The investigation into the Petraeus – Broadwell scandal reveals that the affair began 6 months ago, and that leaves many lawmakers furious that they weren't informed immediately. Meanwhile, the White House stands behind General Allen who was caught up in the scandal. Allen's appointment to NATO Supreme Commander has been put on hold.

CBN News' Jennifer Wishon was at the White House press conference as the President weighed in on the scandal and investigation. She says Obama said that he doesn't think that our national security was ever compromised. Many people are wondering why the President didn't know about the scandal or if indeed there was a cover up. Obama also weighed in on the Bengahzi attacks saying that he informed his staff to "do whatever it takes to keep them safe."

U.S. Army Retired Lt. General Jerry Boykin when asked if the scandal was actually being blackmailed, Boykin said that he believes Petraeus was being held hostage to the investigation of his infidelity. He also states that there is a lot of evidence that there was a covert action program being run out of Bengahzi to funnel weapons and missiles to the Syrian rebels and that may have been an effort to cover that up, especially if it wasn't properly briefed to Congress. Another question that should be asked is why weren't there troops on the ground there? Petraeus would have put them there, but Boykin thinks the scandal broke so that Petraeus couldn't testify as to why. Boykin says he believes that it is more than likely a cover-up.

Hearings about the Benghazi attacks were heard today on Capitol Hill. Lawmakers are furious over the lack of information from the White House. Little information was learned from these first open hearings though. Instead it was more of an opportunity for lawmakers to re-hash their concerns over the lack of security in American outposts and the miscommunication of the initial days after the attack. Republicans wasted no time in focusing their fury on UN Ambassador Susan Rice for blaming the attacks on a controversial anti-Islamic film. Obama and his party defended her. Lawmakers are seeking a special committee to investigate, and 150-thousand people have signed a petition to appoint a special prosecutor in the case.

Shari'a courts operate outside of British common law, and defenders say the courts are legal under the 1996 Arbitration Act. But Shari'a law could be rising in the U.S. So far, 50 court cases in 23 states have seen conflicts between Shari'a and American law; 4 states have adopted legislation protecting U.S. citizens from Shari'a.

Lanza turned to the gun on himself when he heard police coming.

The first funeral was held today in Newtown. The morning after the shootings, the President met with families and spoke at a prayer vigil. Pastors there hope to turn people's eyes towards Jesus. Memorials of candles, cards, and teddy bears line the road there to remember the children and brave teachers. Some parents were sad, but where thankful there kids weren't killed. Some churches are keeping their doors open for prayer.

The massacre at Sandy Hook Elementary is just the latest in a string of violence with violent video games, TV, and our violent culture being blamed. Some are pointing to the need for more gun control. Most gun owners are law-abiding citizens, but there are those that have mental instability that can get their hands on guns. Lawmakers are shuffling to get new measures in place that will, they say, safe guard the public.

Psychologist Dr. Carl Benzio founder of Lighthouse Network, says there will more people who need help for mental instability than there are services to provide. There is also an increase in violence in the last few decades. They say Aldawsari researched possible targets such as power plants and the home of former President George W Bush.
