WMXC provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar guarter were:

HEALTH & SAFETY: By far the biggest issue affecting our listeners during the 2nd Quarter of 2020 was the COVID-19 pandemic. The pandemic encompassed health issues, mental health issues, safety issues, economic/workplace issues, hunger issues and more. iHeart Media responded with public affairs programming touching all of these factors amid the Coronavirus crisis. In addition, talent shared local information with listeners on air, on social media, and on the station's website, including plans for reopening after quarantine.

Severe Weather Preparedness: With 2 named storms prior to the June 1st start of the Atlantic hurricane season and a 3rd during the first week, meteorologist Alan Sealls talks about what to expect from a season that's predicted to be above average. He explains the terms used during hurricane season, including the Saffir-Simpson scale for storm categories, and explains the different storm hazards (wind, surge, flooding, tornados) that come with a tropical cyclone.
