He filed a complaint with the US Supreme Courts concerning the Gudden of the voters right acts of 1965 That included section 5 which states that any legislation passed by states that had a history of discriminatory practice would have to file with the United States Justice Department for pre clearance to make sure they met the Statue of the Law
