The male suspect is considered armed and dangerous after officers are told that he may have a gun. A containment trap is set up with the assistance of a K-9 Unit. After an extensive search, the suspect is found hiding in scrub brush by Max (the dog) and is quickly taken into custody.

"UHAUL, WE HAUL" - Police assist on a call regarding a burglary in progress. A male witness describes how he spotted two suspects running from a business as he pulled up. "TRUCK STOP" -- Police follow a suspicious vehicle which may have been used in a string of armed robberies. "THE CHAIN MAN" -- Police assist on a call regarding a disturbance at a local gas station. A black male civilian accuses a disabled elderly man of selling counterfeit jewelry to unsuspecting customers. The elderly suspect admits to selling necklaces but denies selling one to his accuser's girlfriend. After a verbal warning, the man is released.
