

1	Participated in Career Fair	On October 17, 2018 the station participated in a job and internship fair held on the campus of the University of Tennessee and sponsored by the College of Communications and Information. News Managers, on air staff, Sales Manager, Production Supervisor, and station employee alumni participated, meeting with attendees and discussing job/internship opportunities with WVLT, as well as academic paths needed to obtain a job.
		On January 23, 2019 the News Director participated in a career fair event at the Columbia Convention Center sponsored by the University of South Carolina. The News Director meet with students and discussed both academic career paths in journalism as well as job/internship opportunities at WVLT-TV.
2	Participate in Events Sponsored by Education Institutions relating to Careers in Broadcasting	Several times each a semester on an ongoing basis the WVLT General Manager teaches Media Leadership classes at the University of Tennessee School of Communications. Topics discussed are what to expect when looking for a job in the field of broadcast journalism and leadership development. Three classes were taught during the period (April 2018, August 2018 and February 2019). There are 15-20 Junior/Senior level students in each class. On March 08, 2019 a station tour was conducted for Roane State Community College Mass Communication students (10 participants). They were introduced to behind the scenes of a newscast, and spent time with producers, reporters and managers providing a real-world perspective on working in local television. Station managers volunteer as speakers for upper level classes (20-25 students) at the University of Tennessee School of Communications. During this period class presentations were presented by the National Sales Manager (02/28/19), Creative Services Producer (01/15/19), Multi Media Journalist (02/12/19), Sports Anchor (03/05/19), News Director (3/14/19) and Anchor (3/28/19).
		A WVLT Primary Anchor is the course instructor at

		University of Tennessee for the upper level TV News Reporting (JREM411). This is a class open to upperclassmen and is designed to give the students the tools needed to be successful multimedia journalists. In addition to reporting, classes are held on career pathing, networking, how to interview, developing your professional career personality profile and developing your resume reel. Class of 25 students. On Nov 29, 2018 and Jan 24, 2019 the News Director spoke to an upper level TV Journalism class of 30 students at the University of South Carolina about career paths and breaking into the business of television news. On March 7, 2019 a WVLT Primary Anchor spoke about careers in television. This meeting was hosted by the University of Tennessee Center for Career Development for their student athletes.
3	Participate in Events Sponsored by Community Groups interested in Broadcast Employment	On June 21, 2018 the WVLT General Manager was a presenter at the Tennessee Association of Broadcasters Radio Talent Institute. A group of 12 students from across the state of Tennessee were competitively selected by TAB to attend this week long event. The presentation was titled "Broadcasting: Whether on Camera, On the Mic, Sales or Production" gave the students a look not only to WVLT-TV, but to the opportunities in the television industry. On Wednesday, March 13 eight upper level high school students from Grace Christian Academy participated in the Winterim 2019 career event. This five day event (Mar 11-15, 2019) was sponsored by a variety of local businesses to introduce students to various career opportunities and areas of study. WVLT General Manager was part of the organizing committee. Those managers speaking with the students from WVLT were the Director of Marketing and Operations, News Director, Local Sales Manager, and Community Relations Coordinator. On Feb 18, 2019 WVLT provided the guest speaker (Primary Anchor) for the UT Women's Roundtable. This event is sponsored by Partners in Sports which founded the Women's Roundtable to assist female student athletes in creating career opportunities for future leaders through practical experiences and professional development opportunities. The organization is active within the university and regional sports community. There were 25 participants.
