COMMUNITY:

1. AURORA SHOOTINGS/PRAYER VIGIL. AIRED 7/23/12 on all shows.
THE AURORA THEATER TRAGEDY TOUCHED MORE THAN JUST THE VICTIMS AND THEIR FAMILIES.SUNDAY NIGHT THOUSANDS TURNED OUT FOR A PRAYER VIGIL AT THE AURORA MUNICIPAL CENTER TO SHOW THEIR SUPPORT.THEY SAY, THEY'RE DETERMINED NOT TO LET ONE MAN'S ACTION RUIN THE SPIRIT OF THE COMMUNITY.
2. CHRISTIAN BALE VISITS VICTIMS. AIRED 7/25/12 ON 9P.
NOT TRYING TO DRAW ANY PUBLICITY... BATMAN SURPRISES AURORA RESIDENTS WITH A VISIT IN HONOR OF THOSE AFFECTED BY THE AURORA THEATER TRAGEDY.IN THIS EXCLUSIVE CHANNEL TWO VIDEO - YOU CAN SEE CHRISTIAN BALE PAYING HIS RESPECT AT A MEMORIAL TO THE 12 PEOPLE WHO LOST THEIR LIVES LAST FRIDAY MORNING. WE SPOTTED BALE AT THE MAKESHIFT MEMORIAL OUTSIDE THE CENTURY 16 THEATERS WHERE THE SHOOTING HAPPENED. HE ALSO VISITED PATIENTS AT THE MEDICAL CENTER OF AURORA... TAKING TIME TO TALK AND POSE FOR PICTURES WITH BOTH THE SURVIVORS AND STAFF MEMBERS. PATIENTS STARTED TWEETING PHOTOS... GETTING THE NEWS OUT BALE WAS IN TOWN. BALE SPENT ABOUT TWO AND A HALF HOURS THERE. COINCIDENTALLY, A FACEBOOK USER REPORTEDLY HAD BEGUN AN ONLINE PETITION TO GET BALE TO VISIT THE YOUNGEST VICTIMS OF THE TRAGEDY DRESSED AS BATMAN.

1. **GLOBAL WARMING WARNING. AIRED 7/31/12 ON 5P & 9P.**
COLORADO STRUGGLES THROUGH ONE OF THE WORST HEAT, DROUGHT AND WILDFIRE SUMMERS ON RECORD. FOLLOWING A WINTER OF RECORD LOW SNOWPACK. A NEW REPORT FROM ENVIRONMENT COLORADO BLAMES OUR BOOM OR BUST WEATHER CYCLE ON THE DIRE CONSEQUENCES OF RAPID CLIMATE CHANGE. WHICH MANY CALL "GLOBAL WARMING."EXTREME STORMS CAUSING TORRENTIAL DOWNPOURS LIKE WE SAW IN DENVER LAST JULY AND EARLY THIS JUNE. AND ACROSS MUCH OF THE COUNTRY WITH WIDESPREAD FLOODING. 1. **OBESITY IN KIDS. Aired 9/20/12 on GDCO & EVERYDAY.**
TOPPING YOUR HEALTH NEWS THIS MORNING...TODAY'S CHILDREN MAY BE THE FIRST IN AMERICA'S HISTORY TO LIVE SHORTER LIVES THAN THEIR PARENTS... AND MUCH OF THAT IS TIED TO OBESITY.EXPERTS SAY ONE OF THE BEST WAYS TO CURB THE OBESITY EPIDEMIC IS TO FOCUS ON CHILDREN, AND GET THEM ON A HEALTHY PATH RIGHT FROM THE START... HOUSING:

1. BUYING YOUR FIRST HOME TIPS. Aired 8/31/12 on GDCO.

Buying your first home can be exciting. It lets you build equity, and it can help you save on taxes. Here's our look at some smart strategies for getting in the door. It can also be nerve-wracking. Certified Financial Planner, Denisa Tova, is here with tips to buy your first home..Prepare yourself financially before you start shopping: Check your credit report. Dispute any inaccurate information. You need to raise your credit score to a minimum of mid 600s to get a loan and ideally above to qualify for a low interest rate. Pay down debt before you apply. Your new house payment plus insurance, taxes and utilities, should not be more than 40% of your monthly gross income. Have money for a down payment, closing costs (can be 5-7% of the total transaction and have to paid in cash!), and some cushion for emergencies. If you have a steady paycheck steady job and good credit you can buy a home with less than a 20% down payment. But the more money you can muster for a down payment, the more options you will have. If your credit not so good, you

may qualify for FHA loan insured by the Federal Housing Administration. Has lenient credit criteria; can put down as little as 3.5%. Depending on the lender, interest rates typically a quarter to half a point higher than for conventional loans. Finally, gather important documents: canceled checks (if you've been renting from a private landlord), bank statements, student loan paperwork, W2s, the most recent pay stub, and tax returns. Visit with a mortgage planner to see if and what you qualify for. If you are not able to get into a home now, work out a plan with your lender. So just because the interest rates are low, doesn't mean you should be rushing into buying a home.

THE SUSPECT IN THE AURORA THEATER TRAGEDY IS EXPECTED IN COURT THIS MORNING. JAMES HOLMES WILL FACE A JUDGE AT 9:30 IN AN ARAPAHOE COUNTY COURTROOM.AND WE CONTINUE TO LEARN NEW DETAILS ABOUT WHAT HAPPENED FROM THE WITNESSES AND SURVIVORS.12 PEOPLE DIED IN THE SHOOTING EARLY FRIDAY MORNING. THEY RANGE IN AGE FROM SIX, TO 51-YEARS OLD. 58-OTHER PEOPLE WERE INJURED, SOME OF THEM ARE STILL IN THE HOSPITAL THIS MORNING FIGHTING FOR THEIR LIVES. THE SUSPECT BOOBY-TRAPPED HIS APARTMENT.. BUT POLICE SAFELY REMOVED ALL THE EXPLOSIVES AND CHEMICALS OVER THE WEEKEND.
