**Public Service Announcements:**

- **Wichita Spirit- Community Calendar:** Created WEEKLY :30 second spots- Highlighting activities, events in Greater Wichita area.
- **Adopt KS-** Featured 2 new children for adoption each month in this :30 second PSA for the Kansas Children's Service League.

**KSAS PROMOTION ACTIVITIES INCLUDED:**

Created bi-weekly 2-minute news segments, "Pay it Forward" for our 9pm News. Feature highlights local volunteers making a difference in our community. Topics included: Homeless healthcare, blankets for veterans, Eating disorders, Scleroderma, food for agencies and Scoliosis.

KSAS co-sponsored the "Polar Xpress" Child literacy fundraiser for Child Start. 200 adults and children attended the 'breakfast-for-dinner' event. An auction raised nearly \$24,000 for the Head Start Kid Scholarships and Child Start program. The evening was hosted by FOX Kansas News at Nine Anchor, Jasmine Haynes.

In addition, one-hundred sixty books were collected for the Children!

KSAS-FOX Kansas co-sponsored "Boo at the Zoo" the weekend before Halloween. Over eight-thousand families attended for a fun & safe Halloween experience featuring our "Scary-O-Kee" song stage. Profits from the event go to the Sedgwick County Zoo's animal winter food fund.

KSAS co-sponsored the Arc's Lights event. Nearly 12,000 cars drive thru holiday events with donations helping persons and children with developmental disabilities. Over \$100,000 was raised for The Arc of Sedgwick County.
