I am urging our government and community leaders, agencies, and community groups to respond with the same level of urgency for the SEIS. We need to hear from our government experts on the impacts of the revised build-up plans. In particular, how will the population boom, which is highly

concentrated in the north, impact residents who live in the NCS / Finegayan area along Route 3? What will be the impacts on traffic, water supply, waste water treatment, housing, public safety, and the overall environment?

These new build-up plans will also lead to the loss of critical native habitat and increase the potential spread of invasive species. The pristine Ritidian Fish and Wildlife Refuge will be greatly impacted by the preferred site for the Live Fire Training Range Complex, as it is included in the Surface Danger Zone. This will limit public access to the area, which also contains cultural and historical artifacts. According to the SEIS, the Live Fire Training Range Complex will significantly impact 196 acres of Mariana fruit bat recovery habitat, Mariana crow recovery habitat, and Guam Micronesian Kingfisher recovery habitat.

We need a cost-benefit analysis to understand the true impact of this build-up, and whether or not it is worth the sacrifices our community will have to make.

We have been promised federal dollars, yet the Senate is already making cuts to community-related funding. On Friday, Sen. Carl Levin, chairman of the Senate Armed Services Committee announced that in the committee's markup of the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2015 they cut \$80.6 million to the Office of Economic Adjustment for projects related to the transfer of Marines to Guam. His release stated that in light of the Nation's budget deficit problems, the committee had to terminate, "troubled or unnecessary programs and activities." This is not a good sign moving forward, especially if we think about the needs of our government.
