Mental Health	"Community Connect"	August 5 6am	15 Minutes	In this show our Brush listeners heard from child and youth psychiatrist Montserrat Dolz shed light on the common challenges adolescents face during a period of significant change. She emphasizes the importance of recognizing

				early signs of mental health issues in children and teenagers. Dr. Dolz highlights that anxiety and depression are prevalent among adolescents when things do go wrong. She calls upon adults to be vigilant and attentive to persistent changes in young people's behavior, citing the World Health Organization's statistics that show a substantial percentage of adolescents experiencing or expected to experience mental health problems. Dr. Dolz's work in early detection and prevention, as well as her involvement in the FAROS project at the Sant Joan de Déu Hospital, underscores the significance of proactive measures to enhance the future health and quality of life for young individuals.
