The following are the featured fugitives and others being sought by federal, state or local authorities. The Update (if any) gives current status, previous references, or related information.

Wilda Ira Stokes (Escape) -- On the morning of January 1, 1999 Wilda Ira Stokes was involved in a fight with another inmate at the Coffee County Jail. Stokes suffered face and head injuries including a swollen right eye. Corrections officers took Stokes to the local hospital where officials there determined his injuries were not serious enough to warrant hospital confinement. At 6:30pm Stokes was transferred from the hospital back to the county jail. When the lone corrections officer parked the vehicle, Stokes, who was wearing a blue prison uniform, handcuffs and no shoes, escaped out of the vehicle. He fled for the densely wooded area directly behind the jail. The officer chased him but lost sight of Stokes at the wood line. Despite an exhaustive search by air and by foot with canines, deputies did not recover Stokes nor his handcuffs or prison uniform. There have been no confirmed sightings of Stokes. Stokes was serving a one year sentence for his conviction of sexual abuse of his daughter and was awaiting trial on a felony charge of sodomy of his 10-year-old son. Stokes is married with seven children. Deputies say Stokes' wife is not cooperating with officials, and all seven children have been placed in foster care. Stokes has used the aliases Ira Stokes and Wil Stokes. He is reportedly controlling and violent, and may have a bruise around his right eye. He has a birthmark on his right temple. Stokes is 41, 6'2" and 200 pounds.

Joseph Daniel Bocklett (Rape of a juvenile) -- Bocklett is wanted by the La Mesa Police Department for the sexual molestation of his four-year-old stepdaughter in February of 1995. Police say that while his wife was at work, Bocklett was sexually molesting her daughter. The brave little girl finally got up enough courage to tell her mother the horrible truth. Bocklett's wife called police and Bocklett took off and hasn't been seen since. Authorities say Bocklett has been in prison before, and if he is caught and convicted, he may be going away from a very long time thanks to the "Three Strikes" rule. Bocklett has thinning hair, but may have shaved his head and may wear a mustache. He has a dime-sized tattoo of his initials on his upper biceps, but police believe he may be trying to fill it in so it looks like a large dot of ink. He may speak German, Polish and Russian. He enjoys spending time outdoors, and may live or work near children. He enjoys beading and jewelry work. He has pen pals around the world, including the

United States. He likes to play cards and board games. He may wear silicon inserts in his shoes to correct an arch problem. He may take medication or seek medical help for a heart flutter. He lived with a Cherokee Indian tribe, and may hang out with Native Americans. Although a Russian Jew, he claims to be part Cherokee himself. He taught a computer class in prison, and has also worked as a truck driver, social worker, counselor and security guard. Bocklett is 54, 6'0" and 210 pounds.

Elaine Antoinette Parent (Passport Fraud) -- Elaine Parent is wanted by the State Department for Passport Fraud and has been named a "Vital Link In A Murder Investigation" in a 1990 homicide in St. Lucie County, Florida. On July 19, 1990 the mutilated remains of 34-year-old Beverly McGowen were found in a rural canal in St. Lucie County, Florida. Deputies say a short time before she died, Beverly told her family and friends that she had a new roommate by the name of "Alice", who police believe was actually Elaine Parent. On June 16, 1990 Beverly wrote a "goodbye" letter to her brother, telling him she was going away. Her brother knew something was wrong and canceled Beverly's credit cards, hoping it would force her to call him. Deputies say she never did and her body was found a few days later. On July 23, 1990 a woman tried to use Beverly McGowen's credit card to rent a car at London's Heathrow airport. But since the card had been canceled the mystery woman, whom police believe was Parent, ended up paying cash. The canceled card raised suspicions and when Scotland Yard was informed the Beverly's gruesome murder, they intensified their manhunt. Three days later Parent called Avis and tried to extend the rental. British authorities say Parent told them she was near Cornwall, but in reality she was near Heathrow airport, where she abandoned the car. Police boarded every U.S.-bound aircraft looking for Parent but to no avail. Authorities say Parent eventually made her way back to the United States and in May of 1991 was found sleeping in her car. At the time she was using the name Charlotte Cowan. There was a warrant for Failure to Return the Leased Vehicle. Parent was arrested but was able to post bond just a few days later and hasn't been seen since. Parent's countless aliases include Charlotte Rae Cowan, Sylvia Ann Hodgekinson, Ann Tremont, Beverly McGowen, Elaine Haviland, Alex Hart, Alexis Marshal Hart, Antonia Hamilton Russell, Victoria Dark and Bret Tremont. Police describe her as a chameleon who often dyes her hair different colors. She has a "lazy" right eyelid, and may adopt a British accent, though she was born in New York City. She loves the good life and is a gourmet cook. She supports environmental issues, and loves animals though she may be allergic to cats. She has asthma and has been known to use the medication Ventolin. She travels all over the world but always seems to return to Florida. She has worked as a real estate agent and in the telecommunications field. Parent is 56, 5'7" and 125-145 pounds. (See Show #531, OAD 2/27/99)

Steven David Greene (Criminal Impersonation, Forgery, Theft) -- Police say Steven

David Greene stole the identity of a former roommate in Loveland, Colorado. Between November 1996 and April 1997 Greene cashed his roommate's checks and stocks, charged on his credit cards, and opened new charge accounts in the roommate's name. Police say the scam netted Greene more than \$30,000 in cash and merchandise. Greene has multiple aliases, including David Greene, David Moore, Steven David Moore, David Goldberg, Michael Pollat, David Jay Nathaniel, and Steven David Jay Nathaniel. He can create driver's licenses in any name using a computer. He probably has a beard, and has a small scar on his nose. He has prior arrests for burglary, theft, embezzlement, forgery and credit card fraud. He has variously claimed to have been a helicopter pilot in Vietnam, to have witnessed a Mafia-style murder in New York, and to be in the FBI witness protection program. He is articulate and easy to talk to. Green is 43, 5'10" and 200 pounds.

Forty-two-year-old Carole Sund has been missing since February 16, 1999, along with her 15-year-old daughter, Juliana Sund, and 16-year-old Silvina Pelosso, an exchange student. The Sacramento FBI says that Carole Sund, Juliana Sund and Silvina Pelosso were traveling together. The trio left the San Francisco area on February 12 and planned to go to the University of the Pacific in Stockton, California. Then, authorities say, the three women were going to Yosemite National Park to sightsee. The FBI says the trio was supposed to return to San Francisco and meet Carole's husband Jens at the airport on February 16. They were planning to fly to Arizona to visit the Grand Canyon. The three women never met up with the rest of their group and were

reported missing one day later. The women were last seen in the Yosemite area on February 15 and were driving a red Pontiac Grand Prix rental car with California license plates 4BMV025. Carole Sund's wallet was found in Modesto, California on February 19. There is a \$250,000 reward offered for information leading to the trio's safe return. Carole Sund has a dark birthmark on her right hand. Juliana Sund is a cheerleader, dancer and swimmer who plays the violin and piano. Silvina Pelosso is from Argentina. She is described as adventurous and intelligent, and likes to roller skate, ice skate and water-ski.

Rachel Newhouse

Age: 20

Height: 5'6"

According to detectives with the San Luis Obispo Police Department, 20-year-old Rachel Newhouse disappeared on Thursday, November 12, 1998. Police say Rachel was last seen around midnight during a fraternity party at "Tortilla Flats" restaurant, located about three miles from campus. Rachel is a junior studying nutrition at California Polytechnic State University. Detectives say Rachel had been drinking that evening, but no one saw her leave the restaurant. She never returned home. The next day Rachel's roommate reported her missing when Rachel never showed up for work at 5:00pm. Rachel also missed her morning classes. The FBI and the San Luis Obispo Police Department are investigating more than one thousand leads in the case. They are currently testing blood found on a bridge near Rachel's apartment the same day she was reported missing. The bridge is located along one possible route Rachel could have taken if she decided to walk home from the restaurant that evening. A \$110,000 reward is being offered for her safe return. Rachel has shoulder-length light brown hair. When last seen, she was wearing black pants, a blue button-front blouse and black platform shoes. (See Show #522, OAD 12/19/98)

Kristin Smart

Age: 22 Height: 6'1"

On May 25, 1996, 19-year-old Kristin Smart disappeared under very mysterious circumstances from the campus of California Polytechnic in San Luis Obispo. While her body has never been found, sadly, her family can only assume that she was murdered. In fact, the Smarts believe they know the identity of Kristin's killer - yet they cannot find justice. On May 24, 1996, Kristin and her friends attended a party in the quiet suburb of San Louis Obispo, where Kristin was a

freshman at California Polytechnic. There, according to partygoers, she met fellow student, Paul Flores. Kristin had reportedly been drinking, and at about 1:30 a.m., one of her female friends offered to accompany her on the short walk back to the dorms. Flores, witnesses say, joined them as they were leaving. As they arrived at the dorms, Kristin's friend split off from the other two, as her dorm was in the opposite direction. She says she was assured by Flores that he would get Kristin home safely. But Kristin never made it home. Despite a search by authorities and an enormous effort by Kristin's own family, police still haven't uncovered enough information to name a suspect. However, they say, all leads point to the man who saw her last - Paul Flores. Flores was reportedly seen with bruises on his face the next day, including a mild black eye. When questioned by police, they report that he provided inconsistent statements, and then suddenly refused to cooperate, communicating only through his lawyer. Weeks after Kristin disappeared, Flores reportedly dropped out of school and moved off campus. Then came, police say, the most damning piece of evidence yet - cadaver-sniffing dogs were brought on campus to inspect mattresses throughout the school. Handlers claimed that the only one they were in the least drawn to was the one used by Paul Flores. But that was a full month after Kristin disappeared, and when a search warrant was served on his parents' home, no evidence was found. Flores remains a free man. Despite the fact that police are convinced that he either did something or knows something, their hands are tied. Meanwhile, the Smart family suffers one unbearable day after another, unsure that they will ever know the full story of what happened to their daughter. CAPTURED:

Carl Cooper (Murder) -- On the evening of July 6, 1997, three employees were closing the Starbucks coffee shop in the trendy Georgetown district of Washington DC. Caity Mahoney, 24, was an active volunteer with several community groups. Michael Evans, 25, was working at Starbucks along with two other jobs, just to save for college. And Aaron Goodrich, 18, was on summer break from high school. The next morning they were all found dead in the back of the store. At 9:00 p.m., a passerby knocked on the door and was waved away by the three workers. At 9:15 a couple walking past saw them cleaning the store. At 9:30, a patron came in through the unlocked front door, looked around, and when he saw no one was there, left. From these reports, police say the murders happened between 9:15 and 9:30 p.m. Police who responded to the scene the next morning - after an employee discovered the bodies - were sickened by the number of bullets used to kill the three. It was overkill, they said, and very bloody. Police speculate that there were at least two gunmen. Since there was no sign of forced entry, investigators believe they may have known one of the employees. The safe was left untouched,

which suggests that the killers panicked after finding that their robbery plan wasn't going to pay off. Starbucks is offering a \$110,000 reward for information leading to the capture of the killer. In the meantime, the CEO of Starbucks personally reopened the store, and the corporation has decided to pledge all proceeds from that store to charity, in honor of the victims. An AMW viewer tip led authorities to a house in Washington, DC, where they arrested Carl Cooper, who has confessed to the crime. Authorities are still seeking his accomplice(s). Ronald Gould (attempted murder) -- A man arrested after a routine traffic stop in Idaho Falls, Idaho because he had no driver's license identified himself as George Samuels. The arresting officer found a stash of narcotics and a large amount of cash on "Samuels". "Samuels" was booked and fingerprinted. A year after the incident, an AMW tipster informed authorities that Gould had been in prison in the Idaho Falls area, using an alias. However, by the time the tip came in and Gould's identity was confirmed, he had long been released. But...Gould was still in Idaho Falls, at the same job he had when he'd been arrested, and still using the Samuels alias. On February 1, 1999 authorities arrested him at work. Gould, an electronic technician, loved horror/slasher films, became obsessed with a co-worker. When she became involved in another relationship, he broke into their apartment and tried to stab both her and her boyfriend with a knife. (See Show #338, OAD 10/29/94)

HEROES:

Five years ago, AMW presented Lt. Lloyd Prescott of the Salt Lake County Sheriffs Department with a special award for his courage during a hostage situation. On 3/5/94, Clifford Draper entered a Salt Lake City library, holding a group of hostages at gunpoint. Having previously served in the Navy, Draper claimed the military had caused his mental instability and demanded that the government compensate him for his suffering. He had wired himself to a bomb and threatened to kill the hostages if his demands were not met. Off-duty at the time, Prescott voluntarily joined the hostage group without revealing his identity. When it reached the point that Draper started to choose his first victim, Prescott risked his life, ordering the other hostages to take cover as he faced Prescott. Using the element of surprise, Prescott was able to shoot Draper, who was fatally wounded. Named Officer of the Year for his bravery, Draper also received an award from President Clinton. The following are the featured fugitives and others being sought by federal, state or local authorities. The Update (if any) gives current status, previous references, or related information.

Roger D. Yeadon (Escape, Murder) -- on February 8, 1999 Roger Yeadon and two other inmates escaped from the San Miguel County jail in Las Vegas, New Mexico. The other escapees were quickly captured but Yeadon eluded the massive manhunt. Yeadon is a career criminal with a history of escapes. The San Miguel breakout was his fourth escape from a jail or prison facility. On May 21, 1996 Yeadon and fellow inmate Michael Thompson escaped from a Dekalb county deputy sheriff as they were being transported. Later that month, Yeadon and his accomplice carjacked and murdered British military officer David James Nichols in Villanueva, New Mexico. Yeadon and Thompson were later captured in Terre Haute, Indiana and extradited back to New Mexico. On January 8, 1999 Yeadon was sentenced to eighteen years in prison for the murder and carjacking. A month later he escaped. Yeadon drinks beer, smokes cigarettes, and uses marijuana, methamphetamine and crack cocaine. He has a ninth grade education, and has worked construction and as an auto mechanic. Yeadon is 26, 6'1" and 185 pounds.

Unknown (Murder) -- After responding to a vehicle fire at approximately 4:30am on December 23, 1998, firefighters found the charred body of David Stevens in the passenger seat of his car. It was soon determined by investigators that Stevens was not burned to death, but had in fact been shot in the head two times. Police have not recovered the bullets or the murder weapon. Between 9:00am and 9:30am on December 22, Stevens called his boss to say he was leaving work for the day. Police believe he went home after leaving work because his briefcase was found in his apartment. Police also found two wine glasses in the bedroom of Stevens' apartment, one with lipstick on it. Police say evidence shows that Stevens had sex sometime around this time period and one long black hair was found. Police have speculated that the hair may have been strategically placed to lead investigators to believe a woman was with Stevens. Stevens was not known to be involved in drugs or alcohol, and had no enemies. Stevens was a fitness freak and participated in body building competitions. He completed a personal profile for "Perfect Match" dating service where he worked just days before his murder.

Unknown (2 Suspects) (Armed Robbery) -- According to the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department, a slot machine vendor was robbed on December 28, 1997 by two unknown suspects. Police say a short time after midnight, two female workers and a security guard were taking a break outside. Two suspects approached them and demanded access to the building. One of the female workers let the suspects in, while Suspect #1 held a shotgun on the security guard. As the suspects and hostages were moving through the building, the security guard grabbed the shotgun and a struggle ensued. One of the females tried to help him, but was pushed away. The female workers opened the door to the vault area. Detectives say Suspect #2 dragged the security guard into the vault and bound his hands and feet. As Suspect #1 watched over the security guard, Suspect #2 went to get the cash with the two female workers. Detectives say the suspects were seen leaving, dragging two duffle bags filled with hundreds and twenties. Police say they took off in a small truck with a camper shell. The race of the suspects is unknown, but police think Suspect #2 is probably a man. The suspects wore masks, coveralls of some kind and carried a handgun and either a rifle or shotgun. Suspect #1, who carried the shotgun, is described as skinny, did not speak during the robbery, and "walked like a woman". Suspect #2 "walked like a farmer" and is heavy-set. (See Show #513, OAD 9/26/98)

Larry Dean Castaneda (murder) -- This severely troubled repeat offender murdered his father in Sacramento in 1990. The father had let Larry hide in his house for a number of months following a parole violation. Known by the nickname "Mad Dog" due to his paranoid personality and violent temper, he is described as a "walking pharmacy" because he takes pills for epilepsy and depression, and uses cocaine and marijuana. He has twelve tattoos, including a beast on his back, a rattlesnake on his right biceps and lightening bolts on his forearms. He probably maintains an unkempt look with a full beard. He has dark hair and eyes, is 48, 5'8" and 180 pounds. (See Shows #220 and #420, OADs 7/3/92 and 8/3/96) No suggested changes.

Unknown (Murder) -- Police are looking for the unknown killer of Amy Watkins, who was murdered on March 8, 1999 in the Prospect Heights area of Brooklyn, New York. 26-year-old Amy was attacked as she was walking home from the subway Monday night. The killer stabbed Amy in the back with a kitchen knife and took off with her bag. Amy's bag, without her wallet, was later found a few blocks away. Amy was rushed to the hospital, where she was later pronounced dead. Police are asking for the public's assistance with any information regarding this crime.

March 3, 1998, the USMS-Portland issued a parole violation warrant on **Mark Johnson**. He is also wanted for questioning in the homicide of 15-year-old Heather Fraser, whose body was discovered on February 24, 1998 by a man walking his dog along the Columbia River. Johnson uses fake schemes to lure young females, such as petitions for lowering the drinking age and festivals filled with young girls. Johnson has used the aliases William Anthony and Stan Johnson. Although not a registered sex offender, Johnson has been known to provide drugs or drug young females and engage in sex while the victims are unconscious. An alert viewer called in barely ten minutes after the piece was aired, locating Johnson in central Florida. Johnson was picked up in Kissimmee -- in the bathroom of his home. (See Show #530, OAD 2/20/99)

Carl Cooper (Murder) -- On the evening of July 6, 1997, three employees were closing the Starbucks coffee shop in the trendy Georgetown district of Washington DC. Caity Mahoney, 24, was an active volunteer with several community groups. Michael Evans, 25, was working at Starbucks along with two other jobs, just to save for college. And Aaron Goodrich, 18, was on summer break from high school. The next morning they were all found dead in the back of the store. At 9:00 p.m., a passerby knocked on the door and was waved away by the three workers. At 9:15 a couple walking past saw them cleaning the store. At 9:30, a patron came in through the unlocked front door, looked around, and when he saw no one was there, left. From these reports, police say the murders happened between 9:15 and 9:30 p.m. Police who responded to the scene the next morning - after an employee discovered the bodies - were sickened by the number of bullets used to kill the three. It was overkill, they said, and very bloody. Police speculate that there were at least two gunmen. Since there was no sign of forced entry, investigators believe they may have known one of the employees. The safe was left untouched, which suggests that the killers panicked after finding that their robbery plan wasn't going to pay off. Starbucks is offering a \$110,000 reward for information leading to the capture of the killer. In the meantime, the CEO of Starbucks personally reopened the store, and the corporation has decided to pledge all proceeds from that store to charity, in honor of the victims. An AMW viewer tip led authorities to a house in Washington, DC, where they arrested Carl Cooper, who has confessed to the crime. Authorities are still seeking his accomplice(s). Christopher Daniel Burgess (child abuse, murder) -- On Christmas Eve, Burgess was babysitting his girlfriend's 19-month-old daughter. Burgess became enraged after the child had a potty training accident. Police say he slammed the child's head against a wall so hard he knocked a hole in the wall; then he threw the girl down a flight of stairs; then he hit her in the head with a large metal spoon. When he had finished his brutal assault, he calmly bathed the child and put her to bed as if nothing was wrong. By the time relatives returned home, the child was dead. Burgess disappeared as paramedics arrived. Tips to the AMW hotline led to his capture. Burgess has been sentenced to twenty-five years to life for the crime. Hazel Leota Head (Murder, Arson) -- Hazel Leota Head is wanted for the murder of Charles Barker on September 2, 1998 in Benton, Louisiana. Barker was shot in the back of the head as he sat at his trailer counter. Police found a murder weapon and say physical evidence points to Hazel Head. Hazel had met Barker at a local casino under the name Deianna Ray. She subsequently moved in with him. When Barker's body was found, his cash and his car were gone. Upon further investigation, police found that there was an outstanding warrant for Hazel's arrest in Nebraska, where she is accused of burning down a boyfriend's trailer. Police also learned that Hazel has a history of moving around. She has been married multiple times, to as many as ten different men. She has lived all across the country. Head has many aliases, including Hazel Morgan, Willow Shields, Hazel Foley, Kelly Morgan, Hazel Spurbeck, Hazel Haynes, Hazel Vincent, Deianna Ray, Hazel Woodman, Hazel Fautch, Treasa "Tess" Jean Coyle, and Treasa "Tess" Venable. She has a noticeable gap between her front teeth. She is a smoker and drinker, favoring vodka. She often works as a waitress, and hangs out at truck stops, often traveling with truckers. She frequents casinos and places personal ads looking for men. A truck driver believes the woman he picked up in Madisonville, Kentucky and drove to a truck stop in Woodhaven, Michigan was Head. The woman told the trucker she was trying to get to Las Vegas. Head is 49, 5'2" and 120 pounds. (See Shows #527 and #528, OADs 1/30/99 and 2/6/99)

Unknown (Murder, Robbery, Aggravated Assault) -- At 2 am on May 7, 1998, a man climbed to the second floor balcony of an apartment in Philadelphia's Center City and forced his way in through a sliding glass door. Inside the apartment 23-year-old Shannon Schieber was preparing a bath. Police believe she must have heard a noise, and left the bathroom to investigate. Wrapped in a towel she was utterly defenseless when she encountered the intruder. No one can be certain exactly how long Shannon's ordeal lasted. She was assaulted, raped and strangled. A neighbor heard Shannon's screams and called police. They arrived and knocked on the door, but tragically, when no one responded to their knock, they left. The next day, when Shannon didn't show up for a lunch date, her brother became concerned and went to her

apartment. He discovered his sister - her nude and battered body told the story of her painful struggle. The killer stole several items: 100 compact disks, a JanSport backpack, a silver necklace with a cubic zirconia pendant, A Canon Elph camera, and a hand-carved set of inkpens which Shannon's father had lovingly made for her. These could prove to be the killers' undoing. The Cannon Elph camera had serial #0357381. On February 22, 1999 police released a composite drawing of the man they believe murdered Shannon Schieber. According to police, the sketch was rendered with the help of a woman who was raped in City Center in August 1997. DNA tests completed in January 1999 linked the woman's attacker to a second rape that August and to Schieber's murder in May. Police say all three attacks occurred in the Fitler Square neighborhood of Philadelphia, within a ten-block radius. The suspect is approximately 25, 5'8"-5'10" with a thin build. Michael Willard Buttram (Murder, Burglary) -- Buttram is wanted by the Cobb County Police Department for a double homicide on March 8, 1999 in Mapleton, Georgia. On Monday the police received a frantic 911 call from 41-year-old Mildred Cantrell. When officers arrived at the scene they found Mildred and her pregnant 19-year-old daughter Tara Cantrell shot to death. The family automobile, a 1995 Acura Integra with Georgia license plate 63-JKZ, was missing, and witnesses told police that they had seen Tara's ex-boyfriend Michael Buttram speeding away from the crime scene in the missing car. Police say Buttram and Tara Cantrell met the year before when Tara, an exotic dancer, was the entertainment at Buttram's bachelor party. Buttram broke off his engagement and started dating Tara. After a while Tara decided she couldn't take Buttram's controlling ways, so she moved home to her parents' house. Buttram started stalking and intimidating Tara when she went on dates with other men. The harassment culminated on Monday, March 8, 1999. Buttram has "Tara" tattooed on his shoulder. He ran a home improvement center. Authorities consider him armed and dangerous. Buttram is 30, 6'1" and 190 pounds.

Rafael Resendez-Ramirez (Wanted for Questioning) -- Rafael Resendez-Ramirez is wanted for questioning in the 1998 murder of Dr. Claudia Benton in West University Place, Texas. Claudia Benton, a doctor with the Genetic Research Department at Baylor Medical Center, was home alone on December 16, 1998. Police say sometime that night or early the next morning someone broke into the house and sexually assaulted and stabbed Dr. Benton to death. When she didn't show up for work the next day her co-workers became concerned and called the authorities. West University Place police discovered Claudia's battered body in her bedroom. Her assailant took her red Jeep Cherokee which was later found in a parking lot in San Antonio, Texas. Fingerprints taken at the crime scene were later determined to be those of Rafael Resendez-Ramirez. Police would like to question him about the crime. Resendez-Ramirez has used many aliases, including Jose Reyes-Resendez, Angel Reyes, Jose R. Angel, Antonio Martinez, Carlos Rodriguez and Pedro Jaramillo. He has a one-inch scar on his left forearm, a half-inch scar on his forehead, and a small scar on his right ring finger. He has a faded tattoo of a

snake on his left forearm. He may be wearing glasses. Resendez-Ramirez is a drifter who gets around by "riding the rails". He has been arrested previously for trespassing on railroad property. Resendez-Ramirez is 38, 5'6" and 150 pounds.

Dennis Schley Lilly (Aggravated Assault of a Police Officer, Escape) -- Lilly is being sought for the December 13, 1986 escape from the Missouri State Penitentiary. He was serving fifteen years to life for shooting a police officer. In 1981 Lilly, along with seven other inmates, escaped from the Kansas State Penitentiary. After the break out, Lilly was holed up in a Bonner Springs, Kansas home. When a curious police officer approached the house, Lilly shot him four times with a high-powered rifle. Lilly was ultimately captured and sent to the Missouri State Penitentiary. After a few unsuccessful attempts at breaking out of the Missouri facility, Lilly got lucky. Officials say Lilly escaped by stealing a guard's uniform and walking out of the penitentiary during a shift change. Weeks after the escape, officials found out that Lilly was in Florida and then in Canada. Lilly's wife Mary and her daughter Rebecca were missing just after the escape and are presumed to be with Lilly. Mary's passport last placed her in Ireland. Lilly has "Slick" tattooed on his upper right arm. He is slender, with a receding hairline. He is articulate, polite and soft-spoken, a loner who likes to read. He trained at a trade school as a carpenter. He and Mary are rumored to have had a new baby in New York. Lilly is 51, 5'11" and 170 pounds.

Eric Robert Rudolph (Causing the Death of a Person, Use of an Explosive) -- It's hunting season in the Great Smokey Mountains and there's a price on the head of Eric Robert Rudolph. The FBI doesn't want anyone to shoot their most wanted man, but they are asking hunters to look for trash left behind by the accused abortion clinic bomber. Agents in Murphy, North Carolina put together a sampling of trash they say they've found abandoned by Rudolph. They're asking the thousands of hunters in the area to keep their eyes peeled for Rudolph clues. The woodsman has been burying his trash in an attempt to hide it, but it hasn't worked. Back in the summer, agents actually fingerprinted some of the trash they found and confirmed that it belonged to Rudolph. Inspired by the million-dollar reward, bounty hunters have descended on the area as well, but no one wants to see Rudolph behind bars more than Felicia Sanderson, a widow and mother of two. Her husband, Officer Robert "Sandy" Sanderson was killed by a bomb placed outside a women's clinic in Birmingham, Alabama - a bomb agents say was planted by Rudolph. It took guts, but Felicia traveled to the Smokey Mountains where her husband's killer is believed to be hiding out. She went there to lend her support to the hundreds of investigators working the case. She even used a local radio broadcast to send her plea to the community. Felicia knows that some groups sympathize with Rudolph on political grounds - that they say he was doing "God's work." In response, she doesn't mince words: "God didn't have anything to do with murdering Sandy. Eric Rudolph done that all by himself." Agents say that

Eric Robert Rudolph was seen on January 29, 1998, fleeing the scene of the bombing of the New Woman All Women Clinic in Birmingham, Alabama. Immediately after the bomb went off, witnesses saw a man wearing a wig running from the site. Three witnesses saw his truck pull away, and were able to provide a description and a license plate number. The truck was traced to Rudolph, but he had already made his escape. Agents say Rudolph's bomb was loaded with nails - a bomb designed not just to damage property, but to kill and maim. It did both: Birmingham Police Officer Robert "Sandy" Sanderson lost his life. Nurse Emily Lyons was severely injured by the homemade shrapnel - she lost her left eye, lost some of the sight in her right eye, and suffered several broken bones and burns. Despite speculation that Rudolph has been close to extremist groups, friends of Officer Sanderson can't view his death as part of a political action. Even though Sanderson was moonlighting as a security guard for a family planning clinic, they say he was outside of the abortion controversy - that he was just doing his job: enforcing the law. Rudolph is also wanted for questioning in a series of deadly Atlanta bombings: the 1996 Centennial Olympic Park bombing that killed one and injured more than one hundred others, an attack on an abortion clinic in January 1997 that injured seven, and a February 1997 attack on a gay nightclub. Authorities confirmed that they are investigating similarities in the construction of Rudolph's alleged bomb and the others. In particular, they're investigating a possible match between the nails in the Birmingham bomb and those in the Atlanta bombs. Rudolph has been described as a mysterious and reclusive man from the rugged mountains of North Carolina. Though agents believe it's likely that he's taken to the wilderness to hide, they're confident that the new \$1 million price on his head will make it hard for Rudolph to hide for long. Authorities also note similarities to Rudolph's known techniques in the bombing of an abortion clinic in Asheville, North Carolina on March 13, 1999. Rudolph, who has used the alias Bob Randolph, has worked as a carpenter and spent 18 months in the U. S. Army. He has a reputation for anti-government views. He is estranged from family. He is an experienced woodsman and completed army survival training. Rudolph is 32, 5'11" and 150 pounds. Enrique "Kike" Coropuna (Armed Robbery, Attempted Murder) -- Coropuna is one of the leaders of a South American gang believed to be responsible for several jewelry store robberies on the east coast committed in 1992. On June 6, 1992 Coropuna and another man entered the Ngoz-Long jewelry store in Arlington, Virginia where they handcuffed and pistol-whipped the store's employees. Police say the two men stole \$350,000 worth of jewelry and fled in a white American car with New Jersey plates. On July 23, 1992 Coropuna and two other men entered another Arlington jewelry store, Phnom-Penn Jewelers, handcuffed the employees and stole \$35,000 in jewelry. The incident was taped on an overhead surveillance camera. The two other men involved in the robbery were arrested and are now serving their sentences. On

November 11, 1992 Coropuna and a woman entered the Kornspan Jewelers in Linden, New Jersey. After asking to view a tray of jewelry, as many as three more men entered the store. The robbers began to handcuff the owners of the store to furniture and scoop jewelry into bags. According to police reports, when police officer Al Goncalvez arrived at the scene Coropuna fired one 9mm round at his chest. Goncalvez escaped serious injury because he was wearing a bulletproof vest. The five robbers fled and were picked up by a getaway driver in a white Oldsmobile. After a brief high-speed chase, the getaway car crashed into a parked vehicle and the suspects fled on foot. Three suspects were eventually arrested. Coropuna and another associate are still at large and have been charged with attempted murder, robbery, and weapons offenses. Coropuna is 38, 5'6" and 200 pounds. Glenwood Freeman (Murder) -- Police in Baltimore, Maryland are looking for Freeman after he was charged with the 1996 murder of his wife. On September 9, 1996 the body of Tina Marie Williams was found in her home in Baltimore County, Maryland. An autopsy done on her badly decomposed body showed that the cause of death was blunt force trauma. She had apparently been killed between September 20th and September 25th. Williams shared the home with her husband, Glenwood Freeman. Through interviews with family and friends, police learned that there had been several incidences of domestic violence between Williams and Freeman. Police collected enough evidence to charge Freeman with the murder. Shortly after the murder, friends observed Freeman driving Tina's car, which was later recovered in Long Island, New York. The most recent sighting of Williams was in November 1996 in Franklin, Virginia. Police believe he has traveled west to Seattle to be with his daughter. Freeman usually has a full beard, and keeps his hair short or shaved bald. He has small scars on his right wrist, and other scars on his right finger, right wrist and left arm. He has criminal records for drug offenses and battery, and frequents drug hang-outs. He is a sports enthusiast who likes to bet on college and pro games. He is known to take up with women who can support him. Authorities consider Freeman armed and dangerous, and he has vowed not to be taken alive. Freeman is 38, 5'11" and 140 pounds.

Jesus Antonio Tejada (Murder) -- Jesus Antonio Tejada is wanted by Dallas, Texas police for the murder of 2-year-old Joel Moses Hernandez. Police say on January 20, 1998 Jesus Tejada was babysitting Joel with his brother Juan Tejada, Joel's stepfather, when the two beat Joel to death. Joel was reported missing three days later by his mother, Gina Quinones. On January 24, 1998 Joel's body was found buried in a field outside of Dallas. Later witnesses place Jesus and Juan Tejada at the scene of the crime. Juan Tejada was arrested and is awaiting trial but Jesus Tejada is still on the run. Tejada is a heavy drinker. He sometimes wears a mustache. He has worked as a security guard and a parking lot attendant. Tejada is 30, 5'8" and

Kenneth Sorrell Williams (Armed Robbery, Conspiracy to Traffic Cocaine) -- Miami-Dade Police are engaged in a dangerous showdown with well-armed soldiers in a multi-gang drug war. It's a war with over 100 casualties; and too often innocent citizens are the victims. Investigators say most of the violence can be attributed to a ruthless gang which goes by the street name, The Boobie Boys. Doesn't sound like a bunch of tough guys, but police say the Boobies alone are responsible for at least 30 murders. So why the name? Boobie? The accused leader of the gang is Kenneth Sorrell Williams. By reputation, he's as mean as a Florida gator, but by nickname, he's Boobie. Boobie has been in serious trouble since he was a teenager. The accused drug lord with the laughable nickname first went to prison for a homicide case when he was still a juvenile. When Williams finished doing his time, he was a young man with a mission; detectives say he set up business making money any way he could - that usually meant drug ripoffs and burglaries. Boobie muscled in on other dealers' territory and methodically rose to the level of drug lord, showing no mercy along the way, say detectives. Boobie seized his authority through force and graphic violence: One crime scene was littered with 99 bullet casings. The gang's signature weapon were AK-47s - a firearm so deadly that the victim is literally pulverized. And when the Boobies were squeezing the trigger, police say everyone in sight was fair game. Five-year-old Michael Frasier was sitting on his mother's lap in her boyfriend's car when the police say the Boobies opened fire on the boyfriend. No one in the car survived. That ruthless style pushed Boobie's empire beyond Miami. DEA agents now say the Boobie Boys have business outlets through most major cities in Florida, into Georgia, through the Carolinas, into Virginia and as far north as Detroit. They believe he's establishing trade in Las Vegas. In February 1998, police were able to tie the Boobie Boys to actual murders and put together an iron-clad case. Now most gang members are either dead or in custody, but Kenneth 'Boobie' Williams and one of his chief hitmen, Leonard 'Bo' Brown are at large. Williams, who also goes by the nicknames "Black Boy" and "High-Tech", has used the aliases Keith Williams and Kevin Miller. He has scars on his stomach from gunshot wounds, and scars on his knees and lower right leg. He hangs out in strip clubs and frequently shows up at boxing matches in Las Vegas. He drives rental cars with dark-tinted windows, and changes cars often. Williams is 28, 5'8" and 165 pounds. (See Shows #513, #515, #516 and #524, OADs 9/26/98, 10/10/98, 10/31/98 and 1/9/99)

Collins, the overnight clerk at the Shell station in Orland Park, Illinois was alone in the station when a lone person entered the store, fired one shot at Collins and left. Collins died hours later. Police are unsure whether or not the shooting was a botched robbery, as no money was taken. Months after the shooting, Cook County Sheriff's Department received a phone call from a man named Bob Reynolds from Poole Trucking Company. He gave police details about the case that the police had not publicized. Suddenly, Reynolds hung up. Police do not consider him a suspect, but want to talk to him and find out everything he knows about the shooting. Shell has offered a \$20,000 reward leading to the arrest and conviction of the shooter. The suspect is probably right-handed. He may have a camouflage rain poncho with a hood, and may be driving a dark-colored van with a spare tire attached to the rear. Police believe he is probably right-handed and about 5'8".

Randolph Allan Biernat (Sex Charges) -- in 1994, Randolph Biernat plead guilty to First Degree Criminal Sexual Conduct for the ongoing sexual relationship he had with his stepdaughter, "Jenny". According to authorities in Wayne county, Michigan, the abuse began when "Jenny" was only six years old and the abuse continued until she was sixteen. When "Jenny" was thirteen years old she actually confided in a cousin about the abuse. Eventually school officials found out and social service workers were called into the school and met with the girl. However, according to the victim, Biernat threatened he would kill himself and therefore the victim's mother would blame her. "Jenny" was so scared she told investigators she had lied about the whole thing. According to police, the abuse continued for three more years until "Jenny" was sixteen. At that point she moved out of the house and moved in with a friend. Again social service workers and school officials met with "Jenny" but the abuse was hard to prove. It wasn't until "Jenny" was nineteen, three years after she moved out of the house, that charges were brought against Biernat. "Jenny's" younger brother had found a videotape that Biernat had made which showed him sexually abusing his stepdaughter. A search warrant was executed and cops found more videotapes as well as a book on father/daughter incest. Biernat was arrested but he was able to post bail. Eventually Biernat plead guilty to the charges and he was scheduled to be sentenced on June 24, 1994, but he never appeared before the court. Instead he sent the judge a letter explaining he was mentally ill during thee abuse and that he has sought psychiatric help. He also explained that he was sorry for abusing "Jenny" and that he would do any type of community service to stay out of jail. That is the last officials have heard from him. Biernat does not drink or smoke. He plays guitar and likes to draw, and he has coached high school girls' soccer. He was unemployed for many years, but has worked as a newspaper distributor and as a limousine service manager. He occasionally grows a beard. Biernat is 43, 5'10" and 195 pounds.

Forty-two-year-old Carole Sund has been missing since February 16, 1999, along with her 15-year-old daughter, Juliana Sund, and 16-year-old Silvina Pelosso, an exchange student. The Sacramento FBI says that Carole Sund, Juliana Sund and Silvina Pelosso were traveling together. The trio left the San Francisco area on February 12 and planned to go to the University of the Pacific in Stockton, California. Then, authorities say, the three women were going to Yosemite National Park to sightsee. The FBI says the trio was supposed to return to San Francisco and meet Carole's husband Jens at the airport on February 16. They were planning to fly to Arizona to visit the Grand Canyon. The three women never met up with the rest of their group and were reported missing one day later. The women were last seen in the Yosemite area on February 15 and were driving a red Pontiac Grand Prix rental car with California license plates 4BMV025. Carole Sund's wallet was found in Modesto, California on February 19. There is a \$300,000 reward offered. On Thursday, March 18 the women's burnt-out rental car was found at Longbarn, California, some two hours north of the park. CAPTURED:

Lena Dianne Townsend (Murder) -- Lena Townsend is wanted for the 1998 murder of 4-year-old Karina Rowen in Piston, Tennessee. Sheriff's deputies say that in the summer of 1998 Karina came to live with her grandfather Richard Townsend and his new wife Lena after the girl's mother asked for some help. Neighbors and relatives say Lena Townsend was mean and yelled at the little girl a lot. On August 21, 1998 Richard came home from work around 4:30pm. Deputies say Lena told him that Karina was taking a nap. According to authorities, Lena later told her husband that Karina was fed and in bed asleep. The next morning Richard awoke and found a note from Lena say that she went to WalMart. Richard checked on Karina and found her dead in her bed. Deputies say that she died from blunt trauma to the head. Lena reportedly took \$8,000 and a loaded pump shotgun. She left in a dark brown 1985 Lincoln town car with Tennessee tags. The car was later found in Conway, Arkansas. Inside was a receipt from a local Motel 6, empty camping gear boxes, hair dye and a bagful of hair remnants. An AMW tipster who had seen Townsend working at a Denny's restaurant in Scottsdale, Arizona alerted authorities. When the FBI raided the apartment where the tipster said Townsend was living, two young men who also worked at the restaurant were astonished to find that their coworker Myka, who shared their apartment with them, was Townsend. Mark Jay Allen (Armed Robbery, Escape, Carjacking) -- Mark Jay Allen was sitting in a Greenville, South Carolina jail cell on May 23, 1998, awaiting trial for the armed robbery of four

U.S. Post Offices. His surroundings weren't new - Allen had spent eleven years in prison for armed robbery in the state of Georgia, and had only been released in January 1997. Deputies with the U.S. Marshals Service say that he decided not to take his chances at the trial and jimmied his lock to make his escape. Deputies say that Allen didn't waste any time getting back on the job. At a car wash in Greenville, the suspect allegedly waited for a helpless victim to come along, and found her - a 56-year-old woman who suffered from a heart condition and carried oxygen bottles. Police say Allen took her hostage just past 9:00 p.m. As Allen drove, the victim says, she started to suffer chest pains, and told him she was about to have a heart attack. She was released, but claims Allen kept her money and her car. Less than two hours later, marshals say, Allen robbed a Waffle House in Jefferson, Georgia, about 50 miles away. The next day, deputies claim they made out his face in a surveillance video, robbing a supermarket in Georgia. It looks to officials like a crime spree is just getting underway. Deputies are especially concerned over a statement Allen allegedly made after he was captured and sent to the Greenville jail - that if he had been armed when he was arrested, he would have started shooting. A police officer stopped him for reckless driving through the parking lot of a hang glider port in San Diego, California. When the plate on the vehicle came back as stolen, Allen was arrested. However, Allen claimed to be an undercover US Marshall, and produced a realistic-looking ID. He told the arresting officer that he was on a manhunt...for himself. The suspicious officer ran the name Mark Jay Allen, and found that the suspect's description matched that of the ersatz US Marshall. Allen admitted his identity. Allen was flown back to North Carolina to stand trial. He was found guilty and sentenced to 77 years in prison. (See Shows #502 and #504, OADs 7/11/98 and 7/25/98)

An individual immediately appeared at the scene to aid the victim, by yelling out for someone to dial 911. Before help could arrive, the false bystander had gotten away with all the cash in a pick-up truck driven by the lone gunman.

The following are the featured fugitives and others being sought by federal, state or local authorities. The Update (if any) gives current status, previous references, or related information.

Unknown (2) (Murder) -- Agents and detectives in Atlanta are looking for at least two suspects in the 1998 murder of ATM courier William Hill. The shooting took place in broad daylight at the Roswell-Wieuca Shopping Center, a heavily populated strip-mall in the Buckhead area of Atlanta. On May 6, 1998 witnesses remember seeing a Ford pickup truck with a camper shell at the scene of the crime over an hour before the shooting. Witnesses noticed the inside of the camper shell was lined with pine straw, creating a tunnel. At 1:45pm, William Hill shows up at the South Trust ATM at the shopping center to refill the ATM. Without warning, Suspect #2 fired a single shot from either an AR-14 or a hunting rifle and hit Hill in the head, killing him instantly. Suspect #1 appeared, ordered witnesses to call 911, and then calmly picked up the money, climbed into the pickup truck and drove away. Minutes later, police found the pickup truck engulfed in flames. Police discovered the truck had been stolen back in January. Suspect #1 is described as clean-cut with a mustache and bushy hair, with muscular facial features and a slender build. He is approximately 40-50 years old. Suspect #2 is proficient with firearms, and may have some military background and tactical training. Detectives say he has a disciplined personality. There is no description available.

Alan William Golder (Kidnaping, Robbery, Burglary, Larceny) -- If you discovered Alan Golder in your house, you might think he had stepped out of the pages of GQ Magazine. In reality, he recently stepped out of prison, and officers hope he will be returning soon. After his feature aired on AMW, a man came forward who may be able to help - the suspect's own brother. Golder's younger brother came forward after seeing Golder's profile on AMW, a profile that filled him with concern. He says that Golder is a danger to himself and others because he simply can't stop committing crimes - he is a jewel addict, the brother claims. The only happy end to this story, the brother told AMW, would be if Golder turned himself in. Well-tanned and well-toned, Golder has made quite a name for himself, allegedly ripping off homes of the rich and famous while mixing comfortably with the rock stars and executives of the Sunset Strip crowd in Los Angeles. He even had an author interview him for a biography as he served time in prison for murder. But since he was paroled, he has, officials say, returned to what he knows best -

burglary. In 1978 Golder allegedly used two accomplices - Boonlert Thanarakol and Surajit Sae Sow - to rob a home in Old Brookville, New York. The robbery left the homeowner dead, and a trail of evidence led directly to Golder, who was convicted and sentenced to 15 years to life. Paroled in 1996 after 16 years behind bars, Golder told his parole officer that he wanted to be a jeweler, bartender, or a fitness trainer, but no one would hire him. Before long, police say, he was underground again, and back at work. Golder is now wanted for over 70 robberies in New England that have allegedly netted him more than a million dollars in cash and jewels. Described as slick, fearless, and cunning, Golder reportedly only strikes when residents are home and alarms are off. While the unsuspecting victims are away from the bedroom, police say he climbs their outside walls with the agility of a chimp, enters the bedroom, loads up with valuables, and escapes undetected. After a string of robberies in Greenwich, Connecticut were reported nationwide, other police agencies came forward with similar crimes. But by then, Golder had apparently slipped away to celebrate his own cunning. Police nationwide are on the lookout for Golder, but they aren't the only ones. Apparently, Golder ratted out some of his organized crime connections when he was taken down for the Old Brookville murder to get a reduced sentence, and they'd like a piece of him as well. But even with all this attention, officials believe that Golder is probably cocky enough to be hiding in broad daylight. He apparently loves the way he looks, and spends a great deal of time in Gold's Gyms and tanning salons. At night, he frequents nightclubs, strip bars, and high-profile parties. He has allegedly convinced himself that crime pays, and it will be up to the police and concerned citizens to prove him wrong. Golder has used the aliases Alan William Kulp and Thomas A. Williamson. He may have "Alan" tattooed between his knuckles. He has a large scar on his right biceps from tattoo removal. He allegedly uses girlfriends as getaway drivers. Golder is a bodybuilder who has worked as a personal trainer and has been a member of Gold's Gym. He frequently changes identity, may have had plastic surgery and may wear a goatee. Golder is 43, 5'9"-5'11" and 175 pounds. (See Shows #487, #491 and #524, OADs 3/28/98, 4/25/98 and 1/9/99)

Chaka Raysor (Murder, Racketeering, Conspiracy, Drug Charges) -- Chaka Raysor is wanted by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms and the United States Attorney's Office in the Eastern District of New York for murder, racketeering, and conspiracy to distribute crack cocaine. In 1985, investigators say Raysor and his brother Umeme formed a ruthless drug gang in their Bedford-Stuyvesant neighborhood of Brooklyn. At its peak, agents say the organization raked in over \$90,000 a week dealing crack cocaine in Brooklyn, Maryland, Delaware, and Norfolk, Virginia. The federal indictment also charges Chaka Raysor with a total of nine murders. But agents believe the Raysor organization committed more than forty homicides during their ten-year reign of terror. On the streets of Brooklyn, the gang was known as "The Killers". Agents say Raysor mesmerized his gang members with fiery, Black Panther-style rhetoric, and maintained their loyalty with an iron fist. they say during their reign of terror the

ruthless Raysor gang murdered innocent local residents, rival drug dealers, landlords, and a homeless man. On April 27, 1998 Umeme Raysor was convicted of federal racketeering, narcotics conspiracy and murder charges, but his brother Chaka remains at large. Chaka Raysor has used the aliases Charles Herbert Raysor, and the nicknames "Chik", "Chak", and "C". He is usually heavily armed, and is skilled in martial arts. Raysor has a stocky, powerful build, close-cropped hair and a beard, and a glass left eye with a scar underneath. He is described as ruthless, manipulative, charismatic, and extremely violent. Raysor is 29, 5'10" and 200 pounds. (See Show #517, OAD 11/7/98)

Derrick Henderson (Murder, Conspiracy, Weapons Charges) -- Derrick Henderson is wanted by the United States Attorney's Office in the Eastern District of New York, and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms for murder in aid of racketeering and conspiracy to distribute crack cocaine. Agents say Henderson is a trusted lieutenant of alleged Brooklyn drug lord Chaka Raysor. Agents say the gang dealt large quantities of crack cocaine and terrorized the Bedford-Stuyvesant community of Brooklyn between 1985 and 1996. In the early morning hours of January 18, 1994, agents say Henderson ordered a crack addict to douse an occupied apartment building with gasoline and set it ablaze. One resident, Yvonne Archibald, leapt to her death from a third-floor window in a desperate attempt to escape the inferno. Henderson is known to frequent drug havens in Norfolk, Virginia, Maryland, Delaware and North Carolina. Agents say he has numerous weapons convictions and should be considered armed and dangerous. Henderson is an alleged rug dealer and gang enforcer; agents say he's always armed, and extremely violent and vengeful. He is a member of the Raysor drug gang. Henderson is 29, 5'6" and 160 pounds. (See Show #517, OAD 11/7/98)

Unknown New York East Side Rapist (Rape - 1st Degree, Sodomy, Robbery) -- New York City's Upper East Side is an area with a reputation for the chic: chic stores, chic addresses, and chic women. But there's a dark side to the East Side. For the last three years it's been the hunting ground for a serial rapist. So far he's raped at least 14 women. Each one was attacked as she entered her apartment building after dark. None of the buildings had a doorman. The attacks have all taken place from 64th to 95th Streets, between Lexington and York Avenues - an area the rapist seems to know very well. There are few clues to his identity. Ironically, each victim has described the rapist as an angelic-looking man with a baby face and the full cheeks of a cherub. But this man is neither virtuous nor moral. He's been scared off or fought off while trying to attack several women, but he's never given up his evil hunt. He has, however, left a pattern - the predator has always called off the hunt during the months of May, June, July, February, and December. This may indicate that the suspect has a seasonal job, such as work on a cruise line, that takes his terror temporarily out of the city. He could, detectives speculate, also be a student in the city who leaves when school is out. Either way, all detectives are sure is that

as long as he is in New York, women on the Upper East Side will continue to be threatened. The most recent attack occurred on March 24, 1998 at 1:00am. A 25-year-old woman was attacked in the vestibule of her building on 90th Street between 1st and 2nd Avenue. Luckily she was able to fend off his attack and was unharmed. The suspect has very smooth skin, a slight mustache, and large brown eyes with long eyelashes. He is approximately 25, 5'11", and 190 pounds. (See Show #489, OAD 4/11/98)

Jose Silva (Murder) -- Silva brutally murdered a Pennsylvania man, stabbing him 20 times. Silva has a tattoo of the number 26 on his right arm. Silva is 21, 5'6" and 200 pounds.

UPDATES:

Unknown (murder) -- Mickey Thompson made his name through race cars, both on and off the track. Whether he was drag racing, off-road racing, or smashing another land speed record, Mickey pulled the crowds, eager to see what he would do next. Even with almost five hundred speed records broken, Thompson didn't stop there. His inventions and innovations not only made cars faster, but safer and better protected. With his business moving along smoothly, and his love for his wife Trudy deeper than ever, in 1988 Thompson seemed to be on easy street. But just past six o'clock in the evening on March 16, 1988, Trudy and Mickey were brutally murdered by two gunmen in the driveway of their Bradbury, California home. Two witnesses say that Mickey was shot first, injured, and forced to watch his wife being murdered before his eyes, knowing he was next. The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Detective on the case, Mike Robinson, said that they "were there to do one thing and that was to kill them...." The killers even had bicycles ready to make their escape--a shrewd move in Mickey's gated community, where a car could easily have been boxed in. The ruthlessness of the killers and their apparent deliberate planning both suggest a contract killing, but who would want Mickey dead? Many signs point to Michael Goodwin, Mickey's former business partner, who attempted to swindle the Thompsons, but was stopped in court by Mickey. After a half-million dollar award was made to Mickey, the couple began receiving numerous death threats. Goodwin, who is serving time in federal prison for bank fraud, denies any connection to the murders. Police believe their only hope is to track down the gunmen, and find out who put them onto the Thompsons. Both suspects are described as having a thin muscular build and wearing dark hooded sweatshirts during the murders. They are approximately 32-45, 6'0", and approximately 175 pounds. The killers possibly were seen in the area before the murders in a then-new maroon Volvo station wagon. Following the initial broadcast, a tipster recalled having seen two men loading bicycles into a Ryder truck in a nearby parking lot. Thompson's sister has offered a \$1 million reward for information leading to the capture and conviction of those responsible for the deaths of her

Unknown (Murder) -- Police in Cook County, Illinois are looking for the person who fired one fatal shot, killing a convenience store clerk in 1997. Cops say on April 16, 1997 Robert Collins, the overnight clerk at the Shell station in Orland Park, Illinois was alone in the station when a lone person entered the store, fired one shot at Collins and left. Collins died hours later. Police are unsure whether or not the shooting was a botched robbery, as no money was taken. Months after the shooting, Cook County Sheriff's Department received a phone call from a man named Bob Reynolds from Poole Trucking Company. He gave police details about the case that the police had not publicized. Suddenly, Reynolds hung up. Police do not consider him a suspect, but want to talk to him and find out everything he knows about the shooting. Shell has offered a \$20,000 reward leading to the arrest and conviction of the shooter. The suspect is probably right-handed. He may have a camouflage rain poncho with a hood, and may be driving a dark-colored van with a spare tire attached to the rear. Police believe he is probably right-handed and about 5'8". Following last week's broadcast, tips poured in about Poole Trucking and Bob Reynolds; however, police investigations have proved this man to be the wrong Reynolds and are still seeking the caller. Enrique "Kike" Coropuna (Armed Robbery, Attempted Murder) -- Coropuna is one of the leaders of a South American gang believed to be responsible for several jewelry store robberies on the east coast committed in 1992. On June 6, 1992 Coropuna and another man entered the Ngoz-Long jewelry store in Arlington, Virginia where they handcuffed and pistol-whipped the store's employees. Police say the two men stole \$350,000 worth of jewelry and fled in a white American car with New Jersey plates. On July 23, 1992 Coropuna and two other men entered another Arlington jewelry store, Phnom-Penn Jewelers, handcuffed the employees and stole \$35,000 in jewelry. The incident was taped on an overhead surveillance camera. The two other men involved in the robbery were arrested and are now serving their sentences. On November 11, 1992 Coropuna and a woman entered the Kornspan Jewelers in Linden, New Jersey. After asking to view a tray of jewelry, as many as three more men entered the store. The robbers began to handcuff the owners of the store to furniture and scoop jewelry into bags. According to police reports, when police officer Al Goncalvez arrived at the scene Coropuna fired one 9mm round at his chest. Goncalvez escaped serious injury because he was wearing a bulletproof vest. The five robbers fled and were picked up by a getaway driver in a white Oldsmobile. After a brief high-speed chase, the getaway car crashed into a parked vehicle and the suspects fled on foot. Three suspects were eventually arrested. Coropuna and another associate are still at large and have been charged with attempted murder, robbery, and weapons offenses. Coropuna is 38, 5'6" and 200 pounds. Recent tips have convinced authorities that Coropuna is still on the East Coast. (See Shows #273, #306, #1014 and #534, OADs 6/25/93,

Forty-two-year-old Carole Sund has been missing since February 16, 1999, along with her 15-year-old daughter, Juliana Sund, and 16-year-old Silvina Pelosso, an exchange student. The Sacramento FBI says that Carole Sund, Juliana Sund and Silvina Pelosso were traveling together.

The trio left the San Francisco area on February 12 and planned to go to the University of the Pacific in Stockton, California. Then, authorities say, the three women were going to Yosemite National Park to sightsee. The FBI says the trio was supposed to return to San Francisco and meet Carole's husband Jens at the airport on February 16. They were planning to fly to Arizona to visit the Grand Canyon. The three women never met up with the rest of their group and were reported missing one day later. The women were last seen in the Yosemite area on February 15 and were driving a red Pontiac Grand Prix rental car with California license plates 4BMV025. Carole Sund's wallet was found in Modesto, California on February 19. There is a \$300,000 reward offered. On Thursday, March 18 the women's burnt-out rental car was found at Longbarn, California, some two hours north of the park. The next day authorities announced that two bodies had been found in the trunk of the car. The bodies were identified as Carole and Silvina. Juliana's body was found near Yosemite a few days later. A waitress in Modesto believes she served the women the day after their disappearance. Along Highway 108, near where the car was found, was another possible sighting at a gas station, possibly the same day. A further report places the women at a nearby gift shop. However, the FBI remains skeptical regarding all three reported sightings. (See Shows #532, #533 and #534, OADs 3/6/99, 3/13/99 and 3/20/99)

CAPTURED:

Eric Steven Stein (Racketeering, Securities Fraud) -- The Zipper Tie, the talking dog tag, and the Christmas tree fire alarm were just a few of the wacky gadgets that helped Eric Stein build his fortune. Television commercials would push them, and investors lined up to support them. Stein was a master salesman, but investigators say he was really a master swindler - one of the most cunning and successful they have ever seen. Stein's Las Vegas company, the Sterling Group, used telemarketers to raise huge amounts of money from investors. The telemarketers offered potential investors a return of fifty percent on a minimum \$10,000 investment - in only 60 days. The investor would sponsor the ad campaign, and Sterling would ship the product. To investors taken in by the scheme, it seemed too good to be true. And of course, investigators say, it was. Stein allegedly picked out some investors to pay off as promised, and then used them as references to bilk potential investors. Trouble was, according to investigators, Stein was paying off these select investors with new investor's money - a classic Ponzi scheme. Hiroshi Stevens, inventor of the Zipper Tie, says he was initially taken in by Stein's confidence game. When he visited the Las Vegas office, it was a beehive of activity - packed with sales people, accountants, and telemarketers bringing in more investors. Hiroshi says he was sold. But when he realized how much money was pouring into Stein's coffers from investors, Hiroshi became suspicious. He says he realized that Stein would have to sell mountains of Zipper Ties and other novelties in order to pay his investors back. He didn't see that happening, and decided to investigate. It wasn't long, he says, before he realized that he had been taken. By December 1997, authorities say, the inevitable happened - Stein stopped paying back his investors. By the authorities' account, Stein's was the largest-ever scam in a state full of scams - 1,700 investors were allegedly swindled, and an incredible \$40 to \$60 million taken. In March, 1998, investigating agencies moved in to shut him down, but Stein had already disappeared. And so had the money. An AMW tipster spotted Stein in Chula Vista, California, where he was taken into custody while on his way to dinner. Apparently Stein had continued his telemarketing scam operations while on the run, using the alias Alonso Arce. (See Show #506, OAD 8/8/98)
