She wanted to assure listeners who are still without power that they are working as hard as possible to restore everyone's power, and advised everyone to stay far away from any and all downed power lines and always use generators according to the manufacturer's guidelines. Seay concluded by thanking their hard working crews, along with everyone for their patience and encouraging words.
