KING 5 Special Presentation: Tokitae's Journey

Wednesday, May 31st, 2023 7:00 – 8:00P [Premiere Broadcast]

In this hour-long KING 5 News special, co-hosted by Greg Copeland and Joyce Taylor, we are in Miami and Nova Scotia looking at the plan to bring Tokitae, the last surviving orca captured from Puget Sound in the 1960s and 1970s, back to the waters she was taken from. In addition to the plan, we look at what it could cost, the approval steps needed, and how they'll keep her protected in the sea-pen once she's home. We also travel to Nova Scotia to get an up-close look at the area and plan for the first ever whale sanctuary in North America. We talk with researchers about the challenges of getting it up and running, and how those lessons could be applied to moving Tokitae.
