WMXC Quarterly Issues/Programs List

WMXC provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- Drug Abuse Rehabilitation: The Pasco Home provides a safe and faith based transition for those who have struggled through addiction. The program has expanded to include a facility for women. Talked about services offered and how the community can help.
- Economic Development: Carol Hunter and Fred Rendfrey from Downtown Mobile Alliance talk about economic growth in downtown, especially along the St Louis St corridor. Also talked about a shift in attitudes, with more people coming downtown to live, not just to work or for entertainment. New apartments are being built, a new grocery store, and other changes are making the downtown lifestyle more attractive.
- Education: Baldwin County Virtual School is the FIRST public virtual high school in the State of Alabama. It provides motivated, independent learners the opportunity to earn their Alabama High School Diploma through flexible, personalized learning experiences available online anytime, anywhere. The principals shared information on how the school operates, how to enroll and what to expect, and graduate Hannah James talked about why virtual school was a better choice for her than the traditional classroom.
- Government: Alabama Congressman Rep. Bradley Byrne talked about several local issues, including the failed Mobile River Bridge project and whether there is any hope to revive it without the tolls that angered residents. Bryne also talked about political discord in Washington and how that is keeping issues, such as immigration, from being resolved.
- Infrastructure: Wiley Blankenship, CEO of the Coastal Alabama Partnership, talks about the Coastal Alabama Partnership, the goal of which is to get government and other agencies in Mobile and Baldwin Counties to work together on projects that would benefit the entire area, such as Amtrak train service from New Orleans to Mobile, and the Mobile River Bridge.

- MENTAL HEALTH: Mobile Fire-Rescue Chief Mark Sealy and John Kilpatrictk with Veterans Recovery Resources talk about a new program to help firefighters deal with trauma and other issues that come with the stresses of their job. The peer program developed for the Fire Department was modeled along the same lines as programs used with Veterans Recovery Resources to help veterans and their families with PTSD.
- MENTAL HEALTH: Lydia Barber with the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention and therapist John Conrad of Bayview Professional Associates talk about the Out of the Darkness Walk for Suicide Prevention. They discuss the signs that someone is struggling, where to find help, resources for families, and the need to bring the topic of suicide "out of the darkness" and talk about mental health issues.
- Public Safety: Mobile Public Safety Director James Barber talks about gun crime in Mobile and measures homeowners can take to protect themselves, including locking their cars. Barber says organized rings of gun traffickers are going through neighborhoods looking for guns in unlocked cars, but a PSA effort to get owners to lock vehicles has reduced gun thefts 40%. Barber talked about how police are working in problem areas of the city, with 2 local programs that have gone national... one focusing on 9th grade youth to keep them in school and out of trouble; the other focusing on nonviolent criminals, giving them a Second Chance to avoid jail and work in the community.
- Public Safety: State Trooper Lt. Joe Piggot explains new Alabama laws- One requires all passengers to be buckled up. The other, dubbed the "anti road rage law" requires drivers to keep right, except to pass. Piggot talked about road safety and the job of state troopers.
- Tourism: Visit Mobile is projecting a record summer for convention tourism in Mobile. Tara Zieman talks about recruitment of conventions and sporting events, promoting Mobile as a tourist destination, coordinating efforts with Carnival Cruise line, and enlisting the support of citizens and local tourism businesses (hotels, restaurants, attractions) to promote Mobile.
