Watching violence translates into more aggression when they are in conflict or need to problem solve because they have only seen these aggressive models. Being exposed to sexual content earlier, way before they can handle it, they tend to engage in sexual activity at an early age. Parents need to monitor what they are watching and be responsible with their children.
