The eyes of Texas are on Austin this month, as the Texas State Legislature reconvened for a special session. Texas Governor Greg Abbott called for the session to resolve several key issues. The first issue, known as Sunset Legislation, involves the funding of key medical agencies in the state. The special session kicked off during the final two weeks of the month. Channel 2 Reporters Ryan Korsgard and Phil Archer split up the coverage during this time. Ryan was the only local reporter at the state Senate, when the bill was passed, shortly after midnight on July 20. Ryan also provided updates on social media overnight. In addition to the Sunset Legislation, lawmakers were also tasked to handle 19 other bills, including one involving citizens using bathrooms tied to the gender of their birth/legal status vs. their gender identity.

The mayor will allow the final four bidders who made it to the interview process to submit a new offer. Those companies are: FCC, Republic Services, Waste Management Incorporated and Independent Texas Recyclers. This move comes after the city council raised questions about the prior recycling deal, which included building a new processing facility in northeast Houston.

The major story that far and away dominated our news coverage in August, was Hurricane Harvey and the impact it caused in southeast Texas. The entire Channel 2 news team came together to provide our viewers instant information about their public safety before the storm hit. We used every resource on every platform to alert the public of the severity of Hurricane Harvey. We sent three field crews, two working for evening newscasts, one for morning newscasts, to the Corpus Christi metro area, which is where Harvey made landfall. However, once we knew Harvey was going to make its greatest impact on Houston, we moved those new crews back to our city. Channel 2 news daily and continue with wall-to-wall coverage on TV and online from Saturday, August 26 until the overnight hours of Thursday, August 31. In addition to covering the storm itself, we shared with viewers multiple rescues of people who needed saved from their homes. We also showed how Houstonians trying to help their fellow neighbor during the beginning of the cleanup. Our station also held a phone bank with the Red Cross, which raise more than \$4 million in relief funds. Houstonians also responded to our coverage by making Channel 2 news Houstonians most watched station during the height of the storm, during several key time periods, including primetime. Coverage of the storm was an "all hands on deck" situation and our news team rose to the occasion.

Houston Mayor Sylvester Turner has a plan to help the city recover from Hurricane Harvey's floodwaters. It's a proposed emergency property tax increase but that's not sitting well with taxpayers. The plan calls for a nine-percent property tax hike for twelve months. After a few weeks since Mayor Sylvester Turner announced the property tax hike he is withdrawing his proposed property tax increase because Governor Greg Abbott presented the city with a check for 50 million dollars. The mayor and the governor had sparred over using money from the state's rainy day fund to pay for recovery efforts in Houston. The mayor says the emergency provision he considered activating would have raised about the same amount funds as the state's check, meaning his proposed tax increase is no longer needed.

Shannon Miles pled guilty to the charge of capital murder in exchange for a life sentence with no chance for parole. It was a plea bargain worked out over the last few days with the approval of Deputy Darren Goforth's family. We asked defense attorney Anthony Osso if Miles ever expressed any motive for the killing. Osso said because of Miles' mental state he cannot remember anything that happened that night. This was a controversial case that seemed to be heading for trial, but over the last couple of days the attorneys worked a plea deal that puts Shannon Miles away for life, but spares him from the death penalty. It also leaves a big question in the case unanswered.
