Allergy season is upon us. Most look to allergy medications for relief, but they can cause other problems. Some issues are that adults get sleepy, children become hyper, and some medications raise your blood pressure and may cause urinary problems. There are natural antihistamines available that Dr. Sue Bennett recommends; vitamin C, pine bark (Pycnogenol), and Quercetin. These have no side effects. She also recommends keeping allergens out of your body. In her new book "The 7-Day Allergy Makeover" Dr. Bennett explains how to figure out your allergies and reduce your overall toxic load. She also looks at nutrition as the number one way to get rid of allergies. There are six main food allergies. Dr. Bennett instructs patients to give them up one at a time for two weeks and see they feel better. They start with dairy, then gluten, sugar, peanuts, eggs and food mold (blue cheese, mushrooms and yeast). After you focus on the possible allergies in your food concentrate on the allergens in your home. Use a hepa and carbon filter and vacuum frequently.

Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) was virtually unheard of a generation ago. Now the number of children diagnosed with it is skyrocketing. ASD went from 1 in every 150 in 2007 to 1 in every 68 children in 2014 this is according to the CDC (Center for Disease Control). The CDC says the reason it has gone up is that doctors are getting better at identifying ASD in children. Boys are five times more likely to have Autism than girls. The average age to diagnose is four years old. The CDC has put a complete list together on their website to help parents know what their children should be doing from infancy to five years old. They recommend taking your child to a pediatric neurologist to be diagnosed if your child is not meeting the developmental milestones at each age level they have listed. Researchers still do not know what causes Autism, but they feel it starts during pregnancy. According to research done at UC San Diego the brain starts developing abnormally during the second or third trimester. It is unclear whether it is genetics, external - like illness during pregnancy, an older father, transfats, or environment toxins or both. Scientists are careful not to theorize because for years some theorized it was from childhood vaccines. Most scientists now say that theory was false.

Drug resistant diseases are now a major threat to global health. A combination of antibiotic misuse and poor hospital hygiene is causing once treatable diseases to progress. According to a report from the World Health Organization antibiotic misuse allows bacterial infections to evolve into "incurable superbugs." This report is the first of its kind, studying over 114 countries. The report says if the world does not respond it could be devastating. The report says around 2million people are infected with these drug-resistant diseases and they kill about 23,000 annually. The antibiotic is not only over used in humans, but in animals also. Animals receive 80% of the antibiotics given and much of that goes into their food. The antibiotic in their food makes them bigger, so the company makes more money. The problem is the antibiotic is passed to humans through the meat. A report from the CDC (Center for Disease Control and Prevention) was released a few months ago with similar results. The CDC said to reverse the trend we must; 1) prevent infections, 2) use antibiotics much more responsibly, 3) track resistance patterns, and 4) develop new drugs.

The EPA (Environmental Protection Agency) currently has government controls in place over rivers and streams, but not drainage ditches and farm ponds. A recent proposal to expand government authority over bodies of water has the agriculture community concerned. The phrase "Navigable waters" has been used to dictate where the government agencies might extend their authority, but modifications to that definition could have a major impact on the farm sector. Kevin Kester the Vice-chair of NCBA policy division (National Cattlemen's Beef Association) said with the new definitions farms and ranches would come under the control of EPA as it relates to water and permitting and that could devastate lots of family farms and ranches across the country. The purposed rule has been published in the Federal register and the public comment period will remain open through July 21st. NCBA is asking all ranchers and farmers to stay involved in this conversation by submitting your comments online.

There are 80million people in the United States with some form of heart disease. The Mayo Clinic is using a simple plan to try to reduce that number. Heart disease is the number one killer of men and women, but 80% is preventable. Martha Grogan, M.D., Mayo Clinic, says do not focus on the things you cannot eat, but focus on the things you can eat. She also said sitting or a sedentary lifestyle doubles your chance for a heart attack, but the good news is even 10 minutes a day can cut your chance for a heart attack in half. If you do more activity you will benefit more. She also said if you smoke stopping it would help. Martha said getting 8 hours of sleep should be considered a necessity not a luxury. Getting lots of good sleep not only helps protect you from heart attacks, but also helps you maintain a healthy weight. Negative emotions can damage your heart, so be happy.
