The National Weather Service of Northern Indiana says wind gusts this afternoon increase the risk for spreading fires, and minimum relative humidity levels have dropped to between 30 and 40 percent. Residents should avoid outdoor burning today, as any fires that are started have a likelihood to spread rapidly and quickly become uncontrollable.

Summary: In an effort to keep the public informed about criminal suspects, the Angola Police Department say that former biology professor, Steven Messer, was arrested Tuesday on 15 counts of child exploitation.

The investigation started after Angola police say they received a tip from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children. That investigation found that no local children were involved.

Court documents say that Messer uploaded over 20 child pornography onto a Google Drive account from his computer at Trine University on July 21st, 2022. While being interviewed, Messer acknowledged that the photos were pornographic.

Because of the investigation and arrest, Trine University has terminated Messer. Angola Police, Indiana State Police Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force, and Homeland Security Investigations arrested Messer without incident and took him to Steuben County jail.

If you have the dough in question, bring it back to the store for a refund or exchange.

McLeland said the probable cause and charging documents are sealed for now to protect the integrity of the case.

He said a public hearing would be held to determine if they remain sealed.

Yakym was once Walorski's campaign director and is endorsed by Walorski's mother Maratha and husband Dean Swihart, shortly after hear death.

This time of year is also associated with higher drinking rates, which combined with the sheer number of drivers on the road, makes it an especially dangerous time for motorists.

To prevent crashes, the Indiana State Police Bremen Post will be ramping up enforcement as part of the Safe Family Travel campaign. Starting this week, officers will be out in greater numbers conducting saturation patrols designed to discourage impaired driving and promote seat belt use.

In Michigan, AAA says the statewide average price dropped 23 cents on Monday. That's attributed to lower crude oil prices. Michigan's previous Thanksgiving record was \$3.61 a gallon, set ten years ago. The state average this week is \$3.79.

Monday's average price in Indiana was even higher, at \$3.85 per gallon according to GasBuddy dot com. That price, however, is down nearly 20 cents compared to a week ago. In Northwest Indiana last week, the price nose-dived as much as 40 cents per gallon

At least two candidates, Republican Erik Benson and Progressive Party candidate Marshall Travis, have declared plans to run for the Senate seat being vacated by Republican Sen. Mike Braun, who filed paperwork last week to run for governor of Indiana in 2024.

Due to term restrictions, Holcomb, who is currently in his second term as governor, is ineligible to compete for reelection.

On Tuesday, Holcomb answered questions about a prospective candidacy for Congress, his first public appearance since being hospitalized with pneumonia and norovirus.

Holcomb made his first public appearance since being hospitalized with pneumonia on Tuesday. When questioned about a prospective run for Congress, the governor indicated he is focused on the upcoming statehouse session.

Holcomb's tenure as governor will expire in January 2025.

The Indiana General Assembly's next session is scheduled to begin on January 9, 2023, at 1:30 p.m.

Summary: To keep the public informed about an approaching blizzard, this station aired a news story about how the holiday winter storm arrives on Michiana's doorstep on Thursday. We'll start out Thursday with a mixture of rain and snow. Some freezing rain is possible ,at times. Travel should be possible before 6 p.m. on Thursday. After that, a flash freeze is possible, which could make roads icy and dangerous. Precipitation will change over to all snow on Thursday night. Most of the area will experience near-blizzard conditions on Friday, with heavy snow and winds gusting over 40 m.p.h., making travel dangerous, if not impossible at points.

Most of the area should expect around 8 inches of snow by Friday night, with higher amounts expected closer to Lake Michigan. Along with all of this, feels-like temperatures could dip below -25 on Friday night. Lake effect snow will tack on several more inches of accumulation in the snow belts on Saturday. Even away from Lake Michigan, blowing and drifting snow could still be a concern, especially for the first part of Saturday. Snow should wrap up on Christmas morning. Highs on Christmas might not make it into the double digits.

The ban is due to the holiday winter storm that is hitting the Hoosier state. The ban begins at 5 p.m. on Thursday, Dec. 22 and lasts through 11 o'clock on Saturday, Dec. 24.
