Live dialogue with city government is greatly needed and has shown to contribute to transparency of local government and understanding.

<u>Trelka's Way</u> – A live discussion with Waterloo's Chief of Police. Listeners have the opportunity to ask questions directly to the Chief concerning police/community relations.

Due to the strained relationship between Police officers and community residents because of both national and local incidents, communication is vitally needed. This program provides an opportunity for the public and the Chief of Police to have an ongoing dialogue concerning community/Police relations to seek solutions.

<u>Parents Love Your Children</u> - Promoting the importance of reading literacy for children. Provides tips to parents and others in the community to help the growth of a child's reading ability.

Based on current statistics, minority student reading levels are at low levels in comparison with other students. This is a critical area that we are addressing by encouraging students and their parents to listen and participate in this live show. The goal is to provide additional activities outside of the classroom to improve students reading and comprehension levels.

<u>Waterloo Human Rights Commission</u> – A program addressing Equal Employment Opportunity Act requirements for employers and other entities within the listening area. Seeks to offer solutions on how to address these concerns through education and legal means.

Employment rates for minorities in the KBBG listening area and Waterloo in particular are double digits compared to the posted rate of unemployment. This problem partly has been due to discriminatory practices by employers.

This program attempts to inform listeners of their rights under the law to retain and seek employment.
