### **A. Drug Issues**

We talked about an upcoming public meeting out together by The League of Women Voters of Atlantic County, who are looking to put an end to the opioid crisis in our area. ### **B. Autism Awareness.**

WPUR talked about the need for awareness and acceptance of those with autism, and their families. We featured a father and daughter from Cumberland County, who have made a series of highly-acclaimed YouTube

videos focusing on children with autism. February 16. Daily Dose of Good. 9:15am. 3 minutes.

### **C. Women's Issues**

Cat Country aired information about an upcoming fundraiser for Adelaide's Place, a safe house for women and children at risk and at in need. March 12. Daily Dose of Good. 4 minutes.

### **D. Health.**

Cat Country airs a daily one minute "Health Update" with Robin Stoloff. The show focuses on all aspects of staying healthy. Airs 5 times per day, every day between 7am and 6pm.

### **E. Children.**

Cat Country is a sponsor, along with Big Brothers and Sisters, of an area wide clothing drive, "Coats for Kids." Listeners were asked to donate coats, hats, and mittens for local kids in the area. January 29 – February 23. One minute messages aired at least 5 times per day.

### **F. Childhood Cancer.**

Cat Country, once again, held our fundraiser, "The Cat Country Cares for St. Jude Kids Radiothon." Over \$135,000 was raised for treatment and research of childhood cancer. February 2 & 3. Live broadcast each day, 6am – 7pm.
