much steak and deli. But the U.N. agency's findings could shake up public health attitudes elsewhere, such as European countries where sausages are savored and smoked ham is a national delicacy. And they could hurt the American meat industry, which is arguing vigorously against linking their products with cancer, contending that the disease involves a number of lifestyle and environmental factors. While U.S. rates of colon cancer have been declining, it is the No. 2 cancer for women worldwide and No. 3 for men, according to the WHO.</p>

Irigoyen, one of the lead researchers on the study, recalled one mother saying she let the battery on her mobile phone run down to about 20%, then handed it to her child. The study grew out of physicians' observations of families in a clinic waiting room.

It's no secret that drinking too many sugary soft drinks can lead to weight gain, tooth decay, and other health problems. Now, more bad news for soda. A new study in the british medical journal says men who drank just two sweetened drinks per day had a 23-percent higher risk of going into heart failure. Researchers came to that conclusion by monitoring the food habits of 42-thousand swedish men. Heart failure happens when your heart isn't strong enough to pump enough blood and oxygen to support your body. The researchers warned, they only studied men between the ages of 45-and-79... So the findings may not apply to younger age groups or women.</p>

In the new video published on an ISIS-linked jihadi forum, one of two fighters threatened U.S. and French presidents Barack Obama and Francois Hollande with more attacks similar to the Paris massacre, according to the Middle East Media Research Institute. The video mentions Times Square and purports to show an explosive device being put together and a bomber zipping his jacket over a suicide belt. The New York City Police Department said it was aware of the video and was deploying additional members of its new anti-terrorism squad out of an abundance of caution.</p>
SALUD	DESPIERTA AMERICA	15-dic	20ss	<p>Antidepressants in pregnancy tied to autism</p> <p>Women who take antidepressants should seek out the advice of a physician if they wish to become pregnant, because new research suggests taking one popular class of the drugs-selective serotonin reuptake inhibitors (SSRIs)-during pregnancy can significantly increase a child's risk for autism. The study, published Monday in JAMA Pediatrics, finds women who took SSRIs during pregnancy increased their child's risk for autism by as much as 87 percent. In particular, the study finds these medications may be most harmful to a fetus during the second and third trimester of a pregnancy. The researchers didn't observe the same link between antidepressant use and heightened autism risk when the drugs were taken in the first trimester. "Given projections that depression will be the second leading cause of death by 2020, [antidepressants] are likely to remain widely used, including during pregnancy," the researchers write in their study. "Therefore, a better</p>

				understanding of the long-term neurodevelopmental effects of [antidepressants] on children when used during gestation is a public health priority." Try Newsweek for only \$1.25 per week For the study, researchers at the University of Montreal analyzed data from the Quebec Pregnancy/Children Cohort that includes data on all children born in the city between January 1, 1998 and December 31, 2009, adding up to 145,456 infants. A total of 1,054 (0.72 percent) were diagnosed with autism and the average age of diagnosis was 4.6 years old.
