08:00 - 08:30P COPS "PALM BEACH" (CP-1403) (TV-PG: L)  
"SURVEILLANCE STING" - During a Narcotics Unit surveillance sting, a male enters the vehicle and completes the cocaine buy with an accomplice, both suspects are immediately arrested without incident. "BABY, MAMA, DRAMA" - At the scene of a domestic dispute, a female victim tells officers that her child's father (who fled the scene) threatened her with a knife when he found out that their child was taken into custody by the Children's Services Department. Officers locate the suspect, who still has the knife, and takes him into custody without incident. "MY HEAD HURTS" - When a Deputy is dispatched to a disturbance in progress, the officer finds a male victim who had been severely wounded by an estranged friend. He describes how the suspect hit him with a shovel because he owed the suspect twenty dollars. Officers locate the suspect and arrest him after he admits to hitting the victim in self-defense.

08:30 - 09:00P COPS "ATLANTA: AMW CROSSOVER SPECIAL EDITION" (CP-1409) (R-09/01/2001) (TV-14: L,V)  
"DADDY D'S PURSUIT" - When an Officer responds to a report of a man who has pulled a weapon on a young female. Officers spot the suspect, attempting to pull him over, the suspect refuses to stop and a brief chase ensues. He is captured and taken into custody. "CANDY'S DATE" - An Officer spots a man and a woman suspiciously emerge from behind a dirt hill near a restaurant which has had several complaints of prostitution and drug activity. During a routine search, crack cocaine is found in his pocket. He's arrested for possession. "HAPPY PERP" - When Officers assist in the pursuit of an armed and dangerous robbery suspect, the pursuit ends when the suspect collides with another vehicle. The suspect flees on foot but is quickly apprehended. He admits to his misdeeds and claims that he is on the FBI's most wanted list.

08:00 - 08:30P COPS "COAST TO COAST" (CP-1421) (TV-PG: L,V)

"FORT WORTH: DITCH, HOP & RUN" - An officer attempts to pull over a stolen vehicle being driven by two male suspects, both suspects flee on foot through a residential area. The passenger is immediately apprehended while the driver is later spotted casually walking down the street. "DES MOINES: DRIVING STUPID" - After an officer attempts to pull over a speeding vehicle, a brief chase ensues ending when the driver ultimately stops the vehicle. During questioning, the inebriated driver eventually admits he had consumed two beers. "CHATTANOOGA: MAN AT MY DOOR" - When an officer responds to a scream for help at a local residence, a male juvenile tells the officers that a man tried to break into his house. The officer speculates that the ex-husband of the homeowner may be the suspect since he arrested him for a similar crime at the residence the week before.

08:30 - 09:00P COPS "PALM BEACH" (CP-1408) (R-09/01/2001) (TV-PG)

"SMASHED AND GRABBED" - Deputies respond to a burglary in progress when a resident of an apartment complex calls dispatchers while observing two suspects burglarizing vehicles. Deputies spot the suspects leaving the apartment complex and quickly take them into custody. "LIVIN' LARGE" - Deputies become suspicious when an agitated female passenger refuses to present her identification after being pulled over with a busted taillight. During a routine search of the vehicle, officers find drug paraphernalia, which the driver denies is his, but informs officers that his passenger planned to go to the hospital the next day for drug rehabilitation. "SLEEPING BEAUTY" - A suspect is arrested for grand theft auto and possession of drug paraphernalia when a Deputy responds to a report of a stolen van.

"FORT WORTH: THE CONFESSOR" - When an officer pulls over a suspicious vehicle leaving a well known drug house, the driver admits to using cocaine and tells officers that he may have consumed six or more beers that day. "DES MOINES: LOST & FOUND CHILD" - When an officer responds to a call of a lost five-year-old child, the father of the lost juvenile boy tells the officer that his son suddenly ran out of his house and is nowhere to be found. A neighbor later informs him that his son was found and after the father and son are reunited.

08:30 - 09:00P COPS "COAST TO COAST" (CP-1410) (R-09/08/2001) (TV-14: L,S)  
"DES MOINES: ROAD RAGE BASHER" - Officers respond to an assault call and encounter a group of people involved in a heated argument resulting from a traffic dispute. An infuriated female is immediately taken into custody after she is ordered to discard a tire iron. "ATLANTA: YOU AIN'T DEAD" - When an officer responds to a 911 hang-up call, he ends up at a local trailer park where he's immediately greeted by a female who claims that her boyfriend battered and kicked her. "CHATTANOOGA: A LITTLE FUN" - While on routine patrol, an officer spots a suspicious vehicle parked on the side of a road. The Officer approaches the vehicle and finds the driver partially nude. In exchange for leniency, the driver tells the officer that he paid the female occupant twenty dollars for her services. The female is arrested for prostitution and an outstanding warrant.

08:00 - 08:30P COPS "COAST TO COAST" (CP-1422) (TV-PG: L,V)  
"FORT WORTH: HIP SHOT" - When an officer spots a suspected stolen vehicle, he tries to initiate a stop but the driver refuses to pull over and a chase ensues. The driver and the passenger suddenly bale out of the moving vehicle and flees on foot through a residential neighborhood.  
"CHATTANOOGA: ALL OVER A WOMAN" - When officers respond to a call regarding a fight at a local bar, they learn that a male subject threw a drink on a woman after she refused to dance with him. The woman's boyfriend came to her defense and the two men began to fight outside of the bar. "DES MOINES: CRACKED LOVE" - An officer lends assistance to a call regarding a domestic dispute and is greeted by an upset female who informs him that her brother shoved her. When it turns out that the man and woman had been drinking and smoking marijuana, the man calmly admits to shoving his sister and is subsequently arrested.

08:30 - 09:00P COPS "COAST TO COAST" (CP-1413) (R-09/22/2001) (TV-PG)  
"ATLANTA: IN THE DITCH" - An officer attempts to pull over a speeding vehicle, the driver refuses to stop and a pursuit ensues. The dangerous high-speed chase ends when the suspect bails out of the vehicle before it crashes into a creek bed at a 45-degree angle. "CHATTANOOGA: KUDZU CAPTURE" - When officers respond to a call regarding a domestic dispute, they question the victim who tells them that the suspect, her husband, assaulted her and fled the scene. Eventually, the officers' catch up with him and with guns drawn, surrenders and is taken into custody. "DES MOINES: DIRTY BOYS 2" - While on patrol, officers stop a suspicious vehicle driving with no headlights. The driver of the vehicle explains that the battery in the vehicle is dying leaving him with no lights.

In Des Moines, officers assist another unit pursuing a suspect who bailed out of his car during a routine traffic stop. After police arrest the man, they discover marijuana stuffed in the back seat of a squad car.

When the driver fails to stop, a high-speed chase ensues through a residential area.

A small caliber gun and marijuana are found on the suspect during a search. "DES MOINES - KP KITCHEN" - Officers respond to a call regarding a domestic dispute at a local residence. The Officer's attention shifts to the unsanitary condition of the residence after finding the kitchen filthy. The woman is warned that her children will be taken away if she does not clean the kitchen immediately. "ATLANTA - GRAVEYARD THREESOME" - Officers assist an undercover unit in the investigation of a suspicious vehicle, they find it parked behind a local cemetery. As the officers approach the vehicle, the occupants immediately flee on foot and are eventually apprehended.
