Flathead Valley Issues-July 2023

- 1. **Homeless.** The number of homeless people continues to increase.
- 2. **Affordable Housing.** Inventory of homes simply not available. People paying up to \$100,00 over asking price.
- 3. **Increased Population.** Flathead County population estimated to be between 105,000 to as high as 130,000 residents, based on DMV new licenses issued.
- 4. **Shortage of Law Enforcement Officers.** Flathead County Sheriff's Deputies and local Police Departments report a need for more personnel.
- 5. **Local Workforce.** The local workforce is shrinking. Businesses are running shorter hours and closing on certain days.
- 6. **Drug Use.** Thefts and vandalism, usually associated with drug use continues.
- 7. **Cost of Living.** Pressure from the population explosion is causing extreme price *increases on all consumer prices*.
- 8. **Fentanyl.** Law enforcement agencies at every level tell us people are dying from black market fentanyl.
- 9. **Property Taxes.** Rising home values are pushing property taxes to levels that many can no longer afford.
- 10. **Need for more funds to support Fire/EMT & Police.** Expanding City Limits increasing response times.
