The drive-thru testing clinic at the Silverwood Mennonite Church in Goshen is moving to the Beacon Aquatics Center parking lot in Elkhart. Testing days are changing as well, and will now be Mondays and Wednesday from noon to 6 pm. The drive-thru will be closed this coming Monday for the holiday.

Summary: To keep the public informed about the ongoing scourge of drug abuse, this station aired a news story about how police and federal law enforcement are busting crooks trying to deal fentanyl-laced drugs in Indiana.

Indiana Congresswoman Jackie Walorski, who represents portions of northern Indiana in Congress, is hoping her bill will help cut off the trafficking of fentanyl at its source using the court system. "It's very interesting that this bill is a way to bring justice to families and victims since Joe Biden is doing nothing about the border," Walorski told Newsmax. "My bill basically says that if you are the family of a victim, you can file a lawsuit in federal court and go after these countries are this poisonous fentanyl is coming from."

In this case, according to Walorski, it's China and Mexico in particular. Both of these countries have said that they can't be held liable for drug cartels operating there and trafficking fentanyl into the United States. Walorski's bill would say otherwise is signed into law.

"We're seeing stories every day right here of people who are being arrested bringing so much fentanyl across our border that it can kill millions and millions of people with a tiny, tiny dose," Walorski added.

In 2021, over 71,000 U.S. citizens died from fentanyl overdoses, which accounts for about two-thirds of overdose deaths in the United States last year.

English passing rates are stabilizing after a drop during the pandemic. And math performance went up a bit. State Board of Education member Scott Bess admits he's "anxious" about what's to come. More than half of Hoosier students failed the English portion of the test, both last year and this year. All grade levels had math passing rates below 50-percent except third graders, whose passing rate edged up after dropping last year.

The Berrien County Health Officer told WSBT the virus presents as a pimple-like rash that will pop up wherever contact with the infection has occurred. Monkeypox is not considered a deadly illness, but health officials ask those who are infected to get tested, isolate, and wear a mask to fight its spread.

All four were killed in the crash.

At least, that's according to the owner of Mt. Comfort RV in Hancock County. Ken Eckstein said that over the last year he has sold more RVs to people ages 18 to 34 and any other demographic.

"When you look at the millennials, they are much more outdoor people. They like hiking, they like boating, they like bicycling, and I think that plays right into what we offer here," Eckstein said to WISH-TV.

At first, he said the surge was fueled by the COVID pandemic, people who usually would not consider buying an RV or camper were in search of something to do. One of the few things he says you could do was camp. That same group of people is still buying up RV's nearly two years after the lockdowns were lifted.

Eckstein added that surging gas prices, inflation, and rising interest rates haven't hampered sales either. He said in today's age of always being on your phone, he feels millennials are taking RVs as a breath of fresh air.

"What we're doing is selling a product that by design gets you away from that screen, gets you out with your family, with your loved ones, out with people, and you're interacting in a very personal way," Eckstein said.

Most of the world's RVs are made in Elkhart.

The website "NiceRx" ranks Indiana seventh in the nation for drug deaths between 2013 and 2020. Their report says more than 17 thousand people overdosed in those years.
