As anchor of Eyewitness News This Morning and Eyewitness News at Noon, Lori Stokes has been an unflinching guide through everything from the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001 to the Northeastern Blackout of August 14, 2003. Along the way, Stokes has picked up Emmy and AP Awards for her reporting.

Prior to MSNBC/NBC Lori worked for ABC affiliate WJLA-TV in Washington, DC as evening anchor at six and 11 o'clock from 1992- 1996. While in the nation's capital, she also launched WJLA's Good Morning Washington.

She has received numerous awards for her reporting on social issues, in particular stories affecting women and children. As a street reporter from 1991-1992 for WBFF-TV in Baltimore, she received an Emmy Award for her in-depth coverage of children caught in the crossfire of local violence.

Her undercover journalistic work as a homeless person on the streets of Baltimore earned her an Associated Press Award. More recently, she received a 2006 Emmy nomination for a police chase on which she reported live in 2005.

Stokes is also the recipient of a George P. Foster Peabody Award for her September 11, 2001 coverage of the World Trade Center attack. On a national level, Stokes received the 2003 Congressional Black Caucus Celebration of Leadership Award for her civic service and her status as a role model.

This year, Stokes was named a "Woman of Influence" by Commerce magazine, placing her among the ranks of best-selling author Mary Higgins-Clark, philanthropist Deirdre Imus, and racecar driver Danica Patrick. Additionally, she is aiding the founding of a new charity, Supplies for Success, which aims to furnish underprivileged children with the tools they need, both tangible and intangible, to excel academically.

Stokes was just recognized in New York City by the Mayor's Office to Combat Domestic Violence for her body of work and her extensive community outreach. "It may be difficult today to remember just how far we have come in 30 short years," Stokes said of the cause, "There were no emergency shelters for battered women and their children; there was no law against spousal rape; and, yes, it was against the law for an abused woman fleeing her abuser to take her children with her. In these 30 years, much has


been accomplished and the Center Against Domestic Violence has led the way."

She is also now a proud member of Jack and Jill of America, an organization founded in 1938 under the leadership of Marion Stubbs Thomas with the idea of bringing together children in a social and cultural environment. The group primarily serves Black children from the ages of two to 19.

Stokes is one of the millions of people who live with potentially deadly food allergies and is passionately involved with the Food Allergy Initiative. She serves as a member of the board of trustees at Englewood Hospital and Medical Center Foundation, Bergen Performing Arts Center and St. Joseph's Regional Medical Center in Patterson, New Jersey.

Although born in Cleveland, Ohio, Stokes grew up Washington, D.C. She is daughter of former United States Congressman Louis Stokes and the niece of Carl Stokes, who made history as the first African American mayor of a major city, Cleveland. Stokes was crowned Miss Azalea in 1983, representing the NATO Alliance; she was the first African American to ever hold the title.

Stokes is an alumna of Howard University and Ohio State University. She resides in New Jersey with her children.





For her work on the New York stage, from Yentl to Sarav ! and from Lend Me A Tenor to Goldas Balcony, Tovah Feldshuh has earned four Tony nominations for Best Actress and won four Drama Desk Awards , four Outer Critics Circle Awards, the Obie, the Theatre World Award and the Lucille Lortel Award for Best Actress (Goldas Balcony). On October 3, 2004, Goldas Balcony became the longest-running one-woman show in Broadway history.

About Irena Gut Opdyke

Irena Gut Opdyke (May 15, 1918 - May 17, 2003) was born Irena Gut into a Catholic family in the town of Kozienice in Central Poland, and studied nursing. During the German occupation of western Poland and the Russian occupation in the east (both armies invaded in September 1939), Irena joined a Polish underground unit. She was spotted by Russian troops, beaten, raped, and forced to work in a Russian medical unit. She escaped, only to be captured later by the Germans and forced to work in a munitions plant. An elderly SS officer Eduard Rugemer arranged her transfer to lighter duties in an army mess hall, which happened to afford her both a direct view into a Jewish ghetto, and a chance to slip food under its fence. When Rugemer was re-assigned to Lvov and then Tarnopol (in what is now Ukraine), he requisitioned Irena as his housekeeper. There she supervised a laundry staffed by Jews, and when she heard that they were to be transported to a death camp, she undertook to hide 12 of them in Rugemer's own villa and provide them with food and clothing. Irenas Vow Educational Fund

Irena Gut Opdykes mission in the later years of her life was to communicate her experiences first-hand to the younger generation. The telling of her story to youngsters was of the utmost importance to Irena, as she knew they would be the last generation of children able to hear a first-person eyewitness account of the horrors of the Holocaust. Irena was named by the Israeli Holocaust Commission one of the Righteous Among the Nations and was presented with the Israel Medal of Honor.






<u>Plum Island: "Even More Dangerous" (Pt 1) VVH-TV News Special</u> Report

Plum Island: "Even More Dangerous" VVH-TV News Special Report (Pt. 1) Department of Homeland Security is seriously considering approving a National Bio and Agro-Defense Facility on Plum Island in Eastern Long Island, NY. The facility would operate at what the government defines as BioSafety Level-4, which is the highest level of danger for biological research. The government defines BioSafety Level-4 as research involving "pathogens that pose a high risk of lifethreatening disease in animals and humans through the aerosol route and for which there is no known vaccine or therapy." The Plum Island Animal Disease Center operates at BioSafety Level-3 -- only doing research on animal diseases. There are five other possible sites for the new facility. But the Department of Homeland Security, whose project this is -- and which also now manages Plum Island -- is bullish on Plum Island for it because the other locations on the U.S. mainland all have lots of livestock nearby and Plum Island doesn't. But, on the other hand, Plum Island is off the Boston-to-New York population center of the United States -- with lots of people. And BioSafety Level 4, importantly, involves life-threatening diseases for animals and people, and to top that off, for which there is no known vaccine or therapy. A public hearing was held in Greenport by the Department of Homeland Security on having the National Bio and Agro-Defense Facility sited on Plum Island. VVH-TV Chief Investigative Report Karl Grossman was on hand to give us an up close look at both sides of this very serious issue.

Helen Thomas: "The dean of the Washington, D.C. press corps"



Regarded as the dean of the Washington, D.C., press corps, reporter Helen Thomas (born 1920) served as White House bureau chief for United Press International (UPI) from 1974 to 2000.

To those who regularly watch presidential press conferences, Helen Thomas was a familiar figure. Usually dressed in red (a tradition dating back to the administration of Ronald Reagan) and always seated in the front row, she was invariably the first or second reporter the president calls upon. It is an honor she earned by virtue of her long and distinguished career in Washington, and it was one she relished. Besides, it afforded her the perfect opportunity to do what she does best--bluntly challenge the president (and other public officials) to tell the plain, unvarnished truth. "We (reporters) are not there to curry presidential favor, nor can we respond to efforts at presidential intimidation," she asserted in her memoir, Dateline: White House.

Les Payne's Special Tribute to Newsday Legend Bob Greene

Les Payne's Special Tribute to Newsday Legend Bob Greene

Journalist and author Les Payne was born on July 12, 1941 in Tuscaloosa, Alabama. As a child, Payne was always interested in writing. He graduated from the University of Connecticut in 1964 with B.A. degree in English. Serving six years in the United States Army, Payne worked as an Army journalist and wrote speeches for General William C. Westmoreland. While on assignment in Vietnam, he ran the Army's newspaper, and when he was discharged, he had attained the rank of captain.

Payne joined Newsday in the late 1960s, serving as the associate managing editor for the paper's national, science, and international news. In 1968, as an investigative reporter, Payne covered the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther, Jr., and in the 1970s, he covered the Black Panther Party. He won a Pulitzer Prize for The Heroin Trail in 1974, which was a Newsday series in 33 parts that traced the international flow of heroin from the poppy fields of Turkey to the veins of drug addicts in New York City. Later, it became a published book. He also covered the Symbionese Liberation Army and authored The Life and Death of the Symbionese Liberation Army. As a Newsday correspondent, Payne reported extensively from Africa, Europe, the Caribbean and the United Nations. During the 1976 Soweto uprising, he traveled throughout South Africa and wrote a series that was also nominated for a Pulitzer Prize in foreign reporting. Payne is also responsible for Newsday's Queens edition, whose news staffs have won every major award in journalism, including three Pulitzer Prizes. He is also a columnist for the Tribune Media Services.

As one of the founders and former presidents of the National Association of Black Journalists, Payne has worked to improve media fairness and employment practices. He is also the Inaugural Professor for the David Laventhol Chair at Columbia University's Graduate School of Journalism. Payne has received several awards including the United Nations' World Hunger Media Award, and three Unity Awards for investigative reporting. In 1990, he won cable television's highest honor, the Ace Award, for an interview with Mayor David Dinkins on Les Payne's New York Journal. In addition, he is a recipient of two honorary doctorate degrees from Medgar Evers College and Long Island University.

BOB GREENE

Bob Greene, the two-time Pulitzer Prize winner for public service and the founding father of investigative team journalism, died after a lengthy illness. He was 78.

From Newsday:

During a 37-year career at Newsday, first as a reporter and later as an editor, Greene pushed his reporters to dig out public corruption by aggressively covering their assigned beats, no matter how seemingly insignificant. In 1975, Greene helped form an organization for like-minded professionals, Investigative Reporters and Editors, and a year later, after the murder of Don Bolles, one of the group's founding reporters, in Phoenix, Ariz., he headed a team that wrote a series of stories about corruption in that state. The project brought Greene national attention and an enduring legacy.

Greene joined Newsday in 1955 as a reporter. Two years after his arrival, he took off a year at the request of Robert Kennedy to work as an investigator for the U.S. Senate Rackets Committee, Newsday wrote in its obituary.

He won his first Pulitzer Prize Gold Medal in 1970 for exposing land scandals In 1974, along with a team of reporters, he won a second Gold Medal for a series that tracked heroin from Turkish poppy fields to Long Island neighborhoods.


Greene is survived by his wife, Kathleen and his son, Robert Jr. Many of you remember back in 1989 that his daughter, Lea, was murdered during a home break in.

Greene worked closely with District Attorney James M. Catterson to prosecute and convict her two killers.

Long Island Business News extends its sympathies and warmest wishes to the Greene and Newsday families for their loss. Journalism has lost a giant.


The 106th Rescue Wing, New York Air National Guard.

Welcome to the 106th Rescue Wing of the New York Air National Guard, located at Francis S.Gabreski ANGB in Westhampton Beach, New York. The 106th RQW is one of only three rescue units in the Air National Guard and also the home of the ANG's oldest flying unit, the 102nd Rescue Squadron. Today, the mission of the 106th is to provide combat search and rescue (CSAR). In peacetime, the wing performs search and rescue on behalf of the State of New York and the Federal Government. The 106th RQW performs long range over-water missions using the aerial refueling capabilities of the HC-130s and the wing's newest helicopter, the Sikorsky HH-60G "Pave Hawk".

On June 14, 1975 the 106th was redesignated an Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Group and assigned to Military Airlift Command. Its primary mission became one of saving lives and the mission change

would have far reaching effects and a profound impact on the unit itself, Long island and the northeastern part of the United States. On October 1, 1989, the 106th was redesignated an Air Rescue Group. In the Fall of 1990, the 106th ARG turned in its well-worn HH-3s in exchange for brand new Sikorsky HH-60G "Pave Hawks". In 1993, the 106th Rescue Group was redesignated the 106th Rescue Wing, its current designation. In 2000, the 102nd Rescue Squadron, the wing's flying element, celebrated its 85th anniversary. The 102nd is the oldest flying unit in the Air National Guard and one of the oldest in the Air Force.

VVH-TV's Tribute to Nick Monte of Gurney's Inn

Nick Monte (Montemarano), the adored Innkeeper of Long Island's most famous, historic beach resort, Gurney's Inn and founder of the American seawater spa passed away Saturday October 13th in Nevada. He was just a over a month shy of his 91st birthday.

Nick was born on November 26, 1916, the fifth of seven boys, in the apartment over their parents restaurant, Monte's Venetian Room on Carol Street.. Neither depressions nor recessions, mayor wars nor minor wars, prohibition nor epidemics ever disrupted the continuity of this tiny Italian restaurant and the love Nick had for his family.

In 1932, Nick, only 16 years old, took over the business after his father had an accident, and he had to drop out of Brooklyn Tech. From that moment on Nick Monte become the forever gracious host of Monte's Venetian Room until he acquired Gurney's Inn in 1956 and moved to Montauk.

As the story goes, one afternoon in the summer of 1955, a friend in Brooklyn who had a house in Montauk invited Nick to lunch in Montauk with the promise of the best linguini and clam sauce he'd ever tasted. For a man who owned one of the most successful Italian restaurants in Brooklyn, Monte's Venetian Room on Carroll Street, he had to admit he was intrigued. Upon arriving at his friend's home he was offered a glass of wine on the deck overlooking the ocean. The two men sat and talked for some time. They talked and then they talked some more...there they were sitting on the deck sipping wine jovially and languorously, when low and behold, the bottle was gone and lunch was nowhere to be

found. So Nick thought it worth mentioning the promised lunch. Since neither of the men was in any condition to cook at that time, they decided to head over to Gurney's Inn for lunch.

At the time, Gurney's was owned by Mrs. Maude Gurney, who happened to be a Christian Scientist. Christian Scientists do not believe in the consumption of alcohol, therefore the restaurant carried no liquor whatsoever. Well, here he was in such a beautiful place, with good food and a divine view and the glass of wine Nick Monte would have loved to savor with his meal was nowhere to be found! It seemed he had no choice but to offer to buy the restaurant and hotel from Mrs. Gurney so that he could properly enjoy his meal. Initially, after accepting his card, she refused his offer. But several months later, after giving the offer careful consideration, she phoned Nick to say that she was interested. If you ask him today, he will tell you that he never expected to hear from her ever again. Well, in fairly short order, the deal was struck, and Gurney's Inn became the property of Nick Monte.


Always looking to preserve the best of what Montauk had to offer, Mr. Monte was very active and instrumental in having the Montauk Lighthouse designated as a National Historical Monument.

On April 17, 1979 when the International Health and Beauty Sea Water Spa was finished, it was officially opened by Mario Cuomo, then Lt. Governor of New York State. To this day it is still the only spa of its kind in the continental United States using healing Seawater in its Roman Baths, the heated indoor seawater pool, and the famous Thalasso-therapies.

Nick Monte's passion for Thalasso 'healing sea water' is passed on with the The Annual Nick Monte Lifetime Community Leadership Award which honors a person of the East End community. This individual demonstrates dedication, passion and creativity in preserving and supporting the Montauk community. Organic Farming: Can It Feed Us? Part 1

Karl Grossman Chief Investigative Reporter examines Organic Farming on Eastern Long Island.

What is organic farming?

Organic farming can be defined as an approach to agriculture where the aim is to create integrated, humane, environmentally and economically sustainable agricultural production systems. Maximum

reliance is placed on locally or farm-derived renewable resources and the management of self-regulating ecological and biological processes and interactions in order to provide acceptable levels of crop, livestock and human nutrition, protection from pests and diseases, and an appropriate return to the human and other resources employed. Reliance on external inputs, whether chemical or organic, is reduced as far as possible. In many European countries, organic agriculture is known as ecological agriculture, reflecting this reliance on ecosystem management rather than external inputs.

The objective of sustainability lies at the heart of organic farming and is one of the major factors determining the acceptability or otherwise of specific production practices. The term 'sustainable' is used in its widest sense, to encompass not just conservation of non-renewable resources (soil, energy, minerals) but also issues of environmental, economic and social sustainability. The term 'organic' is best thought of as referring to the concept of the farm as an organism, in which all the component parts - the soil minerals, organic matter, micro-organisms, insects, plants, animals and humans - interact to create a coherent and stable whole.

The key characteristics of organic farming include:

protecting the long term fertility of soils by maintaining organic matter levels, encouraging soil biological activity, and careful mechanical intervention;

providing crop nutrients indirectly using relatively insoluble nutrient sources which are made available to the plant by the action of soil micro-organisms;


nitrogen self-sufficiency through the use of legumes and biological nitrogen fixation, as well as effective recycling of organic materials including crop residues and livestock manures;

weed, disease and pest control relying primarily on crop rotations, natural predators, diversity, organic manuring, resistant varieties and limited (preferably minimal) thermal, biological and chemical intervention;

the extensive management of livestock, paying full regard to their evolutionary adaptations, behavioural needs and animal welfare issues with respect to nutrition, housing, health, breeding and rearing;

careful attention to the impact of the farming system on the wider environment and the conservation of wildlife and natural habitats.





Bridgehampton Road Rallye 2007

Racing History - Why We Rally in Bridgehampton.

As many autophyles know, the Bridgehampton area is steeped in racing history. Beginning in 1915, the Firemen sponsored street races as part of their summer carnival. Those races ran laps over a circular course that went east on Main Street, south on Halsey Lane, east on Paul's Lane, and back up Ocean Avenue to the monument. Homemade and modified cars piloted by local note-worthies like John Ambrose, Moosie Thompson, Court Rodgers and Norris Hopping put pressure on visiting racers as they reached speeds of up to 50mph. These early races continued through 1921. Racing revived in 1949 when Bruce Stevenson, inspired by the first Watkins Glen race in 1948, organized a similar event in Bridgehampton. Predominately European racing cars reached speeds in excess of 100mph on a 4.5 mile road course that ran clockwise up Ocean Avenue, across Sagaponac Road, down Sagg Main Street, and back along Bridge Lane. 1953 saw both the last Bridgehampton race and the end of open road racing in New York State. However, during those 5 years the likes of Briggs Cunningham, Tommy Cole, George Huntoon, Freddie Wacker, the Collier brothers, Bob Grossman, John Fitch, television personality Dave Garroway and many others raced at Bridgehampton in the

In 1957 the soon to be world famous Bridge Race Track opened on 500 acres of open land just north of the village. For over 35 years races of international importance took place on its winding course. Community pressure from new residents who objected to the noise of the races eventually led to the track closing. The land, atop an important aquifer, became the subject of considerable controversy, when purchasers of the old racetrack submitted plans for 'Golf at the Bridge'. 
has specialized with working with those with chronic Lyme disease. Her accounts were most poignant, and her explanation of why health

Thiele, Jr., Sag Harbor, New York who talks about the bill he has before the New York State Assembly requiring health insurers to provide compensation for long-term treatment of Lyme

diseases -- a measure that has been bottled up in Albany. Shelter Island Town Supervisor Alfred Kilb, Jr. Shelter Island has long

been a particular hotspot for Lyme disease and Kilb describes Shelter Islanders he knows with chronic cases of the disease.

Hampton Classic Horse Show 2007

The Hampton Classic Horse Show (generally referred to as the "Hampton Classic") is a Grand Prix show jumping horse show in Bridgehampton, New York that is one of the biggest show jumping contests in the United States.

Held over Labor Day in Southampton (town), New York, it is one of the biggest social bashes in the Hamptons scene and signals the grand finale of the summer season.

The roots of the show go to the early 1900s in Southampton to a show that was discontinued during World War I. It was revived in the 1920's and then discontinued again in World War II. It was revived a third time in 1959 as the Southampton Horse Show which was discontinued in the mid-1960s.

The current show started in 1971 by the Topping Riding Club in Sagaponack, New York as a one-day show. In 1976 it became a five-day rated show held initially at Dune Alpin Farm in East Hampton (town), New York. In 1978, its name was formally changed to the Hampton Classic and in 1982 it moved to its present location on Snake Hollow Road Bridgehampton.

In 2006 its web site indicates it has 1,300 horses exhibited and over \$500,000 in prize money.

Olympic Medalist Chris Kappler, aboard his mare, VDL Oranta, competing at the \$150,000 Prudential Grand Prix at the 2006 Hampton Classic. The social scene that accompanies the show has led to its heavy upscale sponsorships. In 2006 its VIP Tent could house 3,000 served by white-coated waiters. Visitors promenade the grounds often with dogs and showing off elaborate hats, which are commonly worn to the prestigious Grand Prix, held on the last Sunday of the show.


The show is held at the peak of Atlantic hurricane season and several shows have had to deal with hurricanes or the rains associated with them. In 1976 the tents were flattened in one storm just before the show. The jumping contests continue even in the rain and are discontinued only when real hazards are posed to horse and rider.

Profits from the show go to Southampton Hospital.

Shell and TransCanada Energy, two of North America's largest energy companies, have proposed building a 10-story-high, four-football-field-long (about the size of the Queen Mary cruise liner) liquid natural gas storage facility in the middle of LIS.


The proposed facility would be 75 to 100 feet tall. It would be four football fields long and larger than the QE2. It would be anchored 10.5 miles from Cosey Beach Park in East Haven, about 17 miles from the Long Island Sound Ferry, and 18 miles from Hammonasset Beach.

But, as most people know, the Sound is one of the most beautiful and significant bodies of water in the United States. In 1987, after Congress allocated funds for the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency to research, monitor, and assess the water quality of the Sound, it became an Estuary of National Significance. It contains thousands of species of wildlife, and is a vital part of our nation's environment. And, it provides employment and recreational opportunities for hundreds of thousands of people throughout our region.

Over the past ten years, the federal government, and the states of Connecticut and New York, have spent hundreds of millions of dollars to restore and protect the water quality of this national treasure.

TransCanada and Shell have also made it clear that the natural gas they would import to the factory-like facility they call "Broadwater" will be from sources outside of North America. The proposal for a natural gas storage facility in the middle of Long Island Sound is not environmentally sustainable. A sustainable project would have to incorporate both an aggressive energy efficiency and conservation effort.



research labs and accounting for the hundreds of vials of deadly viruses and microbes might be a better use of our time, our taxes and our energy. Plum Island, and its history of danger to millions of citizens, is proof of that indeed.




Baby Swans' First Swim in East Hampton (Town Pond)




The Issue of Undocumented Workers in the Hamptons

In the rich and powerful Hamptons there lies a growing problem of undocumented day laborers who "shape up" daily for jobs taking care of this community. 






















62nd Annual Artists and Writers Charity Softball Game 2010

Saving Nikola Tesla's Laboratory - Special Report VVH-TV News

Wardenclyffe: Tesla's Only Remaining Laboratory with Karl Grossman, Chief Investigative Reporter, WVVH-TV News

In 1901, Tesla purchased 200 acres on Long Island's north shore from James Warden. These 200 acres were part of an 1,800 acre potato farm along what is today Route 25A in Shoreham, NY. The site became known as Wardenclyffe, after the former owner. Here, Tesla established what would become his only remaining laboratory building. Here, in Shoreham on Long Island that at the turn into the last century, the great inventor Nikola Tesla built a tower with which he hoped to transmit electric power through the air to anywhere in the world.

The purpose of the Wardenclyffe laboratory was the establishment of a wireless telegraphy plant. The prestigious architectural firm of McKin, Mead, and White was contracted to design the laboratory and transmitter tower (187 feet high above ground and 120 feet deep below ground level). Stanford White became the architect for the building.

Tesla's plan had the initial backing of the financier J.P. Morgan. The red brick laboratory building can still be seen on the north side of Route 25A between the intersection of Randall Road and the Shoreham Fire Department. During the last week of July 1903, residents around the Shoreham site experienced what was to be the only testing of Tesla's equipment at this facility. Several days after these tests, his dream was destroyed when creditors from Westinghouse confiscated his heavier equipment for nonpayment for services rendered. In addition, James Warden sued Tesla for nonpayment of back taxes. In 1917, the 187-foot tower was destroyed by dynamite explosion as ordered by the U.S.

government. It was demolished the same year by the Smiley Steel Company.

Nikola Tesla was a giant -- the man behind the establishment of alternating current which is at the foundation of how the world became electrified, he invented much in the way of how radio signals are transmitted, and fluorescent lighting, and the bladeless turbine, and on and on.

The son of Serbian parents, he came to the United States in 1894 with four cents.

In 1939, the Peerless Photo Company purchased the property to manufacture emulsions for photographic film and paper. Additional buildings were constructed. In 1969, it became Agfa-Gevaert, Inc., at that time a division of the Bayer Corporation. In 1987, manufacturing ended, and the facility was closed down. Since then, the entire facility has remained dormant. It is noteworthy that, in 1967, the laboratory building was the first to be listed on the Town of Brookhaven registry of historic sites.

The Tesla Science Center has been established to preserve the land and laboratory, Nikola Tesla's last and only existing laboratory, in Shoreham, NY (USA) into a science and technology center and museum celebrating Tesla and his work.

Frazer Dougherty, a vigorous, fit-looking gentleman, has this thing about free speech and the First Amendment. What thrills him more than anything, he says, is witnessing democracy in action. Mr. Frazer Dougherty born in 1922 in Wyncote, PA, He served six years as a pilot flying B-25 planes in New Guinea during WWII. Founder of LTV, a public access station in East Hampton of which he hosted a daily talk show "Hello, Hello". Before then he was an industrial designer who in the 1940's helped design and build, with Robert Edison Fulton Jr., the Airphibian, a combination automobile and airplane that is now in the Smithsonian.

VVH-TV News - "The (Unusual) Jewish History of Sag Harbor"

Temple Adas Israel in Sag Harbor. The oldest synagogue on Long Island, it describes itself. Outside New York City that is. It began as Temple Mishican Israel, with its first services in 1898 for Rosh Hashonah, the Jewish new year. Legend has it that it received its first torah --the first five books of the Hebrew Bible -- from Teddy Roosevelt. The torah had been used when Roosevelt and his Rough Riders, after fighting in Cuba during the Spanish-American War, were quarantined for a time in Montauk.

Although Roosevelt was accepting, it was a time when Jews were not accepted on much of Long Island's South Fork. Sag Harbor's nearby villages of East Hampton and Southampton were basically off-limits to Jews. But Jews, unusually, were welcome here in Sag Harbor.. (I'm pretty sure I said this directly to the camera. Joseph Fahys built what became a watchcase factory in Sag Harbor. Fahys sought out Jewish engravers from Hungary, where engraving was a fine art among Jews. He or his representatives would meet them after they arrived on Ellis Island and bring them to Sag Harbor. This is why my grandfather and grandmother came to Sag Harbor.

Hungarian Jews -- like Hungarians in general -- have considered themselves special. Indeed, the language and food of Hungary are very unique. The Hungarian Jews who came to work at Fahys watchcase factory didn't get along with Jews already here, shopkeepers in the main, from Russia and Poland and other places where Jews had been dispersed. The Hungarian Jews prayed above the Engraver's Hall along Main Street.

In the 1920s there was a major fire in Sag Harbor and then and, of course, during the Depression, Sag Harbor was suffering with the rest of the nation economically. In the early 1940s, the temple was only open on High Holy days. Change occurred in 1948 as Sag Harbor was discovered by artists and writers and young professionals -- and the temple became Conservative, the middle branch between Orthodox and the most liberal Jewish branch, Reform. In 1938 its name was changed to Temple Adas Israel.

The congregation only met from the spring festival of Shavouth, commemorating Moses receiving the torah and also the festival of the harvest of the first fruits, to the high holy days, Rosha Hashonah and Yom Kippur, in the fall. Then, in 2010, Rabbi Morris, after 10 years at Adas Israel part-time, became full-time. He moved to Sag Harbor with his wife, Dasee Berkowitz, who became the temple's educational consultant. And the temple, as it says on its website, became "renewed and reinvigorated. There is now a thriving Hebrew School, all sorts of cultural activities and events -- many directed at young people.

Meanwhile, Sag Harbor itself is being renewed and reinvigorated, with that watchcase factory the centerpiece. After sitting, a big derelict building, for decades, it is being renovated as a apartment complex called The Watchcase.

What would my grandfather and grandmother say now? All their families who didn't leave Europe -- my family -- were murdered in the Holocaust. They would smile at Jews being accepted in this golden land-especially in Sag Harbor.
