# Issue: Gun Control

## Program: CBN Newswatch

**Air Date and Time: 1-8-13 @ 6:30pm**

2:30

The President has made it clear that will take action against guns. That has nervous Americans flocking to gun shows to stock up before its too late. Vice-President Biden is leading the charge as Obama has put him in charge of the special gun-control task force. Some lawmakers are calling for tougher gun laws. So far, Obama is calling for universal background checks and tracking movement and sale of weapons thru a national database. Americans are fearing their 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment rights will be taken away. The FBI last year conducted 2.8-million background checks.

The NRA and the White House will square off tomorrow on the issue of gun control. Vice-President Joe Biden met with survivors and relatives of those caught in mass shootings and massacres. Obama has tasked Biden and Congress for coming up with new rules regarding gun control by the end of this year. But opponents of Obama and his administration say there is already enough gun control laws on the books.

The Vice-President will hand the President a number of suggestions on curbing gun violence. The Vice-President met with video gaming companies to talking about video game violence. This comes after Joe Biden met with the NRA to discuss the gun control issue. The proposal will also include mental health and violence on TV. Mark Walters, host of Armed American Radio, says there were more deaths by bludgeoning with a hammer than shooting deaths last year.

Vice-President Joe Biden is about to present his findings and recommendations about gun violence to the President. But as he does, Americans are stocking up on guns. The National Rifle Association and key lawmakers in Congress are prepared to fight any threats against the 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment. Congress said that it will not pass the gun control laws the President is seeking to enact. The president of the NRA, David Keene says the people who are mental unfit to own firearms be put on the list to prevent them from obtaining assault rifles. Keene says they aren't currently doing that. Senator Rand Paul says Obama is trying to bypass the constitution and Congress, essentially acting like a king.

The President is reviewing the Vice-President's report and recommendations on gun control. Gun sales have been up across the U.S. Obama says responsible gun owners need not fear, and says if necessary, he will use his executive powers to enable the bill/bills.

True to his word, the President signs 23 executive orders on gun control. He says that 900 people have been killed in the month past following the Sandy Hook School shooting. Obama bypassed Congress and signed the proposals into law. He says the orders will strengthen background check requirements and help schools hire more resource officers. He's also enlisting the CDC and other health organizations to research what causes gun violence, including possible links to video game violence. The bill proposes banning sales of assault rifles, limit ammunition magazines to 10 rounds, and close the "gun show loophole."

Family Research Council member and author, Ken Klukowski says the President spun the unspoken idea that if we the people or legislators don't agree with him, that we have selfish motives and self-serving gains. Klukowski says Obama's executive orders do not affect the general public, only his immediate staff. The federal government cannot have a national gun registry of gun owners because it is unconstitutional.

The President proposed sweeping changes to America's gun laws and policies on Wednesday, which could turn out to be the biggest debate over gun control in decades. Gun advocates vow to fight on every level. Obama signed 23 executive orders that he says will protect our children. Critics say it is an assault on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment and an executive over reach. The Republican National Committee Chair, Reince Priebus said in a statement "the President's series of gun control measures amount to an executive power grab that may please his political base, but will not solve the problem at hand." Some States are already pushing back against the President's orders.

Assault weapons have been the focus of debate on gun control. But what exactly is an assault weapon? Most think it's a machine gun or a tommy gun. Both sides of the gun debate law were on Capital Hill today. The Senate Judiciary Committee held hearings on what the nation should do to end gun violence. Unscheduled visitor to the hearings, former Congresswoman, Gabrielle Gifford gave a short testimony, but had the biggest impact, calling for tighter gun control. Gifford was seriously injured in a mass shoot at and Arizona mall in January 2011. NRA President, Wayne LaPierre led a contingents of gun control opponents who say the proposed laws violate our 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment Rights. The gun control laws could put women at a disadvantage when faced with gun-toting men say the women's advocate groups. Others say the real issue is not more gun control, but getting people off the street who are prone to violent mental instability.

A number of Americans polled say politicians are exploiting the Sandy Hook massacre for political gain. More than half surveyed say assault weapons should be legal; 44-percent say they should be banned.

The President is continuing his campaign to ban the use of high-powered firearms. Obama took his gun control campaign to Minneapolis today, the city that has had success curbing gun violence. Obama is proposing banning the buying and selling of assault rifles and high capacity ammunition magazines. He is also pushing for tougher background checks. He's asking Americans to put pressure on lawmakers to get these new laws passed.

The Newtown shooting has been the rallying cry for new gun control laws. Colorado Senate narrowly passed 4 bills. One bill limits the amount of rounds in a magazine that one can purchase and another measure requires stricter background checks. Adam Lanza killed 20 children and 6 adults at Sandy Hook Elementary School in December. Investigators say that Lanza had an obsession with violent video games and that he also wanted to surpass the body count that Norwegian Anders Breivik who murdered 77 people in 2001. Lanza chose Sandy Hook because of its location and the number of people that was in close proximity to one another. Officials say he probably lived out fantasies thru violent video games.

With the focus turned toward more gun control, there is now a shortage on ammunition, which makes it harder for law enforcement to do their job. They are having a difficult time locating the ammunition for their weapons. Forty caliber bullets are the kind most often utilized by law enforcement for training, costing about 30-dollars for 50 rounds in a box. But in the wake of the Newtown shooting, the demand went up and so did the price due to low supply.

The Chinese government has a building on the outskirts of Shanghai, labeled Unit 6139, where English speaking/writing Chinese are stealing America's corporate information and breaking into military sites. They are targeting water treatment plants, transportation, and our food supply. But the main concern is over the country's power supply grid. Other targets include Lockheed Martin, makers of jet fighter airplanes, and numerous corporate giants such as Coca Cola. The Senate finally reached a deal to prevent the U.S. from falling over the fiscal cliff. The deal allows taxes to increase on those earning 450-thousaand a year. Now the House has to approve the deal. It would also extend unemployment insurance for another year, while patching up a host of other expiring provisions and delaying automatic spending cuts for two months. Those cuts, which would hit defense heavily, will instead be offset with a blend of tax increases and other spending cuts. Americans will still see a 2-point increase this month in their Social Security tax, as Congress did not opt to extend that payroll tax holiday. Both sides of the aisle ultimately don't like the deal struck.

Lawmakers struck a last minute deal last night to keep Americans from tumbling off the fiscal cliff. House GOP members reluctantly passed the Senate approved bill. Battles over spending and debt are expect in just a few months. Taxes will go up 2-percent for a majority of Americans due to an expiration of the social security tax reduction. 77-percent of Americans will still pay higher federal taxes in 2013.

The economy is slowly running down with predictions of increased inflation and loss of economic growth at the end of this year.

If the Treasury runs out of options to cover the nation's debt, it could default on government loans unless Congress raises the debt ceiling, which could trigger a global recession.

House Republicans passed a plan to prevent a potential debt crisis. Republicans are giving up spending cuts in exchange for an increase in the government's borrowing cap. The National Debt is reaching dangerously high levels that could threaten America's economy in the future. The Peter G. Federal Reserve Chairman, Ben Bernaki tells Congress that the low-interest rate policies are providing necessary support to an economy that is suffering from high unemployment. Bernaki said today that they will continue to keep borrowing costs low. He says he does acknowledge the aggressive plan the Feds have to buy 85-billion-dollars a month in treasury and mortgage bonds could spark inflation can make investors uneasy. Those risks are contained for now, and urges Congress to replace the automatic spending cuts set to kick in Friday with more gradual spending cuts.

A history making high on Wall Street saw the Dow Jones rise 126 points to close up Tuesday at 14,254, which tops the previous high by 89 points in October of 2007. The surge was brought on by a number of factors including a recovery in the housing market, an increase in China's strong economic growth funds and a jump in European retail sales. It was pushed up even more when it was reported that the service sector was strong and making gains. It also doubled its record low almost 4-years ago, gaining 118-percent since then. But some analysts ask if we can trust this market surge. The Economy is slowly growing, businesses are making money, interest rates and inflation are still very low, and a great deal of money that has not gone back into stocks yet could be the key factors that see the market flourish.

Bill Frezza with the Competitive Enterprise Institute in Boston says that the market surge is more like a monetary illusion if you take a look at the Dow price in gold for example, you would see that we are back to the 1980's gains. People need to be cautious on how they interpret this stuff. The market has completely discounted any talk about the sequester cuts and has had no impact on people's expectations. Frezza says that the President cannot afford to let the American people believe that the government can't stop growing. Frezza gives example of places where the government should be cutting and says that the Obama Administration wants to keep the American people from knowing what the other hand is doing. The stock market on the other hand will only go up until it.

The price of gasoline is up 18 cents to \$3.54 per gallon in just this last week; it's the biggest weekly increase in 2 years. Analysts say the economy is strong again and that is the reason for the climb. The barrel price for oil is up again to almost a hundred dollars.

Gas prices went up 12-cents last week, making it a 42-cent increase in the last month. Economist say the price for crude oil has gone up, with predictions of high prices for spring. That means that we could see \$4 a gallon by May.

Gas prices are at a 4<sup>th</sup> month rise to an average nationwide of \$3.79 per gallon. Experts are saying that the prices will continue for the next few months, up to possibly \$4 per gallon and then round off. Crude oil prices are also up. Canada has a surplus of crude, and if the pipeline is approved, then we will see lower prices at the pumps.

Those in support of traditional marriage held prayer vigils, while those in support of gay marriage just showed up in support.

The 1996 law determines that the definition of marriage according to the federal government is a union between a man and a woman as husband and wife. But 83-year old Edith Windsor wants the high court to strike that down. Windsor was angry with the government when she had to pay estate taxes after her partner of 44-years died; something that a heterosexual couple would not have to pay. Windsor calls the word marriage, a “magic” word. While some states recognize gay marriage, the federal government and DOMA does not and that can be important because it is responsible for 11-hundred federal laws, taxes, and health benefits. If the high court strikes down Prop-8, it will have a deep impact on the state of traditional marriage and family in this country. Some say it’s important to bridge the gap despite the divide. The court may even sidestep a ruling based on standing – a legal technicality.

Melissa Henson is the Director of Communication and Public Education for the Parents Television Council. She says that there is substantial evidence that violence in video games and on TV has a deep impact on young children in their brains. Seeing violence shuts down the part of their brain that controls self-control and responsibility, and excites the area in the brain involved in the fight or flight impulse. Parents need to have more involvement in what their kids do, see, and experience.
