"FORUM" is produced in-studio by Public Affairs Director Jon Michaels for thirty minutes and airs every Sunday morning. Jon Michaels has been doing this program since the FCC first required it in 1977. Jon has received the "GOLDEN APPLE" award from the South Dakota Education Association, the "BRIGHT IDEA" award from the Sioux Falls Public Relations Network for "lifetime achievement", the "GOLDEN WINGS MEDAL" from the Children's Care Hospital and "VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR" from Downtown Sioux Falls (formerly Main Street). Jon has also received awards from the Associated Press over the years of what is still the longest running public affairs show host in Sioux Falls radio History.

ISSUES AND ANSWERS ASSERTAINMENT-2ND QUARTER, 2014
