08:00 - 08:30P COPS "FORT WORTH" (CP-1214) (TV-14: L,V)  
"BIG DOG, BIG GUN" - Officers find a male suspect hiding in the woods, who is believed to be carrying a high-powered assault weapon. "LOOK BEYOND THE COVER" - Officers respond to a domestic dispute at a nearby residence, where the man alleges his wife threw things at him during a heated argument, but she shows the officers marks on her arms and neck and alleges that they are the result of her husband physically attacking her. "SLIPPERY STEPHANIE" - Officers respond to a domestic dispute involving a mother and her daughter. The daughter, who was just released from juvenile detention, is clearly high and she utters repeated profanity at the officers. They cuff her and place her in the back of their patrol car. However, while in the backseat, the girl grows even more agitated and manages to slip out of her handcuffs. She screams profanity at both the officers and her mother. The officers eventually manage to cuff the beastly girl and return her to the patrol car. The officers explain to the mother that the girl is in need of some serious help.

08:30 - 09:00P COPS "PALM BEACH" (CP-1122) (RR-06/12/1999, 10/02/1999) (TV-14)  
"HOOKER STING" Members of the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office organize a prostitution sting designed to arrest suspects soliciting prostitution from undercover female officers posing as hookers. "MY MOTHER, MY MADAM" Riviera Beach Police Officer Joseph Hoffman responds to a call involving an altercation taking place at a nearby residence. "COCKTAIL PARTY" Several Riviera Beach Police Officers converge upon the scene of an apparent fire-bombing.



Saturday, December 11, 1999

08:00 - 08:30P COPS "INDIANAPOLIS" (CP-1206) (TV-PG: L)  
"AROUND THE CORNER'" -- Police officers respond to a robbery in progress call at a nearby mini-mart, but the suspects have already fled, but are apprehended near the store after being identified by the store owner. "POPPIN' MOM'S PILLS" - A young girl, distraught and hyperventilating, has overdosed on her mother's pain medication and screams that she hates her mother and wants to move out. Paramedics arrive and she is taken to the hospital, her mother urged to lock her medication away in the future. "CAUGHT RED SHIRTED" -- With search warrant in hand, Indianapolis Police Officers raid a trailer believed to be the residence of known drug dealers. Inside the trailer, a female suspect (white) is found and she cooperates with the officers. The suspect, whose boyfriend is the apparent leader of the operation, leads the officers to a stash of rock cocaine hidden in the boyfriend's belongings. The suspect, who has children, is urged to cooperate with the police.

08:30 - 09:00P COPS "ARIZONA" (CP-1132) (R-07/31/1999) (TV-14)  
"STOLEN OUTTA L.A." Maricopa County Sheriff's Deputy David Parra joins in the pursuit of a stolen vehicle containing two male suspects. "TWEETING TWEETER" Mesa Police Officer Stacey Adams receives a report of two transients, a male and a female, walking dangerously in and out of traffic. "STOLEN CAR, STOLEN CREDIT" Mesa Police Officers spot a reported stolen vehicle containing two suspects.

08:00 - 08:30P COPS "INDIANAPOLIS" (CP-1207) (TV-PG: L)  
"WHAT A DOPE" - A suspect who bailed out of his vehicle is being chased on foot. In his truck, police find a large amount of marijuana and an electronic scale. A K-9 locates the suspect hiding in the attic of what turns out to be his mother's home. "I'M SMASHED" -- At the scene of a car accident, officers learn the driver apparently veered off the road, traveled through a patch of thick brush, and smashed full-speed into a telephone pole.

08:30 - 09:00P COPS "PALM BEACH" (CP-1124) (RR-09/04/1999, 11/06/1999) (TV-14)  
"EAT CRACK, RUN HOME" Palm Beach County Sheriff's Deputy P. Johnson stops a vehicle with an improperly displayed tag. Inside are two male suspects. "YOU SAY TOMATO. I SAY THIEF" While on routine patrol, Palm Beach County Sheriff's Deputy Jeff Lower spots a suspect apparently stealing produce from a road-side stand. "JOKER GETS HIS MAN" Martin County Sheriff's Deputy Forrest Yingling assists another deputy involved in a confrontation with two male suspects who were stopped for a routine traffic violation.

*The following are the featured fugitives and others being sought by federal, state or local authorities. The Update (if any) gives current status, previous references, or related information.*

**Jorge Coronel (Murder)** B On January 5, 1998, Chicago police responded to a call from one of Coronel=s relatives who reported Jorge and his wife Arcelia missing because they hadn=t been seen for a few days. When the police went to investigate, they noticed a foul smell emanating from within the Coronels= apartment. They discovered the body of 28-year-old Arcelia Coronel. She had been strangled, her body placed in large plastic bags and hidden in a bedroom closet behind a fake wall. Police theorize that Arcelia was killed on the evening of December 24<sup>th</sup> or 25<sup>th</sup>, 1997. Jorge Coronel and the couple=s three children were nowhere to be found. On December 29, 1997, Jorge dropped the kids off at a relative=s house in Mexico. He hasn=t been seen since. Police believe a possible motive is that Jorge and Arcelia had been experiencing marital problems and Arcelia had threatened divorce. At the time of the crime, Jorge Coronel had a shaved head. He has worked as a short-order cook. Coronel is 37, 5'9" and 200 pounds.

**Arthur Torres (Murder, Kidnapping)** B According to Los Angeles police, on the night of May 11, 1999 Torres and an accomplice attempted to carjack a man at a local gas station. When the owner of the car fled on foot, Torres and his accomplice took off in their vehicle. Five minutes later the owner returned to his car and drove to get help. As he turned the corner he witnessed Torres= accomplice shooting two young teenage boys standing outside. Torres was driving the getaway vehicle. The witness called the police, who arrived at the scene shortly thereafter. In the meantime, Torres ditched his car on the other side of town. He and his accomplice then started on foot. Shortly thereafter they ran into Humberto Salas and two young women, aged 20 and 19. Humberto recognized Torres and stopped to help him and his friend. For no apparent reason Torres and his accomplice began beating Humberto. During the struggle the 20-year-old woman escaped and ran for help. Afterwards Torres and his accomplice threw Humberto in the back seat of his car and told the 19-year-old woman to drive. What happened next is unclear, but police believe they drove the vehicle to a known gang house, where they beat and strangled Humberto until he was almost unconscious. During this, the 20-year-old managed



to call for help. When the police got the 911 call they did not realize the kidnapping and shooting were linked. As they were putting the crimes together, Torres and his accomplice were continuing their reign of terror. The 19-year-old was again forced to drive the car. Torres scooped Humberto=s eyes out, saying ALook, here is your homie=s eyes@. The two men forced the girl to pull over as they tossed his body over a cliff. In the meantime, police arrived at the phone booth where the 20-year-old had made the 911 call. As the woman and the police searched for Torres a car came speeding at them. Police recognized the car, and Torres and his accomplice jumped out unseen by the authorities. The 19-year-old, terrified, continued to drive. Police, unaware who was driving, followed the car as Torres and his accomplice ran. By the time police returned they were able to arrest Torres= accomplice at the gang house, but Torres was gone. Torres is known to have a girlfriend who has family in Texas. He was last spotted on May 13 when he was arrested by a drug squad. Torres had \$13,000 in cash on him but no drugs, so he surrendered the money and was set free. Torres, who has used the aliases Art Torres, Arturo Torres, and Arthurben Torres, has scars on his chin, left elbow and head, and tattoos on both arms, his knee and his back. Torres is 24, 6'0" and 210 pounds.

**David Kemp (Murder)** B On August 5, 1998 Tina Cremer Kemp divorced her husband of five years, David Kemp. Six days later she was dead, along with her new boyfriend, Robert Miller. The couple was shot in Rob Miller=s apartment. Rob was in the kitchen; Tina was in the shower. All evidence pointed towards David Kemp, but before cops could question him he skipped town. Thirteen days later cops found him in Bishop, California. Kemp engaged them in a two-hour stand-off and demanded to talk to his mother. After cops lowered a cell phone behind a fence, Kemp talked to his mother for a bit before he was taken down with non-lethal beanbag shots. He was taken into custody and flown back to Lawton, Oklahoma to face the music in the Comanche County Jail. On March 11, 1999 a jail trustee stole a barbecue fork from the kitchen and pulled it on the one guard on duty that night. He locked the guard in a cell and unlocked several other inmates. Nine inmates escaped. Eight were recovered. The only one still missing is David Kemp. The last official sighting of David Kemp was in June of 1999. He was checked into the Vista Motel and, by all accounts, he was an ideal tenant. He kept to himself and always paid his rent on time. But one day he didn=t pay his rent and the night manager came calling. He found Kemp had barricaded himself into the bathroom. The manager knocked down the door and Kemp was lying in the bathtub with a knife on his stomach and covered with blood. It looked like Kemp had tried to kill himself, but when the doctors examined his wounds, they found they were only superficial cuts. He did get out of paying his rent, however. He was last seen getting into his brother=s black Firebird at a gas station on the outskirts of Las Vegas. Kemp should be considered armed, dangerous, and extremely unstable. Kemp has used the aliases Ian Melancon and David Glover. He has scars on his wrists from a failed suicide attempt. He always wears a baseball cap, and likes hot rod and matchbox cars. He has been known to work as a janitor, carpenter, and oil rigger. Kemp is 29, 6'3" and 200 pounds. (See Show #557, OAD 9/11/99)

**Grahlman-Blore Killer (Murder)** B On October 23, 1998, Hans Grahlman and Jason Blore were gunned down by an unknown killer at Hans= mountaintop estate in Sonoma County,



California. Hans, 52, was a gay millionaire nightclub owner who made his fortune owning and operating gay bars in San Francisco, Guerneville, California, and Hawaii. Jason Blore, 26, worked for Hans as a bartender in one of his nightclubs and did handyman jobs for Hans in his spare time. On the day Hans and Jason were murdered, Jason was doing some roof repair work to Hans' house. Detectives from the Sonoma County Sheriff's department do not have a suspect or motive in this case. Using ballistic evidence and the location of the bodies, detectives determined that an armed assailant emerged from the woods and shot Hans as he stood in the front yard talking to Jason. The shooter then chased Jason into the house and shot him as he was desperately trying to call the police. The mysterious assassin left only one clue at the crime scene: a bone-handled bowie knife with blue paint stuck to the blade tip. In addition to trying to find out who murdered Hans and Jason, an international search is underway to locate two children Hans fathered between 1959 and 1964 by a British woman he was married to somewhere in Kansas. Those children would be in their late thirties by now and the rightful heirs to the multi-million dollar estate Hans Grahlman left behind. Little else is known about their identities or who their mother is.

**Unknown (Murder)** -- On December 3, 1997 four bodies were found in a warehouse in the small rural town of Bartow in Florida, near Tampa. The victims were 69-year-old George Gonsalves (one of three owners), 35-year-old Frank Dosso (employee and son of Phil Dosso, another owner), 26-year-old George Patisso (employee and son-in-law of Phil Dosso) and 26-year-old Diane Patisso (Asst. Prosecutor in Polk County, daughter of Phil Dosso and George Patisso's wife. FDLE Special Agent Tommy Ray says all four were shot execution style. He believes the murders were a professional hit based on evidence found at the scene and information developed from the investigation. The warehouse housed two companies, Erie Manufacturing/Garment Conveyor Systems, that manufactured metal racks used in dry cleaning businesses and department stores. The three partners were George Gonsalves (one of the victims), Phil Dosso (father of 2 victims and father-in-law to one victim) and Nelson Serrano. On June 3, 1997 Phil and George voted to demote Nelson and strip him of his powers. That vote angered Nelson. He filed a civil lawsuit and created a competing business across town, American Slick Rail, Inc. A task force comprised of Bartow Police, Lakeland Police, FBI, Tenth Judicial Circuit State Attorney's Office and the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) is investigating this quadruple homicide. Detectives believe there are 2-3 suspects. The suspect is believed to have been the lookout for the team. The suspect is well dressed, possibly from South America, and should be considered armed and dangerous. He is probably a professional hit man, part of a team. Police think there are 2-3 other suspects. (See Show #530, OAD 2/20/99)

**Ronald Eugene Applegate (Rape of a Child)** B Between July 1998 and March 1989, Ronald Applegate molested two 13-year-old girls. In 1989 one of the victims came forward, but the other victim denied the abuse. In 1994 Applegate learned of the investigation and left the state. In 1996, Applegate's second victim finally got the courage to come forward. She told authorities about the abuse and admitted that the baby she gave birth to in 1991 was Applegate's. In 1996 Applegate was charged with six counts of Raping a Child and Unlawful



Flight to Avoid Prosecution. He hasn't been seen since. Applegate has a small birthmark on the back of his neck. He suffers from sore joints and ligaments which may cause him to walk stiffly, and he may be taking anti-inflammatory medication. He is a good handyman and mechanic; he has worked as a boat mechanic and once had his own contracting business. Applegate is 63, 5'8" and 180 pounds.

#### AMW ALL-POINTS BULLETINS:

**Tracy Grady (Attempted Murder, Robbery)** B Albany police say on November 13, 1999 Tracy Grady was approached by Albany police officers Stanley Nadorski and Thomas Shea. They began to question him about a previous domestic dispute when Grady ran away. They caught him and a struggle ensued. During that struggle, Grady managed to get a gun from one of the officers. He fired one shot at Shea, hitting him in the shoulder, then turned the gun on Nadorski. He shot Nadorski in the face, ran off, then returned and fired again. He then fled on foot. Authorities in Richmond, Virginia found an abandoned van the following Monday. They soon discovered that Grady stole the van from Albany to get away. Next, he bought a one-way Greyhound bus ticket to St. Louis. Grady called his family from a St. Louis funeral home. However, Grady left the funeral home before the police could get their hands on him. Shea is at home recovering from a gunshot wound to the shoulder, and Nadorski is still in fair condition in the hospital, suffering gunshot wounds to the jaw, chest and abdomen. There is a \$25,500 reward for information leading to Grady's arrest. Police believe he is still in the St. Louis area. Grady is 33, 5'8" and 180 pounds. (See Show #567, OAD 11/27/99)

**Mark Strbac (Murder)** -- On October 30, 1995, Mark Strbac shot and killed Martino Green in a car in a Cleveland, Ohio suburb. Martino's body was later found in a park located on the shores of Lake Erie, on the outskirts of Cleveland. Strbac, Martino, Anthony Frankos and two other friends were at a Halloween party when Strbac mentioned that Martino had borrowed twenty dollars and never paid it back. Strbac told his friends that he was going to jump Martino. After leaving that party, Strbac was driven by Frankos and Martino to Strbac's home. Strbac went into his house, picked up a 3-80 automatic handgun and then got in the back seat of Franko's car, directly behind Martino. While driving, Strbac pulled out the gun and fired eight rounds into the back of Martino's head. Both Frankos and Strbac dumped Martino's body in a park, then cleaned Frankos' Jeep of the blood. Frankos plea bargained and told the judge that he feared Strbac would shoot him if he did not cooperate. Frankos was sentenced to two and a half years for tampering with evidence. Strbac bonded out on \$100,000 and went on the run just days before his May 14, 1996 trial. Strbac has both ears pierced. He frequents sports and strip bars, and likes to play pool. He has worked as a transmission mechanic. Strbac is 26, 5'10" and 190 pounds. (See Shows #1010, #456 and #477, OADs 1/25/97, 6/28/97 and 12/13/97)

**Ronald Thomas Fleming (Rape of a Child)** B The FBI and the Michigan State Police are looking for a fugitive who may be appearing in a theater near you. Ronald Thomas Fleming

is an amateur writer, actor and producer who is also a child molester. Fleming had been getting away with his crimes for years until his wife accidentally came across pornographic photos of young boys in their home computer. Fleming denied the photos were his and explained that he inadvertently receives this type of photo over the Internet. His wife did not believe his story and decided to keep an eye on him. Eventually she found a diary that Fleming was keeping. In it he described his infatuation with a thirteen-year-old neighborhood boy. Fleming's wife became concerned about her own eight-year-old son from a previous marriage. When she questioned the child he confirmed that Ron had molested him. Police arrested Fleming in August of 1997 and under questioning he confirmed the child's story. Fleming also told police where they could find additional child pornography in his computer. Police felt that Ronald Fleming was extremely cooperative so they charged him with Rape of a Child and released him to await trial. But within days Fleming disappeared and has not been seen since. In September of 1997 police found his abandoned car in Toledo, Ohio. Fleming wears prescription glasses. He loves soap operas, won't miss *The Guiding Light* or *All My Children*, and is trying to sell a soap opera he has written. He collects comic books and writes amateur comics. He works and volunteers for amateur theater productions. He has sold and worked with computers, and has also worked as a bagel baker. He usually hangs around playgrounds or school yards. Fleming is 32, 5'6" and 140 pounds. (See Show #551, OAD 7/24/99)

**Linette Joneyce Barnett (Aiding Prisoner Escape)**

**Terry W. Banks (Escape)** B Authorities in Missouri are looking for convicted murderer Terry Banks, and his prison-guard girlfriend Lynette Barnett who helped Banks escape from a prison on October 29, 1999. Barnett, a prison guard at the Crossroads Correctional Center in Cameron, Missouri, made a fake I.D. and got a guard uniform for her convict boyfriend, Banks. Banks was serving a life sentence without parole for murder. The next day, the duo can be seen on prison surveillance tape walking out the front door of the maximum security facility. Banks, who has used the alias Chat Matthews, has several scars, including a burn scar on his entire right hand, a skin graft on his left thigh, and a 1" stab wound on his chest, and numerous tattoos, including a Tasmanian Devil under his left arm and AIV@ and a peace sign across the fingers of his left hand. He is known to use both marijuana and methamphetamines. Banks is 26, 6'0" and 190 pounds. Barnett may be using her maiden name, Lynette Moots, and may be seeking medical attention. She has a mole-removal scar on the left side of her neck, and a small mole on the left side of her nose. She also has scars from orthoscopic surgery on her left knee, and a reddish-purple rosebud tattooed on her left breast. She may be wearing wire-rimmed granny-style glasses for astigmatism; she also occasionally wears contact lenses that make her naturally green eyes look blue. She has pierced ears B one pierced three times. She smokes Maiden cigarettes, loves animals, and is described as Aoutdoorsy@. She loves pasta and tacos. Barnett is 27, 5'6" and 145 pounds. The pair may be traveling together in a 1989 black Ford F-150 Lariat XLT pickup truck with Missouri license 373-HB2. (See Show #566, OAD 11/20/99)

**William Strelow Killer (Murder)** B Police in Bloomington, Minnesota, are looking for the unidentified man responsible for the 1998 robbery of a Brinks truck which resulted in the murder of one of the truck=s guards. On November 22, 1998, William Strelow was carrying money out of a Bloomington, Minnesota Target store. Strelow=s partner radioed in to him, saying there was a suspicious man Ahanging out@ behind the truck. Strelow made the decision to exit the store anyway. The suspicious man pulled a handgun, shot Strelow and took off the

bags of money. The shooter jumped into a white Grand-Am and fled, followed by a concerned citizen. After a few blocks, the suspect managed to elude the citizen. Strelow later died of injuries sustained in the shooting. The suspect is in his late 20's to early 30's, and 5'10".

**Robert Bryant (Murder)** -- Bryant is wanted in connection with the deaths of five women in Baltimore. On Sunday, December 5, 1999 a dispatcher received a call at 7:32pm reporting a shooting. When authorities arrived at 3535 Elmley Avenue they found five women dead from gunshot wounds. Witnesses say four men fled the house where the shootings occurred and drove off in a gold Nissan Maxima. A car matching the description of the Maxima was later spotted at a nearby McDonalds. One of the men in the Maxima chased another individual into the McDonalds at gunpoint. An off-duty police officer in the McDonalds saw this activity and fired his weapon at the individual with the gun. The individual dropped his gun, ran back to the Maxima and fled the scene. Cops believe these men are the same suspects in the murders on Elmley. The men were later identified as Ismail Malik Wilson, his brother Tariq A. Malik, Tavon McCoy, and Robert Bryant. Wilson, Malik and McCoy have since been arrested, but Bryant is still at large. Bryant is a known drug dealer and should be considered armed and dangerous. Bryant is 23, 6'0" and 165 pounds. (See Show #569, OAD 12/11/99)

**William Alexander Zepeda (Murder, Armed Robbery)** B Georgia authorities say Zepeda shot and killed two employees of a northeast Atlanta restaurant in April 1998. Zepeda, along with brothers David and Joaquin Arevalo, planned a robbery of the Tanner=s Restaurant in Lawrenceville. Since David worked there and Joaquin used to work there, they already had knowledge of where the money was kept and how to get at it. Just before 9:00am on April 6, 1998 police received a call saying someone had been shot in the restaurant. Police arrived and found 32-year-old Marc Ratthaus and 32-year-old Adolfo Gonzalez in the restaurant. They had each been shot once, execution style. Police interviewed the Arevalo brothers who said that Zepeda had been the triggerman. All three were charged with murder. While the two brothers are awaiting trial, Zepeda is on the run. Zepeda has used the aliases Hernan Ernesto Mejia and Nernesto Mejia. He has a tattoo of a woman=s face on his left biceps. He is a native of El Salvador, and police believe he may be trying to blend into a Hispanic community. He may be driving a late 1980's Nissan Sentra or Toyota Camry four door, either gray or silver, with Georgia plates 598 FYL. Zepeda is 26, 5'9" and 175 pounds. (See Show #551, OAD 7/24/99)

**Unknown (Witness)** B Authorities in Arkansas would like to question a young man seen with Carson Prince shortly before her mysterious death. Prince, 19, left her house in Maumelle, Arkansas around 11:40am on the morning of April 28, 1999. She was driving a late model maroon Ford Bronco, and her destination was unknown. At around 12:15pm a witness reported seeing Carson driving slowly on the shoulder of the Arkansas River Bridge, near the Cantrell

exit, as if she was having car problems. Authorities later determined she had run out of gas. Then a witness reported seeing Carson, wearing blue jeans and a white t-shirt, standing on the east side of I-430 near the previously reported position. At 12:20pm, a witness saw Carson and her Bronco at approximately the same position with a white truck parked in front of the Bronco. Witnesses said a young man holding a gas can was standing between the white truck and the Bronco. At 12:31pm, a 911 call came into police, reporting that Carson was lying on the Arkansas River Bridge, having jumped, fallen, or been pushed from a white truck. Carson Prince died later that day from massive head injuries. Witnesses later told police that they saw Carson in a white truck with a young man. Carson and the young man were seen apparently having an argument, and Carson was seen rocking back and forth against the door before she either jumped or was pushed out of the truck. Police are now seeking the identity of the young man in the white truck. He is described as a white male in his 20s with brown hair in a Bowl@-type haircut. They are looking for the white older model Ford truck (c.1980-1996) with a license number similar to (but not exactly) YND 274. The truck was probably used in construction or on a farm, may have a construction rack, and may have a magnetic sign with red lettering on the doors.

**John Milton Feiga, Jr. (Grand Theft Auto, Murder) --** In 1995, John Feiga and Erica Richardson met, dated, and eventually Feiga moved into Erica=s new suburban Tampa home in Valrico. Feiga is described as a smooth talker, a ladies man who showered Erica with flowers, love notes and gifts. But his hidden dark side soon came out and Erica=s family said Feiga became possessive and violent. He was arrested twice for battery and Erica filed a restraining order on him in 1996. On December 8, 1997, Erica=s mother, Imogene Richardson, called her daughter who worked as the manager of the Valrico Wal-Mart pharmacy. Imogene was told Erica didn=t come to work and hadn=t called. Imogene went to her daughter=s home. The blinds were shut and no one answered the door, but when she peered into the kitchen window, Imogene said she saw blood and a knife. Erica=s body was discovered in the hallway next to the kitchen. Detectives say she was stabbed 62 times. Erica was thirty-three years old at the time of her death. Detectives said Feiga was missing and so was Erica=s Honda. Two weeks later, Erica=s car was found in a hospital parking lot in Lafayette, Louisiana, about 60 miles north of New Orleans. Coincidentally, Feiga grew up and still has family nearby in a tiny town called New Roads. Feiga has an outstanding warrant for his arrest for grand theft auto, and detectives want to question him about Erica Richardson=s murder. Feiga has a pierced left ear and may have shaved his head. He has several tattoos, including AFeiga@ on the back of his left hand, AJohn@ on his left leg, and AJF@ on his left forearm. He has worked at the Tampa Electric Company power plant as a technician. Feiga is 38, 5'10" and 183 pounds. (See Shows #522 and #527, OADs 12/19/99 and 1/30/99)



**Unknown (Murder or Accidental Death)** -- The world-famous Vidocq Society is named in honor of Eugene Francois Vidocq, a fascinating 18th century French detective who was a confidante of writers Victor Hugo and Honore Balzac. Headquartered in Philadelphia, the Vidocq Society has 82 members -- one member permitted for each year that Vidocq lived. Members come from 17 US states and 11 countries. They take on the toughest cases - and crack them. Now AMW has joined forces with Vidocq to help solve a cruel and troubling mystery. It's a case that began on February 24, 1957 -- a bitter cold Philadelphia morning. In a desolate and rural area there was an unofficial dump - a place where anyone and everyone left the detritus of their lives. Most mornings it was household garbage or rusty car parts. On this morning, it was The Boy in the Box. One of the first detectives on the scene was Detective Sam Weinstein. All these years later, he's still haunted by the vision of the tiny, malnourished boy. His nude body had been wrapped in an Indian blanket and placed in a cardboard box. In an effort to find his identity, detectives tenderly dressed the tiny boy in a typical outfit and photographed him, hoping the simulation of life might help someone recognize him. The entire city of Philadelphia was touched by the boy's plight, but no one ever came forward to identify him. The boy's death could have been accident...or murder. Only the perpetrator can know for sure. To this day, his identity and his cause of death remain a complete mystery. Here are the primary clues: His age can only be guessed at - he had a full set of baby teeth and may have been 3 - 6 years old. His heritage was most likely north western European or Scandinavian. He had never been inoculated with any of the vaccinations most children his age received. He had been circumcised and had scars in the groin and ankle area that were indicative of some type of transfusion or other medical treatment. The boy was badly malnourished and his body was covered in bruises. He had marks around his head -- as though a strong adult may have pressed in his forehead. One of his hands looked as though it had been soaking in water. Forensic technicians call the wrinkling the 'washer woman' effect. Though he was nude, he seemed quite clean, as though he'd just been bathed. His nails were cut very close. His hair too had been recently cut quite short. Each meager clue was carefully followed. The Indian-pattern blanket in which he was wrapped had been manufactured in North Carolina. It was a fairly typical and common blanket for the time. The cardboard box in which he was found had held a bassinet from J.C. Penney. Many detectives speculate that whoever abandoned the boy at the dump, found the box there. They feel it's unlikely that the box was brought to the dump with the body. So why wasn't the boy buried, or hidden more effectively? Some Vidocq members believe that the trash dump area held some symbolism for whomever left the boy there. It's possible that the dump was a staging area - the perpetrator wanted the boy to be found, but didn't want the boy to be identified. Was it a stranger or his own parents who left him there? Some Vidocq members believe it was his own parents. They speculate that the boy was a 'problem' for the family from



the start. His body indicates ongoing health problems - either through natural illness or as a result of abuse. This theory operates on the basis that the extremely short hair and nails may have been some sort of punishment. Maybe that punishment went too far and a strong hand holding the boy by the head literally squeezed the life out of the him - that theory explains the contusions on his forehead, but what about the washerwoman effect on his hand? Was the boy washed after death? A sort of burial preparation? Or did he die in water? One theory: as a cruel punishment, someone forced the boy to sit in a bathtub far too long. On a cold February night, a skinny toddler could quickly die of exposure in cool water. Because the possibility of a connection to the parents seems so strong, Vidocq member, Frank Bender created a bust of how the boy's father may have looked. Bender is the forensic sculptor behind the bust of John List - the infamous killer from New Jersey who took the lives of his entire family. The bust is based on the facial features of the boy and drawn from Frank's decades of experience and well-honed instinct. It's a shot in the dark, but maybe after all these years someone will recognize this man. If the boy's identity is learned he will at least have a name on his headstone and maybe the mystery of his death will be solved. On November 4, 1998 the Philadelphia police exhumed the boy=s body from Potter=s Field to obtain a DNA sample. Police say the boy=s DNA will be compared to the DNA of any suspects who are identified in the future. The boy=s DNA may also be compared to possible family members of the boy. The boy was reinterred on Veterans= Day, November 11, 1998 at the Ivy Hill Cemetery. (See Shows #514 and #525, OADs 10/3/98 and 1/16/99)

**Pedro Santa-Ana** (Attempted Murder) B Coral Gables, Florida police say Pedro Santa-Ana and his live-in girlfriend have had a rough relationship over the few years they lived together. In early 1999, his girlfriend successfully filed for a restraining order against him due to previous violent domestic incidents. He reportedly violated the order and was scheduled to appear in court on charges of aggravated stalking and occupied burglary on March 11, 1999. That morning, Santa-Ana drove to his girlfriend=s place of work at Hammock Oaks on 105<sup>th</sup> Street and Cutler Road in Coral Gables. She was working the guard shack. Santa-Ana slit her throat and told her he would never go back to jail. He fled, leaving her for dead. A citizen coming through the guard gate found her and took her to a nearby fire station. Once there the citizen noticed Pedro Santa-Ana had followed him to the fire station. Fire personnel came out to help, and Santa-Ana fled. The victim was rescued and survived. Santa-Ana has used the Alias Robert Garcia, and false birthdate 9/18/58. He has a scar on his abdomen. Santa-Ana is a chain smoker and has served time for selling drugs and cooperating in a murder. He was born in Cuba, has a resident alien card, and is fluent in both English and Spanish. He has worked as a boat captain. He may be driving an older model Ford F0250 pickup truck. Santa-Ana is 39, 6'0" and 230 pounds.

**Juarez Serial Killers** B Investigators are seeking information in the case of almost 200 women who have either disappeared or been found dead in the Mexican border town of Juarez, just south of El Paso, Texas. The women were raped, strangled, and sometimes stabbed. Police believe the mastermind behind the murders is Abdul Latif Sharif, an Egyptian chemist who is currently serving a 30-year sentence for the assault and rape of a Juarez woman. Police believe Sharif paid others to kill women while he was in jail in order to indemnify himself. Recently, police arrested a group of bus drivers, including Guardado ADracula@ Marquez and Victor AEI Narco@ Moreno Rivera, whom they believe acted under Sharif=s guidance. According to testimony, the bus driver would wait until he had one last female passenger on the bus, then he would drive off into the desert where he would rape and kill her. Rivera initially confessed to helping Marquez commit the crimes, but later recanted. Nevertheless, police believe still others are involved in the killings and are seeking information in the case. The victims have been raped and tortured; sometimes they are strangled with their own belts or shoelaces. Some of the victims had bite marks on their left breasts. The killer(s) removed the left shoe of some victims. All the victims were buried in shallow graves. (See Show #526, OAD 1/23/99)

**Unknown (Murder)**

**Marcelo Eduardo Cabrera** (Wanted for Questioning) -- On December 3, 1997 four bodies were found in a warehouse in the small rural town of Bartow in Florida, near Tampa. The victims were 69-year-old George Gonsalves (one of three owners), 35-year-old Frank Dosso (employee and son of Phil Dosso, another owner), 26-year-old George Patisso (employee and son-in-law of Phil Dosso) and 26-year-old Diane Patisso, Asst. Prosecutor in Polk County, daughter of Phil Dosso and George Patisso=s wife. FDLE Special Agent Tommy Ray says all four were shot execution style. He believes the murders were a professional hit based on evidence found at the scene and information developed from the investigation. The warehouse housed two companies, Erie Manufacturing/Garment Conveyor Systems, that manufactured metal racks used in dry cleaning businesses and department stores. The three partners were George Gonsalves (one of the victims), Phil Dosso (father of 2 victims and father-in-law to one victim) and Nelson Serrano. On June 3, 1997 Phil and George voted to demote Nelson and strip him of his powers. That vote angered Nelson. He filed a civil lawsuit and created a competing business across town, American Slick Rail. Inc. A task force comprised of Bartow Police, Lakeland Police, FBI, Tenth Judicial Circuit State Attorney=s Office and the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) is investigating this quadruple homicide. Detectives believe there are 2-3 suspects. The suspect is believed to have been the lookout for the team. The suspect is well dressed, possibly from South America, and should be considered armed and

dangerous. He is probably a professional hit man, part of a team. Police would also like to question Cabrera since he worked for Nelson Serrano. Cabrera, who has used the aliases Marcelo Eduardo Cabrera-Vegas, was born in Ecuador but entered the US illegally in 1989. A deportation warrant has been filed against him. Cabrera is 34, 5'9" and 140 pounds. Following last week=s broadcast called the AMW tip line and gave his exact address. Authorities picked him up the next day. (See Shows #530 and #568, OADs 2/20/99 and 12/14/99)

**Randolph Allan Biernat (Sex Charges)** -- in 1994, Randolph Biernat plead guilty to First Degree Criminal Sexual Conduct for the ongoing sexual relationship he had with his stepdaughter, AJenny@. According to authorities in Wayne county, Michigan, the abuse began when AJenny@ was only six years old and the abuse continued until she was sixteen. When AJenny@ was thirteen years old she actually confided in a cousin about the abuse. Eventually school officials found out and social service workers were called into the school and met with the girl. However, according to the victim, Biernat threatened he would kill himself and therefore the victim=s mother would blame her. AJenny@ was so scared she told investigators she had lied about the whole thing. According to police, the abuse continued for three more years until AJenny@ was sixteen. At that point she moved out of the house and moved in with a friend. Again social service workers and school officials met with AJenny@ but the abuse was hard to prove. It wasn=t until AJenny@ was nineteen, three years after she moved out of the house, that charges were brought against Biernat. AJenny=s@ younger brother had found a videotape that Biernat had made which showed him sexually abusing his stepdaughter. A search warrant was executed and cops found more videotapes as well as a book on father/daughter incest. Biernat was arrested but he was able to post bail. Eventually Biernat plead guilty to the charges and he was scheduled to be sentenced on June 24, 1994, but he never appeared before the court. Instead he sent the judge a letter explaining he was mentally ill during thee abuse and that he has sought psychiatric help. He also explained that he was sorry for abusing AJenny@ and that he would do any type of community service to stay out of jail. Then he disappeared. Following the broadcast, tipsters identified him as a boys= soccer coach in Canada, using the alias AJim Martin@, which he stole from the tombstone of a small boy. Using this identity, he obtained a driver=s license and Canadian passport. He became friendly with a couple who had young children, and tried to get close to the 8-year-old boy; however, when to the mother of to the family saw Biernat profiled on AMW she called to the tip line and authorities picked him up in Vancouver without incident. Biernat was sentenced to a minimum of 62 years. (See Shows #534 and #539, OADs 3/20/99 and 4/24/99)



**Alan Lee Echols (Murder)** -- Alan Echols is wanted for the murder of his best friend and coworker, Ron Nichols. Echols fell in love and had an affair with Ron=s wife Billie. Echols became so obsessed with Billie that he began plotting Ron=s murder to get him out of the picture. On October 12, 1990 Ron Nichols took Billie out to dinner at Bonanza and dancing at club 95. Echols was waiting at Club 95. When Ron went out to his car to retrieve Billie=s ulcer medication, Echols attacked him, stabbing him 61 times. Eight days later Echols was captured and confessed to the murder. He was found guilty of first-degree murder, which carries a mandatory life without parole sentence, but was then released on bond to await sentencing. He never showed up in court again. Echols was setting up house near Shreveport, Louisiana. Following the last AMW profile, a tipster identified Echols under his new name. However, Echols arrived in court without an attorney, and the proceedings were postponed for a month. Finally, Echols was sentenced to life without parole. *The following are the featured fugitives and others being sought by federal, state or local authorities. The Update (if any) gives current status, previous references, or related information.*

**Unknown (Robbery)** B Police are seeking information in the December 8, 1999 robbery of an Inglewood, California liquor store in which the store owner was shot and wounded. Two armed men, Basil Decatur and Damon Jackson, entered the liquor store about 7:30pm, intent on robbery. Witnesses say that Decatur pointed a gun at the store=s owner, Jeong Lee and ordered him to get down. As he was yelling, he simultaneously pulled the trigger of the gun, hitting and wounding Jeong in his upper body. A clerk in the store then pulled out a gun and fired back. The entire incident was caught on tape. Inglewood police were able to identify and arrest Decatur after they received a call that there was a shooting victim at a local hospital. They were also able to identify and arrest Jackson, who drove Decatur to the hospital. Both men are being held on charges of armed robbery and attempted murder. Police are still investigating the possibility that there were others involved in the crime.

**Miguel Angel Rangel (Murder)** B Miguel Rangel is wanted by the Garden Grove, California police department and the FBI for the July 27, 1998 murder of his live-in girlfriend, Marisela Bautista Sandoval. Rangel shot Sandoval in the back at close range while the couple=s six-year-old son watched. The shooting followed a domestic dispute. Rangel had a history of domestic abuse against Sandoval and had been convicted of spousal abuse before the murder. Rangel was in Garden Grove during the summer of 1999 obtaining duplicate copies of birth certificates for his three children. Police suspect that he is either smuggling children across the Mexican border or planning to abduct his kids. Rangel, who has used the alias Miguel Angel Rangel-Flores and the nickname AColorado Mike@, has several tattoos, including a female head on his upper right shoulder, ARangel@ on his left shoulder, and three Asian characters which translate as Afear no man@ on his right inner forearm. He occasionally grows a mustache or goatee, and sometimes bleaches the top of his head blond. He is an associate member of the Alley Guys street gang, and is a known drug dealer. He is a known womanizer who likes strippers. He may be working in construction. Rangel is reportedly violent and vengeful. Rangel is 25, 5'9" and 175 pounds.



**James William Kilgore (Possession of Explosives)** -- In the 1970's Kathleen Soliah and her boyfriend James Kilgore joined the Symbionese Liberation Army (SLA). The SLA was a terrorist group best known for kidnaping heiress Patricia Hearst, who later joined them. In May of 1974 six members of the SLA were killed during a shootout with the police during which the house in which they were hiding caught fire. Despite the fire, they refused to surrender. After the shootout, only three members of the group were left: William and Emily Harris, and Patricia Hearst. The group needed new members, and they were soon joined by Kathleen Soliah and James Kilgore. Soliah and Kilgore played a major role in the SLA's next wave of terror. In August 1975 three patrol cars blew up in San Francisco. In her memoir Patricia Hearst admits helping plant one of those bombs. The SLA then moved their campaign to Los Angeles. After a pipe bomb failed to detonate under a police cruiser parked outside a Sunset Strip Restaurant, the LAPD ordered an inspection of every patrol car in the city. Several bombs were found before they exploded. A month later, the FBI closed in on the SLA in San Francisco, capturing the Harrises and Hearst. However, Kathleen Soliah and James Kilgore eluded the authorities. Soliah was recently captured in Minnesota. Kilgore has been on the run for 25 years. There is a \$25,000 reward for information leading to his arrest and conviction. Kilgore is an accomplished athlete, skilled at basketball and golf. He has worked on a sports book. He has two children, but nothing is known about their mother. He has also worked as a house painter and a cook. Kilgore is 52, 5'10" and 175 pounds. **Alvaro Luna Jara (Murder, Possibly Detaining Missing Juvenile)**

**Shela Varo-Gomez (Wanted for Questioning)** B Alvaro Luna Jara is wanted by LAPD Northeast Division Homicide detectives for the murder of 12-year-old Steven Morales. On August 29, 1998 at approximately 7:15pm, Alvaro ALargo@ Jara drove his vehicle northbound onto Avenue 58 and began to shoot at rival gang members. Jara fired his handgun two to three times in a northeasterly direction. One of the rounds fired by Jara struck 12-year-old Steven Morales in the head, killing him. Jara may be traveling with his 15-year-old girlfriend Shela Varo-Gomez, who was last seen leaving her home in Highland Park, California, on September 2, 1998. A missing persons report has been filed by the family of Varo-Gomez, and they fear for her safety. Jara is believed to have family in the Mexican city of Layesca, Narayit. Jara has three dots tattooed on his left hand. He had a full head of hair at the time of the murder, but may have shaved his head. Jara is 20, 5'11" and 165 pounds. Varo-Gomez is 15, 5'6" and 130 pounds.

**Timothy Joe Mobly (Sexual Assault)** -- Federal and local authorities in Reno, Nevada are looking for Timothy Joe Mobly. He was facing life in prison after he admitted raping two women he met on the Internet. Mobly became the subject of a manhunt when he skipped bail and failed to appear at his sentencing hearing on April 30, 1999. Mobly alone pleaded guilty to a November 1998 sexual assault of a 24-year-old woman in Sparks, Nevada. Mobly and an accomplice, Aaron Matthew Cross, earlier pleaded guilty to a January 2, 1999 sexual assault on a second victim, a 17-year-old high school junior. On April 30, 1999 Cross was sentenced to two consecutive life terms in prison. Mobly is an internet fanatic who meets people through AInstant Messaging@. He has military training with the air force in military avionics. He has

worked as a manager at a department store and recently trained as a railroad conductor. He usually wears wire-rimmed glasses. Mobly may be camping out in the woods. He is 26, 6'0" and 170-180 pounds. (See Show #542, OAD 5/15/99)

**Serguie Tcharouchine** (Visa Fraud and Peonage) -- As a result of a two-year investigation, federal agents broke a sex slave ring in Chicago. The ring was allegedly operated by Alexander Mishulovich, a US citizen, and Serguie Tcharouchine, from Russia. The arrests were made on September 10, 1998 and the two were indicted in December 1998. Mishulovich is in federal custody, while Tcharouchine is an international fugitive. Agents believe he could be traveling between the US and Russia. The indictment charges Tcharouchine and his associates with luring young women from the Eastern European country of Latvia to Chicago. The women were promised jobs as dancers for an annual salary of \$60,000. The indictment alleges that the women were not told they would become nude dancers. Also, it alleges that the women were locked in an apartment, had no access to a phone and were beaten. The women were forced to dance nude at several Chicago night clubs and all their earnings went to Tcharouchine and Mishulovich. The victims, who became sex slaves, are free from their captors and fear for their lives. Tcharouchine wears his hair in a ponytail. Although he is reportedly very savvy, smooth and intelligent, he also has a bad temper and is very controlling. He knows Chicago well, and has worked there as a cab driver. Tcharouchine is 36, 5'9" and 160 pounds. (See Show #540, OAD 5/1/99)

**Eric Jovan Quesada** (Murder) B Quesada is wanted for the June 27, 1998 shooting death of 18-year-old Michael Newhouse and the wounding of three other teenagers. Michael and three friends were driving to a concert when Quesada and his friends, Herman Hernandez and another teenager, pulled up alongside them. Without warning, Quesada and his friends opened fire on Newhouse=s car, killing Michael, paralyzing one of the teenagers and wounding the other two. According to police, Michael and Quesada knew each other, but there was bad blood between them. According to reports, Quesada had recently made threats on Michael=s life. Police arrested Hernandez and the other teenager, but Quesada is still on the run. Quesada has several tattoos, including ASananto@ in Gothic lettering across his stomach, AQuesada@ across the upper part of his back; a castle on his lower back, other tattoos on the backs of both arms, and possibly AFuck the Police@ on his chest or back. He goes by the nickname ALittle Chicago@. I may have shaved his head and his goatee. Quesada is a member of the ALatin Kings@ street gang, dresses in baggy clothing, wears a lot of gold jewelry, has prior arrests for drugs and currently has an outstanding warrant for robbery in Killeen, Texas. He walks and talks with an attitude, and is always armed with a 9mm semiautomatic. Quesada is 20, 5'11" and 230-260 pounds.

**Ernesto Benitez Hernandez** (Homicide)

**Erica Arellano** (Wanted for Questioning) B The pair are wanted in connection with the

1999 death of their 13-month-old daughter, Maria Fernanda Hernandez. On September 18, 1999 Benitez and his girlfriend Arellano arrived at the University of Wisconsin hospital with their vomiting and dehydrated daughter maria. Because the baby also had numerous bruises on her face, doctors immediately suspected that the child had been beaten. Benitez and Arellano left a short note giving power of attorney over the baby to friends, then fled. The following day little Maria was declared brain dead. Cause of death was determined as three blows to the head with additional blunt force trauma. Benitez is charged with the homicide and Arellano is wanted for questioning. Benitez has numerous aliases, including Ricardo Lozano and Ricardo Lozano Martinez. He is of small stature, wears his hair parted in the middle, and may have a goatee. He may have a work permit issued under the Lozano alias. Hernandez is 29, 5'3" and 135 pounds. Arellano=s aliases include Erika Arellano-deBenitez, Carmen Nova, and Carmen Nova Lozano. She may also have a work permit under her Lozano alias. Arellano is 27, 5'1" and 105 pounds.

**Xiana Fairchild**

According to investigators with the Vallejo, California Police Department, seven-year-old Xiana Fairchild disappeared Thursday, December 9, 1999 while on her way to school. Xiana=s mother told police her boyfriend dropped her daughter off at a bus stop just three blocks from their home around 7:40am, but Xiana never made it to school that day. A week later, the boyfriend changed his story and said he couldn=t recall if he drove her to the bus stop or if she actually walked there on her own. Working with dogs, divers, volunteers and the FBI, Vallejo police have canvassed the area for Xiana. So far, they have received more than 200 leads in the case. On Wednesday, December 15, 1999 detectives released composites of two men witnesses say were seen near Xiana when she vanished. The first sighting was by a witness who may have seen Xiana at the corner of Georgia and Sonoma at 7:30am. The witness recalls seeing a man in a tan mid-size car in the area at the same time. He is described as a Hispanic male, late 20's or early 30's, unshaven with a mustache, wearing a red and white plaid shirt. The second sighting is by a witness who knows Xiana. That witness saw Xiana at the corner of Sonoma and Georgia between 9:30am and 10:00am. A white man in his 40's, about 5'11"-6'0" tall was nearby. He had long dirty blond hair pulled back in a pony tail. He had a mustache, a scar above his left eye and he wore a red and white plaid shirt and jeans. Police would like to speak with these two men. When last seen, Xiana was wearing a puffy purple jacket, a gray sweat shirt and sweat pants, and pierced earrings. Xiana has two front teeth missing.

**CAPTURED:**

**Ronald Thomas Fleming (Rape of a Child)** B The FBI and the Michigan State Police are looking for a fugitive who may be appearing in a theater near you. Ronald Thomas Fleming is an amateur writer, actor and producer who is also a child molester. Fleming had been getting away with his crimes for years until his wife accidentally came across pornographic photos of young boys in their home computer. Fleming denied the photos were his and explained that he inadvertently receives this type of photo over the Internet. His wife did not believe his story and decided to keep an eye on him. Eventually she found a diary that Fleming was keeping. In it he described his infatuation with a thirteen-year-old neighborhood boy. Fleming=s wife became concerned about her own eight-year-old son from a previous marriage. When she questioned the child he confirmed that Ron had molested him. Police arrested Fleming in August of 1997 and under questioning he confirmed the child=s story. Fleming also told police where they could find additional child pornography in his computer. Police felt that Ronald Fleming was extremely cooperative so they charged him with Rape of a Child and released him to await trial. But within days Fleming disappeared. Following the last broadcast, an AMW tipster said he recognized Fleming as AJohn Black@, a resident of Chicago. ABlack@ claimed to have amnesia, but the tipster realized that the daytime drama ADays Of Our Lives@ also had a character named John Black who had amnesia. When police arrived at ABlack=s@ apartment, they ID=d the man on his own computer through the AMW website. Fleming=s apartment overlooked a popular playground -- and he was working as assistant manager of a popular toy store. If convicted, Fleming may face a life sentence. (See Shows #551 and #568, OADs 7/24/99 and 12/4/99)

**Robert Bryant (Murder)** -- Bryant is wanted in connection with the deaths of five women in Baltimore. On Sunday, December 5, 1999 a dispatcher received a call at 7:32pm reporting a shooting. When authorities arrived at 3535 Elmley Avenue they found five women dead from gunshot wounds. Witnesses say four men fled the house where the shootings occurred and drove off in a gold Nissan Maxima. A car matching the description of the Maxima was later spotted at a nearby McDonalds. One of the men in the Maxima chased another individual into the McDonalds at gunpoint. An off-duty police officer in the McDonalds saw this activity and fired his weapon at the individual with the gun. The individual dropped his gun, ran back to the Maxima and fled the scene. Cops believe these men are the same suspects in the murders on Elmley. The men were later identified as Ismail Malik Wilson, his brother Tariq A. Malik, Tavon McCoy, and Robert Bryant. Wilson, Malik and McCoy have since been arrested, but Bryant was still at large. Last Thursday Bryant was captured in a house just six blocks from the murder scene. (See Show #569, OAD 12/11/99)

**Brian Joseph Evans** (Child Molestation) B Placerville Police in Northern California say Brian Evans is wanted for molesting a 12-year-old girl in Meriden, Connecticut. On July 7, 1999 detectives questioned Evans about molestation allegations regarding a young neighborhood girl. After the detectives left, Evans went to his father's house and told him that detectives were questioning him about writing bad checks in Connecticut. On July 8, 1999 around 8:00am, Evans was seen leaving his apartment with his three children in his Suzuki Samurai with California license plate 3HBE513. Evans' father received a letter postmarked Bakersfield, California which his son wrote on July 12, saying he was en route to San Diego. Later, Evans called friends saying he was heading to Connecticut and Virginia. One of those calls was traced to a pay phone in Salt Lake, Utah. A tipster's call led directly to 3-year-old Brett Evans in Greenville, South Carolina. Two days later Evans dropped off the two girls in Greenville; all three children are now safe with their mother. On August 31, 1999, a maid in a motel in Charlotte, North Carolina discovered Evans' body. He had committed suicide by drinking antifreeze. (See Show #553, OAD 8/14/99)
