*The following are the featured fugitives and others being sought by federal, state or local authorities. The Update (if any) gives current status, previous references, or related information.*

**Mark Anthony Williams** (Escape, Murder, Attempted Murder, Cocaine Distribution) -- Mark Anthony Williams escaped from the Robeson County Detention Center in Lumberton, North Carolina, on January 22, 1999. Authorities say Williams promised his cell mate Walter Lambert \$3,000 for the use of his identity. According to the US Marshals Service, Williams was released from the Robeson County Detention Center on \$20,000 bail after passing himself off as Lambert. Williams pulled this off, authorities say, by promising a GMC Tahoe to Vafiti and Dondai Washington, the two bail bondsmen who bailed him out. Authorities say Williams is the leader of an East Coast drug network that uses murder and violence as a means of intimidation. While in the Robeson County Detention Center, Williams was awaiting trial on drug conspiracy charges, authorities say. According to the Marshals Service, Williams is charged with the murder of a 14-year-old and the attempted murder of a 12-year-old in Norfolk, Virginia. Williams is also wanted in connection with three murders in Raleigh, North Carolina and one in Brooklyn, New York. Williams has a handful of aliases, including Michael Nembhard, Alex Cruz, Jerome Adams, Michael Smiley, Junior Reed, Gary Edwards and Anthony Parker. He has scars on both arms and a tattoo on his left arm. He has a quiet, disarming personality, but is actually extremely violent. He is a native of Jamaica. Williams is 27, 5'9" and 175 pounds.

**James Vincent Sullivan** (Murder) -- James Sullivan is wanted for murder by the Atlanta Police Department and the Georgia Bureau of Investigation in the contract killing of his wife, Lita McClinton Sullivan. Police believe on Friday, January 16, 1987 at approximately 8:15am, Phillip Harwood, a hitman hired by Sullivan, rang the doorbell of Lita's condominium in the Buckhead community of Atlanta. When she opened her front door Harwood, posing as a flower delivery man, shot her in the head with a 9mm semi-automatic pistol, killing her instantly. Lita and Sullivan were involved in a turbulent divorce which entailed a large settlement of money on Lita's behalf. At the time of the murder Sullivan resided in Albermarle, North Carolina and was not considered a suspect. However, Phillip Harwood was arrested a short time later and confessed that Sullivan had indeed hired him to murder Lita. When Sullivan found out Harwood had been arrested he fled to Costa Rica before police could obtain an arrest warrant. In April 1998 police finally obtained an arrest warrant but Sullivan was nowhere to be found. Police

know Sullivan still has a home in Costa Rica, but they believe he could be anywhere in the world. Sullivan is frugal to the point of being miserly, but he likes to live the lifestyle of a millionaire. He likes to hang out at bars and resorts frequented by the rich and famous. Sullivan is 57, 5'10" and 125-165 pounds.

**Adam Troy Peace** (Using Explosives In Relation To A Crime Of Violence) -- Adam Troy Peace is wanted for his alleged role in the planning and execution of a bombing on March 11, 1997 in Salt Lake County, Utah. Authorities say Peace, a member of the Straight Edge-Vegan-Animal Liberation Front Movement (see Feature below) conspired with Josh Ellerman and three other young extremists to plant five pipe bombs in and around the Fur Breeders Co-Op. The co-op houses domesticated mink for fur production and industry research. The bombing caused over \$700,000 in damage and led to federal indictments and convictions that sent Ellerman to prison for seven years. Peace doesn't eat meat, drink or smoke. He listens to hardcore punk music and attends live concerts. He has no known occupation. His natural hair color is brown, but he may have dyed it blond. He may be traveling with fugitive James Blackmon (see below). Peace is 21, 6'4" and 170 pounds.

**James Ray Blackmon** (Burglary) -- James Ray Blackmon is wanted by the Utah Department of Public Safety for Criminal Mischief, Burglary, and Release of Fur Bearing Animals. Agents from the Utah Department of Public Safety say Blackmon and associates committed those acts because of their radical beliefs associated with the "hardline" Straight Edge-Vegan-Animal Liberation Front Movement (see Feature below). Agents say on the night of July 17, 1996, Blackmon and other members of the movement broke into a mink farm in Salt Lake County. Agents say Blackmon and his crew vandalized the farm and released numerous domesticated mink from their cages, causing \$200,000 in damage and resulting in the death of many of the animals who starved to death or were run over by cars on the freeways. In Utah, one of the three largest mink-producing states, those crimes are felonies and are prosecuted vigorously. If convicted on all counts, Blackmon faces up to 15 years in prison. Some of Blackmon's associates were later charged and convicted of planting bombs in the Fur Breeders Co-Op facility that caused over \$700,000 in damage and led to federal convictions under statutes pertaining to domestic terrorism. Blackmon is a strict vegetarian who avoids using or wearing any animal byproducts. He neither drinks nor smokes. He is clean cut, with the looks of a college preppie. He may be traveling with Adam Peace (see above), and may be driving a mid-90's model black Ford Escort with a sunroof, tinted windows, and California plates. Blackmon is 23, 5'5" and 130-135 pounds.

**James Byron Carlson** (sexual assault of a child)

**Dorothy Dee Carlson** (aiding and abetting the sexual assault of a child) -- Carlson sexually molested his nine-year-old stepdaughter at gunpoint. After being convicted, Carlson

skipped bail while awaiting sentencing. Carlson's hands are white from a chemical accident. He has several tattoos, including a dagger on his upper right arm, flowers on both wrists, and a bluejay on his upper left arm. Carlson is vain about his hair, and sometimes wears a beard. He wears glasses or contact lenses, and has noticeably crooked front teeth. Authorities believe Carlson is on the run with his wife, Dorothy, in a 1985 two tone red and white Dodge pickup with Texas license plates XX8-979, or commemorative POW license plate PW401D. Carlson is 55, 6'0" and 200 pounds. Dorothy Carlson is soft spoken, may wear glasses or contact lenses, and has worked as a waitress. She is 38, 5'4" and 125 pounds. **Michas Angelo Taitano (Murder, Robbery)**

**Christal Valorie Law (Missing) --** Michas Taitano is wanted for the murder and robbery of Tarkegne Worku, a Seattle parking attendant on July 5, 1998. Worku's wife prepared his dinner and was delivering it to him when she returned to their car for a fork. While she was walking away from her husband, Michas Taitano shot Worku and robbed his booth of approximately \$200. Taitano confessed to a friend the next day. Police believe Taitano may be traveling the northwest US with his girlfriend, Christal Law. Taitano is a native of Guam. He has a stocky build, may wear a goatee, and wears sunglasses all the time. He smokes crack, marijuana, and cigarettes, and drinks malt liquors. He usually has large amounts of cash and likes to frequent malls and shopping centers. He also loves to freestyle rap. Police warn that Taitano should be considered armed and dangerous. Taitano is 23, 5'6" and 175 pounds. Christal Law has been reported missing. She is quiet and shy, with a husky build. She is a smoker and beer drinker. Law is 19, 6'2" and 175-185 pounds.

**Unknown (Murder) --** Baltimore police are searching for the unknown killer of Keri Sirbaugh. Police say that at approximately 3:15am on the morning of July 21, 1995 Keri's downstairs neighbor heard a scream and a muffled conversation. According to police, the neighbor called 911 and asked the police to come to her complex, but hung up before giving her address. A patrol car drove past the complex and police say the officers saw nothing suspicious. The next day police say Keri's parents became alarmed when they found out that she didn't show up for work. When they went over to her apartment to look for her, they discovered her body about forty feet away from her apartment door. Keri had been strangled and beaten. On the night of July 20, 1995 police say Keri told her parents that she was going out on a date. There were two unconfirmed sightings of Keri in Fells Point near the Baltimore Harbor. Keri drove a green Volkswagen Cabriolet with a loud muffler, and police are searching for anyone who saw her and/or heard her car that evening.

**UPDATES:**

**Tibis Kneipp** (Murder) -- Kneipp is wanted in the 1998 strangulation, stabbing and beating murder of 23-year-old Nicole Holm in her Fort Collins, Colorado home. Detectives say Nicole was making phone calls from various pay phones around Ft. Collins early in the morning of September 9, 1998. She was trying to get money to help bail her boyfriend out of jail. Around 2:00am, surveillance video captured Nicole and Tibis Kneipp in a 7-11 and again at 3:19am in another 7-11. Later that morning, a prowler was reported in Nicole's neighborhood. Kneipp was found in the area but later released by police when the caller could not positively ID him. The following day, when Nicole's boyfriend was released from jail, he returned to the apartment he shared with Nicole and found her beaten, strangled and sexually assaulted. Days later, police filed charges against Kneipp but he had already fled. Kneipp has used several alias, including Tibis Knoop, Tibis Gambs, and Scott Samles. He has several tattoos, including "FEAR" on the knuckles of his left hand, a bracelet on his left wrist, the "eye of Ra" on the palm of his left hand, a heart with a sword on it on his left knee, the letters "CI" with a marijuana leaf on his left knee, a half fish-half bird on his left ankle, and face with a blank expression on his left arm.. Kneipp is very thin and may have taken on the "gothic" look with long black hair, but he changes his appearance frequently. He is bisexual, reportedly into bondage, sadism and masochism, and is suspected of another rape in Ohio. He is intelligent, articulate, cunning and manipulative, but has bi-polar disorder and is mentally unstable. He frequents coffee houses, alternative night clubs and 24-hour restaurants. Authorities say he drinks, smokes, and uses various drugs. Kneipp is a musician who plays keyboards; he has also worked as a temporary laborer, sprinkler installer, vacuum cleaner salesman, waiter, cook, at a printing company and as a backhoe operator. Police in Salt Lake City and San Francisco believe Kneipp may be linked to crimes in those cities as well. Kneipp is 23, 6'2" and 140 pounds. (See Show #527, OAD 1/30/99)

**John Stephen Huggins** (murder) -- On June 10, Carla Larson drove her 1995 white and grey Ford Explorer to a local market where she purchased her lunch. She never returned to her office. Witnesses reported that they had seen a strange man drive Larson's car out of a wooded area. Two days later, her body was found. Her jewelry and her car were missing. A unique gold pendant, comprising the letters C and R with a small diamond, was one of the pieces missing. The car was found June 26 in Cocoa Beach, Florida. It had been set on fire, perhaps in an attempt to obliterate clues. AMW viewer Angel Huggins realized that the suspect police were seeking was her estranged husband John Huggins. During a vacation to the Kissimee area, John disappeared for a time; when he returned he was driving Carla Larson's white Explorer. Angel

called AMW and turned in her husband. Detectives located Huggins in Maryland where he was in jail on petty theft charges. After he was extradited to Florida, Huggins began confessing -- not to the murder of Carla Larson, but to a string of bank robberies. However, Carla Larson's missing jewelry has been found and police say they can positively link it to Huggins. Last Wednesday, Huggins was convicted of first degree murder. **David Lopez (Murder)**

**Ruben Lopez (Murder)** -- David and Ruben Lopez are wanted by the San Jose Police department for the 1997 murder of Leonard Miller. Police say the Lopez brothers were involved in a business dispute with Leonard's son, Steve. Brother David, Ruben and Efram Lopez operated Red's Hydraulics in Long Beach, California. Steve Miller and his father, Leonard Miller, owned and operated Lowrider Hydraulics in San Jose. The two companies were fierce competitors in the lucrative custom-lowrider car parts supply industry. Detectives say David and Ruben hired three men from Los Angeles and sent them to San Jose to kill Steve Miller. On the morning of March 3, 1997 one of the men entered Lowrider Hydraulics and asked to see the owner. When sixty-year-old Leonard Miller walked out to the counter he was gunned down. The intended target, Steve Miller, was not at work that morning. Within weeks the three contract killers were arrested. The hitmen implicated David and Ruben Lopez as the men who had hired them to kill Steve Miller. Before police could arrest them, the Lopez brothers packed up their families and disappeared from Long Beach. Both brothers have used the surname Ramirez. David Lopez has a stocky build and long, flowing hair. He is married to Clara Elena Lopez; they have four children. David Lopez is 38, 5'4" and 176 pounds. Ruben Lopez wears a goatee and has long flowing jet-black hair. He is described as a workaholic. He is married to Margaret Elaine Lopez; they also have children. Ruben Lopez is 42, 5'8" and 180 pounds. Following the last broadcast, a tipster called in with valuable information, but the authorities need to talk to this person further and are urging him or her to call back. (See Show #526, OAD 1/23/99)

**Hazel Leota Head (Murder, Arson)** -- Hazel Leota Head is wanted for the murder of Charles Barker on September 2, 1998 in Benton, Louisiana. Barker was shot in the back of the head as he sat at his trailer counter. Police found a murder weapon and say physical evidence points to Hazel Head. Hazel had met Barker at a local casino under the name Deianna Ray. She subsequently moved in with him. When Barker's body was found, his cash and his car were gone. Upon further investigation, police found that there was an outstanding warrant for Hazel's arrest in Nebraska, where she is accused of burning down a boyfriend's trailer. Police also learned that Hazel has a history of moving around. She has been married multiple times, to as many as ten different men. She has lived all across the country. Head has many aliases, including Hazel Morgan, Willow Shields, Hazel Foley, Kelly Morgan, Hazel Spurbeck, Hazel Haynes, Hazel Vincent, Deianna Ray, Hazel Woodman, Hazel Fautch, Treasa "Tess" Jean Coyle,

and Treasa "Tess" Venable. She has a noticeable gap between her front teeth. She is a smoker and drinker, favoring vodka. She often works as a waitress, and hangs out at truck stops, often traveling with truckers. She frequents casinos and places personal ads looking for men. Head is 49, 5'2" and 120 pounds. (See Show #527, OAD 1/30/99)

**MISSING:**

**Teekah Lewis**

According to investigators with the Tacoma Police Department, two-year-old Teekah Lewis disappeared Saturday, January 23, 1999 from the New Frontier Lanes bowling alley in Tacoma, Washington. That night, Teekah was last seen around 10:15pm as she was playing in the arcade section of the bowling alley just a few feet away from her family. Teekah's mother, Teresa English, says she looked away for just one minute and then discovered her daughter was gone. So far, an intensive search has turned up no concrete leads in the case. Detectives have no suspects. The FBI has been brought in on the case. Teekah is a shy and quiet child who loves candy. When last seen, she was wearing a green "tweety bird" sweatshirt, white sweatpants, black and white "Air Jordan" sneakers and was carrying a clear purse with a fish design and a shoulder strap. **RECOVERED:**

**Jerrod Deshawn Love** -- Thirteen-year-old Jerrod Deshawn Love was reported missing from Nashville, Tennessee since January 11, 1999. Police say he never showed up at school that day and determined that he was traveling with 24-year-old Timothy David Young, an accused child molester on the run (see below). Police know Jerrod and Young had a close friendship, and aren't sure whether Jerrod went with him willingly or not. They fled to Texas, where Young's car broke down. From there they took a bus to Los Angeles. Young told a YMCA worker that they were father and son. However, the YMCA worker saw the two on that night's AMW broadcast. She called a contact at the shelter where she'd sent Young and Love. The two lured Young back with a promise of more housing assistance; while they detained him with paperwork, they called the police who captured Young. Love was returned to his family in Nashville. **CAPTURED:**

**Kyle Aaron Dobschensky (Escape)**

**Jennifer Arlene Gibbs (Escape)** -- Dobschensky and two other inmates from the Midland County Jail escaped on January 2, 1999 at approximately 9am. Deputies say the three men overpowered one deputy in the maximum security area and took her jail keys. They then made their way down two flights of stairs to the booking area of the jail. There, cops say, they assaulted one deputy by spraying a fire extinguisher in his eyes and threatened another guard with a homemade device that resembled a zip gun. The two deputies were then handcuffed and locked in a holding cell. Deputies say a female inmate named Jennifer Gibbs was using a phone in the booking area and saw the escape. The three men took Gibbs with them out of the jail. The four escapees then took off in a black 1998 Toyota RAV-4. Boyer was picked up in Seattle following an alleged bank robbery. Smith was injured in a car crash following an aborted post office robbery and is in the hospital. Dobschensky and Gibbs escaped from the crash. According to authorities, Dobschensky is responsible for over 140 robberies in central Michigan with the last year. He says that while on the run, he would use local library facilities to check the internet in order to see the details of his own pursuit, and would steal new cars or otherwise change his plans accordingly. In Kentucky a pizza delivery man recognized Dobschensky from his AMW profile, causing Dobschensky to flee again. In Lewisburg, West Virginia, a trooper ran the plates on their car and discovered it was stolen. Gibbs was arrested during the routine stop, but Dobschensky pulled a weapon and fled. He climbed up into the frame of a car in a local dealership. The K-9 units didn't discover him because they'd been called off; however, a cat decided to sit under a car near where Dobschensky was hiding, and when police shined their lights on the cat, they spotted Dobschensky, who was then taken into custody. **Jeffrey Vincent McGee (Murder)** -- Police say that on the morning of January 20, 1999 Villa Rica Police Captain Robbie Bishop was shot and killed during a drug interdiction stop along interstate I-20 in Carroll County, Georgia, west of Atlanta. McGee fled the scene in a black Chevrolet Blazer, with New York tags, but police say the vehicle was recovered in Birmingham, Alabama later that day. Police believe McGee boarded a plane that stopped in Houston, Texas where he transferred to another plane that made stops in El Paso and San Antonio before landing in Los Angeles. Police recovered McGee's luggage in LA and in it discovered a bullet-proof vest. McGee has a scar on his left arm and a discolored left ear. McGee was picked up in Toronto this week. **Timothy David Young** (Failure To Appear, Rape Of A Child) -- Nashville Metropolitan Police are looking for 24-year-old Timothy David Young. Police say Young was supposed to appear in court on January 11, 1999 for trial on seven counts of rape of a child, but instead disappeared. Police say the charges stem from incidents in 1996 and 1997 when Young allegedly raped three boys. Amazingly, Young worked as a youth services officer for the state's Department of Children's Services between the time he committed the crimes and the time he was charged. Young may have left town with 13-year-old Jerrod Love (see above). They fled to Texas, where Young's car broke down. From there they took a bus to Los Angeles. Young told a YMCA worker that they were father and son. However, the YMCA worker saw the two on that night's AMW broadcast. She called a contact at the shelter where she'd sent Young and Love. The two lured Young back with a promise of more housing assistance; while they detained him with paperwork, they called the police who captured Young. Love was returned to his family in Nashville. (See Shows #525 and #526, OADs 1/16/99 and 1/23/99)

**FEATURE:**

**Straight Edge** -- A new movement is attracting teens: one which advocates a clean lifestyle without smoking, drugs, alcohol or promiscuous sex. They adopted the large black X, originally marked on hands to indicate to bartenders that the bearer wasn't old enough to drink, as their symbol. However, in Salt Lake City this seemingly positive lifestyle has turned violent against anyone who doesn't follow their creed. The "Hate Edge" groups reportedly terrorize merchants and citizens, and recently one of their group attempted to carve the symbolic X into the back of a young man who was drinking and smoking a joint at a concert. In a recent confrontation a young man was killed. Other groups have become militant vegans, forming violent protests and even vandalizing businesses which handle meat, fur or other animal products. *The following are the featured fugitives and others being sought by federal, state or local authorities. The Update (if any) gives current status, previous references, or related information.*

**Carlos Mario Felix** - (Rape, Kidnap, Assault) -- Carlos Felix is wanted for the rape, kidnapping and assault of a 17-year-old woman on September 22, 1996. In the early morning hours of that day, the victim was leaving a nightclub with her friends when they met Felix, who was introduced as a "friend of a friend". Felix offered the group a ride home in his cab. The group accepted and Felix drove them all to an address in Manhattan. During the ride, the victim complained that she still had to get back to New Jersey. Felix offered her a ride, as he was going that way himself. Felix drove the victim to the Westside Highway on Manhattan, where he pulled the car over and raped her. He then continued to drive her into New Jersey. They were traveling at a high rate of speed on Route 80 in New Jersey when the victim realized that Felix was not driving towards her house. In fear of her life, the victim jumped out of the car and rolled onto the highway. A passing motorist eventually picked her up and took her to Hackensack hospital. With the victim's help, police tracked down Felix's cab, but Felix had abandoned it and has not reappeared since. Felix has used the aliases Carlos Felic and Carlos M. Feliz-Melo. He has a long surgery scar down the entire length of the center of his chest. He doesn't speak English very well, and has variously claimed to be from the Dominican Republic and Puerto Rico. He is a known cocaine user. Felix is 32, 5'9" and 200 pounds.

**Mark Anthony Williams** (Escape, Murder, Attempted Murder, Cocaine Distribution) -- Mark Anthony Williams escaped from the Robeson County Detention Center in Lumberton, North Carolina, on January 22, 1999. Authorities say Williams promised his cell mate Walter Lambert \$3,000 for the use of his identity. According to the US Marshals Service, Williams was released from the Robeson County Detention Center on \$20,000 bail after passing himself off as Lambert. Williams pulled this off, authorities say, by promising a GMC Tahoe to Vafiti and Dondai Washington, the two bail bondsman who bailed him out. Authorities say Williams is the leader of an East Coast drug network that uses murder and violence as a means of intimidation. While in the Robeson County Detention Center, Williams was awaiting trial on drug conspiracy charges, authorities say. According to the Marshals Service, Williams is charged with the murder of a 14-year-old and the attempted murder of a 12-year-old in Norfolk, Virginia. Williams is also wanted in connection with three murders in Raleigh, North Carolina and one in

Brooklyn, New York. Williams has a handful of aliases, including Michael Nembhard, Alex Cruz, Jerome Adams, Michael Smiley, Junior Reed, Gary Edwards and Anthony Parker. He has scars on both arms and a tattoo on his left arm. He has a quiet, disarming personality, but is actually extremely violent. He is a native of Jamaica. Williams is 27, 5'9" and 175 pounds. (See Show #528, OAD 2/6/99)

**Anatoliy Valenko (Murder)**

**Vladimir Balachov (Murder)** -- Valenko and Balachov are wanted by the New York City Police Department for the 1995 dismemberment murder of their roommates in a Brooklyn apartment. Police say that on November 12, 1995 the two murdered Fakhat Askarov and Fakhat's girlfriend, Larisa Jakovleva during an argument. Then detectives say Valenko and Balachov purchased a circular saw with the victim's credit card and dismembered the bodies. Police located Fakhat Askarov's head and leg and Jakovleva's leg on Plum Beach in Brooklyn. The torsos were located in a mountain reservation in Essex County, New Jersey. Both men are from the Ukraine and speak very little English. They may be hiding out in a Russian community, possibly in California or New York. Both men place personal ads in Russian newspapers to meet women. Both men have worked as carpenters in construction jobs, as a gas station attendant and as a cashier. Valenko is 27, 5'8" and 150 pounds. Balachov is 27, 5'10" and 150 pounds.

**John Ruffo (Failure To Appear For Service For Sentence)** -- John Ruffo is wanted by the FBI and the U.S. Marshals Service for bank fraud, money laundering, wire fraud, and conspiracy. Ruffo and associate Ed Reiners developed an elaborate scheme which defrauded more than 10 banks of 350 million dollars. Reiners, a former employee of Phillip Morris, went to several banks and pretended that he was in charge of a top-secret project for the tobacco company. Ruffo was in charge of purchasing computers for this phantom "project". Reiners and Ruffo used the money that they borrowed from the banks to invest in the stock market, but lost miserably. Over the course of two years, the "project" grew and grew. Nine U.S. and international banks were on board. The con men met with vice presidents from these banks, convincing them to hand over hundreds of millions of dollars to the bogus operation. The plan unraveled when an official from a Japanese bank called Phillip Morris and asked for Reiners. He was shocked to hear that Reiners hadn't worked there in almost three years. The con men were arrested and convicted. Reiners is currently serving a sixteen and a half year sentence. On November 9, 1998 Ruffo failed to surrender as scheduled at a federal prison in Fairton, New Jersey. Later that day, Ruffo's rental car was found at JFK airport. Ruffo has numerous aliases, including Joseph Paul Russo and Bruce Gregory. He has an obvious cleft in his chin and needs glasses or contact lenses. He is a cop buff, loves the FBI and "espionage", and is described as a loner and secretive. Ruffo is 44, 5'5" and 170 pounds.

**AMW ALL-POINTS BULLETINS:**

**Lena Dianne Townsend** (Murder) -- Lena Townsend is wanted for the 1998 murder of 4-year-old Karina Rowen in Piston, Tennessee. Sheriff's deputies say that in the summer of 1998 Karina came to live with her grandfather Richard Townsend and his new wife Lena after the girl's mother asked for some help. Neighbors and relatives say Lena Townsend was mean and yelled at the little girl a lot. On August 21, 1998 Richard came home from work around 4:30pm. Deputies say Lena told him that Karina was taking a nap. According to authorities, Lena later told her husband that Karina was fed and in bed asleep. The next morning Richard awoke and found a note from Lena say that she went to WalMart. Richard checked on Karina and found her dead in her bed. Deputies say that she died from blunt trauma to the head. Lena reportedly took \$8,000 and a loaded pump shotgun. She left in a dark brown 1985 Lincoln town car with Tennessee tags. The car was later found in Conway, Arkansas. Inside was a receipt from a local Motel 6, empty camping gear boxes, hair dye and a bagful of hair remnants. U.S. Marshals say Lena Townsend was spotted in Uwharrie National Forest near Charlotte, North Carolina with her adult son. The two have since split up and the son claims he doesn't know his mother's whereabouts. Lena Townsend may be using the name Dianne Townsend or Lena Dianne Scoggins. She has several tattoos, including a Grim Reaper on her left arm, a turtle on her left breast, five dragons on her back, a dragon on her right breast, and an ankle bracelet tattoo on her right ankle. She is described as a "tough chick with a wild streak", and likes to hang out in biker bars. She may have dyed her hair, and she may have no bottom front teeth because her dental bridge was left behind. She is a survivalist and a trained mechanic who served four years in the army. She may be armed. Lena Townsend is 43, 5'6", and 165 pounds.

**Scott James Brinegar** (Robbery, Threats to Bomb) -- "He had these wild-looking eyes. I knew I had a fruitcake in front of me... he looked crazy...I felt sick to my stomach." This is the reaction of a teller at the Signet Bank on Warwick Avenue in Newport News, Virginia, when a strange man walked through the bank's front door on August 6, 1996. Moments later, the teller was looking at a nylon lunch bag with a strange assortment of wires sticking out the top. The man in front of her told her it was a bomb, and he was ready to detonate it, killing himself and her, unless she loaded him up with \$20,000. She believed him. She gave the man all she could - \$6,371 to be exact, and thankfully watched the "fruitcake" leave the building. But the bag he left behind. Soon the bomb squad was on the scene, and x-rays revealed that there was no bomb - just a haphazard arrangement of wires and duct tape. One of the customers told officers he had watched the robber duck around behind a bar across the street. When police investigated, they found what they now call the trailer of drifter and ex-con Scott James Brinegar. Brinegar's toilet

was lined with his own hair - police say after the robbery he gave himself a quick trim to help hide his identity. America's Most Wanted's forensic artists have rendered a photo, shown above, to show what he might look like in his new coiffeur. The evidence police say they uncovered in Brinegar's lair included more wires and duct tape and a letter to a former cellmate in which he bragged about becoming the next "Unabomber." Police went out on the town to look for more leads. Later that day, they got a tip that Brinegar was headed for Illinois on a Greyhound bus. The last departure had a stop in Pittsburgh, so police there were informed and ready when the bus arrived. They found a man who matched his description on the bus, and allegedly found two weapons and \$3,400 in his possession. But when he was fingerprinted, no match. It turned out that this was not the fugitive Brinegar, but the fugitive David Lee Patterson, wanted by the Chesapeake, Virginia, police for murder. Brinegar, meanwhile, apparently has vanished without a trace. Brinegar has several tattoos including a Pink Panther on his right leg and a Viking on his left leg. He is a smoker and beer drinker, and has worked as a carnival ride operator. He has prior arrests for shoplifting, burglary, and possession of cocaine. Brinegar is 31, 6'0" and 165 pounds. (See Shows #464 and #500, OADs 9/6/97 and 6/20/98)

**Luis Alfonso Lopez** (Wanted for Questioning) -- On December 31, 1996, Liz Bustamante strolled into the Floor Samples Furniture Store looking for her friend, Jacqueline Arauz. She immediately knew something was wrong - Jacqueline was nowhere in sight, and neither were any other employees. Liz finally found her friend in the back office with a co-worker, Abel Perez. They had been bound, gagged, and shot in head. Police didn't know where to begin. Was the murder a planned hit or a botched robbery? There were few clues until police talked to store manager Ramona Blanco. Just hours before she was found killed, Liz had told Ramona about some visitors she had a bad feeling about. The previous day, she reportedly had said, two men and one woman had come into the store, asking questions about how much money the store made and how many people worked there. The way they winked and snickered to each other made Liz nervous, so she wrote down their license plate number as they drove away. Police called Liz's family, and they found her note in the clothes she had been wearing the day before she was killed. The first plate the police ran led them to a junked car. But then, when they ran the numbers through the traffic infraction computer, up popped Luis Lopez. Police became extremely interested in him after learning that he reportedly had a history of theft and burglary. Police believe that Lopez, although he is not a suspect, may hold the keys that will blow this case wide open. Lopez has used the aliases Luis Mariano Lopez and Ground Quintero. He has a tattoo on his left biceps of the letter "E", and another tattoo, possibly a saint, on his back. Lopez has visible acne scars on his face. He has police records for theft and burglary. Police say he's a heavy crack cocaine user. Lopez is a Colombian national, but claims to be Cuban. He has worked as a cook and construction worker. He speaks with a Colombian accent. He may be driving a 1986 dark blue Cadillac. Lopez is 25, 5'8" and 140-160 pounds. (See Shows #1015 and #501, OADs 3/8/97 and 6/27/98)

9-year-old Erica Baker has been missing from Kettering, Ohio since February 7, 1999. Police say around that time an elderly couple saw Erica and her dog walking in a nearby park, around a pond. When Erica didn't return home by 5:30pm her family went looking for her. Police want to question two potential witnesses who were seen in the area around the same time Erica was seen. The first is a

### CAPTURED:

**Mark Donald Hoosier** (Sexual Assault On A Child) -- The FBI is looking for Hoosier, an accused pedophile wanted on child molestation charges in Colorado. In 1980, Melissa Guthrie married Hoosier. When they divorced twelve years later, their daughter Audrey came forward and told her mother that Hoosier had molested her since she could remember. Finally, in 1994, charges were filed against Hoosier around the same time he was due to earn his Master's Degree in aviation. When he didn't show up for graduation, an UFAP warrant was issued. He was arrested in 1996 attempting to reenter the United States but later that year he fled before a court appearance. Once again, an UFAP warrant was issued. Through investigations, agents have learned Hoosier has molested numerous children including his own sister. Agents also have learned that Hoosier has defrauded a Tulsa bank and his mother out of \$9,000. Following the initial broadcast, an anonymous tipster informed AMW that Hoosier was living in Edmonton, Alberta, using the name James McBride. Another tipster called in to say that she was renting a room to McBride. Hoosier was arrested at his workplace. (See Show #527, OAD 1/30/99)

### CASE CLOSED:

**Edward Henry Cook** (burglary) -- The FBI called this man the most wanted jewel thief in the world. Over 25 years he is believed to have stolen \$14 million in diamonds and cash. Working with his professional crew, he used sophisticated electronic devices to thwart jewelry store and other security systems. Following the last broadcast, a tipster led authorities to Broward County, Florida, where they found a driver's license for a man named Robert Stewart. The resemblance between the license photo and Cook was remarkable. However, "Robert Stewart" had moved out of his apartment shortly before. A sickly "Stewart" died in a Ft. Lauderdale hospital. Authorities exhumed "Stewart"'s corpse and fingerprinted it; the prints were a match. (See Shows #204, #239 and #423, OADs 3/6/92, 10/9/92 and 8/25/96) .

*The following are the featured fugitives and others being sought by federal, state or local authorities. The Update (if any) gives current status, previous references, or related information.*

**Unknown (Murder)** -- On December 3, 1997 four bodies were found in a warehouse in the small rural town of Bartow in Florida, near Tampa. The victims were 69-year-old George Gonsalves (one of three owners), 35-year-old Frank Dosso (employee and son of Phil Dosso, another owner), 26-year-old George Patisso (employee and son-in-law of Phil Dosso) and 26-year-old Diane Patisso (Asst. Prosecutor in Polk County, daughter of Phil Dosso and George Patisso's wife. FDLE Special Agent Tommy Ray says all four were shot execution style. He believes the murders were a professional hit based on evidence found at the scene and information developed from the investigation. The warehouse housed two companies, Erie Manufacturing/Garment Conveyor Systems, that manufactured metal racks used in dry cleaning businesses and department stores. The three partners were George Gonsalves (one of the victims), Phil Dosso (father of of 2 victims and father-in-law to one victim) and Nelson Serrano. On June 3, 1997 Phil and George voted to demote Nelson and strip him of his powers. That vote angered Nelson. He filed a civil lawsuit and created a competing business across town, American Slick Rail. Inc. A task force comprised of Bartow Police, Lakeland Police, FBI, Tenth Judicial Circuit State Attorney's Office and the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) is investigating this quadruple homicide. Detectives believe there are 2-3 suspects. The suspect is believed to have been the lookout for the team. The suspect is well dressed, possibly from South America, and should be considered armed and dangerous. He is probably a professional hit man, part of a team. Police think there are 2-3 other suspects.

**Marcelo Eduardo Cabrera** (Wanted for Questioning in the Bartow Quadruple Murder Case) -- Marcelo Cabrera is wanted for questioning in a quadruple murder that occurred on December 3, 1997 in Bartow, Florida. FDLE agents and Bartow Police Detectives near Tampa, Florida believe Marcelo Cabrera may know something about the murders, where four people were shot execution style inside the warehouse that housed two companies, Erie Manufacturing/Garment Conveyor Systems. The victims were George Gonsalves, 69, one of three business partners; Frank Dosso 35, son of business partner Phil Dosso; Diane Patisso, 26, daughter of Phil Dosso; and her husband George Pattiso, 26. They would like to question him since he worked for Nelson Serrano, one of the partners of the business, Erie Manufacturing/Garment Conveyor Systems, where the murders took place. The 11-million-dollar business made and installed

metal racks used at dry cleaning businesses and department stores. It was owned by Phil Dosso, George Gonsalves and Nelson Serrano. In June of 1997, Nelson was demoted and stripped of his power by Phil and George. Detectives believe a professional hit squad possibly from Ecuador or Colombia may be responsible for the crime. They say there are 2-3 suspects. Cabrera has used the alias Marcelo Eduardo Cabrera-Vanegas. He was born in Ecuador and smuggled into the U.S in 1989. He worked illegally for Nelson Serrano in Bartow in 1997. Cabrera is 34, 5'9" and 140 pounds.

**Martin Allen Johnson** (Parole Violation, Wanted For Questioning In A Homicide) -- On March 3, 998, the USMS-Portland issued a parole violation warrant on **Mark Johnson**. He is also wanted for questioning in the homicide of 15-year-old Heather Fraser, whose body was discovered on February 24, 1998 by a man walking his dog along the Columbia River. Johnson uses fake schemes to lure young females, such as petitions for lowering the drinking age and festivals filled with young girls. Johnson has used the aliases William Anthony and Stan Johnson. Although not a registered sex offender, Johnson has been known to provide drugs or drug young females and engage in sex while the victims are unconscious; he may also send Playgirl magazine or lingerie through the mail to young girls. Johnson frequently changes his hair color and style, and has obtained false ID with 12/19/71 as the date of birth, although he is actually some fifteen years older. He has worked at Home Depot in the plumbing department, and may be working as a plumber. He was born in Germany and speaks fluent German. He is known to frequent strip joints and underage dance clubs. Johnson is 42, 6'0" and 200 pounds.

9-year-old Erica Baker has been missing from Kettering, Ohio since February 7, 1999. Her mother says that Erica took her grey-and-white Shih Tzu, Jaime, for a walk around 4:00pm on Sunday, February 7, 1999. Police say around that time an elderly couple saw Erica and her dog walking in a nearby park, around a pond. When Erica didn't return home by 5:30pm her family went looking for her. Later that evening, police say Erica's dog was found by the same couple wandering alone at the nearby middle school, still attached to its leash. Police and over 300 volunteers joined the search, even draining the pond, but to no avail. Police want to question two potential witnesses who were seen in the area around the same time Erica was seen. The first is a white woman jogger who was wearing a white turtleneck, black Spandex pants and white tennis shoes. The other possible witness is a middle-aged white man who was wearing a black raincoat and walking a long-haired spaniel. Erica, a third grader and cheerleader at the Indian Riffle

Elementary School, is described as bubbly, but shy around strangers. She has pierced ears, and has the habits of twirling her hair and licking her lips, which may be chapped. When last seen she was wearing a pink raincoat, pink Winnie the Pooh sweatshirt, blue jeans and white tennis shoes. Following last week's broadcast, an AMW tipster in Dayton, Ohio claims to know the abductor and has given authorities the name "Charles". ### UPDATES:

**Ira Einhorn** -- It's no wonder Ira Einhorn is so pleased by the French judicial system. Even though he was convicted of murder in America, after several dates in French courts, he remained a free man. Here's his story from the beginning: In his native Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, Ira Einhorn was an all American teenager. He played football on the varsity squad and excelled in academics. But after high school, Einhorn changed. On a trip to San Francisco, Einhorn was introduced to the new 'hippie movement.' Back in Philadelphia, he became a counter-culture leader - a psychedelic guru for the City of Brotherly Love. In 1970, Einhorn was the official host for Philadelphia's Earth Day. The message he preached was peace and love, but underneath his hippie ideology friends say there was a far different message. He was a notorious womanizer, a man who delighted in taking women under his spell. For Holly Maddux, Einhorn was the embodiment of new age ideals. Once they moved in together, however, she soon realized what Einhorn was all about. He demeaned and humiliated her repeatedly, and soon took up with other women. In 1977, Holly finally left Einhorn, and began seeing another man. Snubbed, Einhorn became furious. He told Holly that unless she came back to his place to collect her belongings, he would dispose of everything. But it was only a ploy to get Holly back in his grasp. When she arrived, he killed her, then stashed her body in a steamer trunk. The next day, Einhorn convinced two friends to help him move a trunk from his apartment. He told them the trunk was full of papers about Russian psychic research and that he wanted to throw it in the river. It turned out the trunk was too big for the car, so it was left in a closet in Einhorn's apartment. Meanwhile, Holly's family and friends grew worried when they didn't hear from her. Einhorn began telling people that Holly had left the apartment to run an errand and never returned. Downstairs, Einhorn's neighbors noticed a terrible odor, but visitors to Einhorn's apartment actually assumed it was the hippie guru's own notorious body odor. Einhorn didn't appear to be at all concerned by Holly's 'disappearance.' He was more visible than ever - he lectured at Harvard, and he became recognized as an expert in both computer science and para-psychology. But Holly's family suspected Einhorn in their daughter's disappearance and they hired investigators. When they'd gathered enough evidence, they went to Philadelphia Police, who in turn went to visit Einhorn. In the closet, they found the steamer trunk. Einhorn was arrested and charged with the murder of Holly Maddux. Einhorn was represented by another famous Philadelphian, Arlen Specter - now a Republican senator. Specter did well for his client. Einhorn was released on bail to await his trial. But on the appointed day in January 1981,

Einhorn was a no-show. It turns out that wealthy friends had helped the killer slip out of the US. Throughout the next decade, there were Einhorn sightings all over Europe. America's Most Wanted was able to track him to former addresses in both Sweden and Ireland, but the homicidal hippie was always one step ahead of the law. In 1993, Einhorn was convicted in absentia and sentenced to life in prison. Some thought Einhorn would never be found. But, in 1997, Philadelphia authorities finally tracked Einhorn down - he was hiding in Southwest France. Since Einhorn was convicted in absentia, French officials refused to extradite him to America. That might have been the end of the road for justice, but Pennsylvania officials refused to give up. Pennsylvania governor, Tom Ridge, signed a law into effect that would give Einhorn a new trial - an unprecedented move that should have cleared the way for extradition. In September 1998, Einhorn was rearrested. When he stood before the French Court of Appeals, the notorious fugitive was actually released on bail. French courts have finally decided to extradite Einhorn to the US, provided he gets a new trial and does not face the death penalty. **Anatoliy Valenko (Murder)**

**Vladimir Balachov (Murder)** -- Valenko and Balachov are wanted by the New York City Police Department for the 1995 dismemberment murder of their roommates in a Brooklyn apartment. Police say that on November 12, 1995 the two murdered Fakhat Askarov and Fakhat's girlfriend, Larisa Jakovleva during an argument. Then detectives say Valenko and Balachov purchased a circular saw with the victim's credit card and dismembered the bodies. Police located Fakhat Askarov's head and leg and Jakovleva's leg on Plum Beach in Brooklyn. The torsos were located in a mountain reservation in Essex County, New Jersey. Both men are from the Ukraine and speak very little English. They may be hiding out in a Russian community, possibly in California or New York. Both men place personal ads in Russian newspapers to meet women. Both men have worked as carpenters in construction jobs, as a gas station attendant and as a cashier. Valenko is 27, 5'8" and 150 pounds. Balachov is 27, 5'10" and 150 pounds. Following last week's broadcast, AMW received over 80 tips on the pair. (See Show #529, OAD 2/13/99)

**Lena Dianne Townsend (Murder)** -- Lena Townsend is wanted for the 1998 murder of 4-year-old Karina Rowen in Piston, Tennessee. Sheriff's deputies say that in the summer of 1998 Karina came to live with her grandfather Richard Townsend and his new wife Lena after the girl's mother asked for some help. Neighbors and relatives say Lena Townsend was mean and yelled at the little girl a lot. On August 21, 1998 Richard came home from work around 4:30pm. Deputies say Lena told him that Karina was taking a nap. According to authorities, Lena later told her husband that Karina was fed and in bed asleep. The next morning Richard awoke and found a note from Lena say that she went to WalMart. Richard checked on Karina and found her dead in her bed. Deputies say that she died from blunt trauma to the head. Lena reportedly took \$8,000 and a loaded pump shotgun. She left in a dark brown 1985 Lincoln town car with

Tennessee tags. The car was later found in Conway, Arkansas. Inside was a receipt from a local Motel 6, empty camping gear boxes, hair dye and a bagful of hair remnants. U.S. Marshals say Lena Townsend was spotted in Uwharrie National Forest near Charlotte, North Carolina with her adult son. The two have since split up and the son claims he doesn't know his mother's whereabouts. Lena Townsend may be using the name Dianne Townsend or Lena Dianne Scoggins. She has several tattoos, including a Grim Reaper on her left arm, a turtle on her left breast, five dragons on her back, a dragon on her right breast, and an ankle bracelet tattoo on her right ankle. She is described as a "tough chick with a wild streak", and likes to hang out in biker bars. She may have dyed her hair, and she may have no bottom front teeth because her dental bridge was left behind. She is a survivalist and a trained mechanic who served four years in the army. She may be armed. Lena Townsend is 43, 5'6", and 165 pounds. Following last week's broadcast, a solid tip told authorities that Townsend was in Kansas. (See Show #529, OAD 2/13/99)

**Mark Anthony Williams** (Escape, Murder, Attempted Murder, Cocaine Distribution) -- Mark Anthony Williams escaped from the Robeson County Detention Center in Lumberton, North Carolina, on January 22, 1999. Authorities say Williams promised his cell mate Walter Lambert \$3,000 for the use of his identity. According to the US Marshals Service, Williams was released from the Robeson County Detention Center on \$20,000 bail after passing himself off as Lambert. Williams pulled this off, authorities say, by promising a GMC Tahoe to Vafiti and Dondai Washington, the two bail bondsman who bailed him out. Authorities say Williams is the leader of an East Coast drug network that uses murder and violence as a means of intimidation. While in the Robeson County Detention Center, Williams was awaiting trial on drug conspiracy charges, authorities say. According to the Marshals Service, Williams is charged with the murder of a 14-year-old and the attempted murder of a 12-year-old in Norfolk, Virginia. Williams is also wanted in connection with three murders in Raleigh, North Carolina and one in Brooklyn, New York. Williams has a handful of aliases, including Michael Nembhard, Alex Cruz, Jerome Adams, Michael Smiley, Junior Reed, Gary Edwards and Anthony Parker. He has scars on both arms and a tattoo on his left arm. He has a quiet, disarming personality, but is actually extremely violent. He is a native of Jamaica. Williams is 27, 5'9" and 175 pounds. Authorities are still seeking the public's help. (See Shows #528 and #529, OADs 2/6/99 and 2/13/99)

**CAPTURED:**

**Craig Herricks** (Murder) -- Craig Herricks is wanted by the Fulton County Sheriff's Office in Illinois for the November 1, 1998 murder of Tammy Thompson and the intentional homicide of her two unborn twins. Police say on the afternoon of November 1, Jerry Thompson returned to his home in Cuba, Illinois to find his wife Tammy, 20, missing. Jerry called the police. The police arrived at the scene and concluded that Tammy most likely had been taken

against her will based on the disorderly state of the house. On November 3, police interviewed Craig Herricks, a local burglar who had been arrested for stealing women's underwear from local residences. Police were curious about Herrick because he had struck the Thompson house before they moved there. During this inquisition police obtained evidence from Herrick's car a 1980 primer-colored Monte Carlo with the Illinois plate S54104. This evidence would later link him to Tammy's murder. On November 4, deer hunters spotted Tammy Thompson's body in a clear strip mine lake approximately 11 miles from Tammy's home. She had been murdered by asphyxiation. When the evidence obtained from Herrick's car returned from the lab, police positively identified Herricks as the killer. But Herricks and his car were nowhere to be found. Police later discovered that Tammy and Herricks went to high school together. However, at this time police have no reason to believe they knew each other on a social level. Just before this episode of AMW was about to go to air, police near New Orleans picked up a man who was driving erratically. Fingerprinting proved that he was Herricks.

*The following are the featured fugitives and others being sought by federal, state or local authorities. The Update (if any) gives current status, previous references, or related information.*

**Ramon Eduardo Arellano-Felix** (drug smuggling) -- The FBI and the DEA say that Ramon Eduardo Arellano-Felix is one of the leaders of the "Tijuana Cartel." Known for importing large quantities of controlled substances, the cartel has a reputation for violence. Numerous murders in the US and Mexico have been blamed on the Tijuana Cartel. On September 24, 1997, the FBI placed Ramon Eduardo Arellano-Felix on their list of the Top Ten Most Wanted fugitives. The State Department is offering a reward of up to US \$2 million for information leading to his arrest. Arellano-Felix is a Mexican native who may have dyed his hair blond and may have gained weight. He is known to frequent discos in Tijuana and he likes expensive cars. Among his known aliases are Gilberto Camacho Rodriguez, and Ramon Torres-Mendez. Arellano-Felix is 34, 6'2" and 220 pounds. (See Show #467, OAD 9/27/97)

**Lino Quintana (Arturo Martinez-Gonzalez)** (Murder, Kidnapping, Drug Trafficking) - Lino Quintana, whose real name is Arturo Martinez-Gonzalez, is wanted by Mexican authorities for the 1998 murder of Fermin Castro and eighteen other people in Ensenada, Mexico. Lino Quintana, Mexican authorities say, is the right-hand man of Ramon Arellano-Felix. Arellano-Felix, one of the FBI's Top Ten Fugitives, is one of the leaders of the Arellano-Felix Organization (aka the Tijuana Cartel). The Tijuana cartel, FBI agents say, is known for its importation of drugs and propensity for violence. In September of 1998 Arellano-Felix ordered a hit on Fermin Castro. Castro, an associate of Arellano-Felix, was allegedly skimming money and drugs from the Tijuana Cartel. Police say Arellano's men, led by Lino Quintana, ambushed Castro's Ensenada compound in the early morning hours of September 17, 1998, and shot and killed 19 people. Only Castro's fifteen-year-old daughter and eleven-year-old nephew survived. Thirteen of the alleged gunmen have been arrested, but the leader Quintana and his boss Arellano-Felix are still free. Quintana is also wanted by Mexican authorities for violating Mexico's Federal Crime Law for the Transportation and Possession of Marijuana, Cocaine and Methamphetamine, Possession of Arms and Kidnapping. Quintana is not wanted in the United States. Quintana has used numerous aliases, including Guero Quintana, Lino Portillo-Salazar, Lino Portilla, Arturo Martinez and Arturo Martinez-Quintana. He is 30, 5'8" and 210 pounds.

**Unknown (Murder)** -- On January 16, 1997, around 4:00pm the body of Count Alvise di Robilant, 72, was found in his third floor apartment in Palazzo Rucellai on Via della Vigna Nuovo in Firenze. He was found lying on the floor with a sheet over his head. Florence police say his skull had been smashed several times with a heavy object. There was no evidence of forced entry, no fingerprints, and nothing missing. The only thing out of the ordinary was the Count's computer screen had been smashed, a painting had been slashed, and a crystal "duck", that may have been used as a murder weapon, was missing. The Robilant family is from a lineage of royalty dating back to the 1500's. The count's family had links with the Portuguese royal family and the Moncenigo family which provided a number of the Doges of Venice. The Count enjoyed a debonair lifestyle that was enriched with art and culture. Art is what some authorities have speculated led to his demise. Count Alvise di Robilant headed the Florence office of Sotheby's until his retirement in 1989. The "art world" in Italy is known to be associated with illegal activity and it is speculated that the Count may have come across unfavorable people in his years at Sotheby's.

**Lee Chau-Ping (Drug Trafficking)** -- Lee is involved in trafficking the drug methylamphetamine hydrochloride, more commonly known as "ice". Hong Kong police say she has acquired the nickname "Queen of Ice" for her heavy involvement with the drug. According to authorities, Chau-Ping was last seen in Vancouver in October 3, 1992. Chau-Ping is 43 and 5'0".

**Peter Walaschek (Illegal Export, Money Laundering)**

**Frans Van Anraat (Illegal Export, Money Laundering)** -- Between October 1987 and April 1988, Van Anraat and Walaschek arranged for the illegal export of the chemical thiodiglycol from the United States. Thiodiglycol is an essential chemical in the production of mustard gas, a deadly blister agent used in chemical warfare. Authorities say Anraat and Walaschek arranged for the chemical to be illegally exported to Europe, and then reexported from Western Europe to the Persian Gulf area. According to police, funds were then transferred from the Bank of Iraq to bank accounts in the United States in payment for the chemicals. On January 26, 1989, Italian authorities arrested Anraat at the request of the U.S. government. Six months later, the U.S. extradition request was rejected by an Italian court. In February 1990, the Italian Supreme Court overturned that decision and order Van Anraat's extradition, but he had already fled Italian jurisdiction. Authorities believe Anraat is in Baghdad, Iraq. Walaschek is still on the run, but authorities know he has visited Singapore, Iran and Croatia in recent years. Walaschek legally changed his name to Peter Loimi on December 23, 1993. He is a German citizen and speaks German and English. He has worked as a pharmacist and in the import/export business. He wears glasses. Walaschek is 56, 6'2" and 180 pounds. Van Anraat is a citizen of the Netherlands who speaks Dutch, Italian and English. He too has worked in the import/export business. He wears glasses and may have a full beard. Van Anraat is 56, 5'11" and 180 pounds.

**Antonio Angles Martins (Abduction, Rape, Murder, Weapons Charges)** -- Angles Martins is wanted by the judicial authorities in Alcira, Valencia, Spain for the November 1992 abductions and subsequent murders of Miriam Garcia Iborra, Maria Deseada Hernandez Folce

and Antonia Gomex Garcia. Police say on November 13, 1992 Angles Martins and his accomplice, Miguel Ricardo Tarrega, picked up the three girls who were hitchhiking. According to authorities, they forced the girls into their car, then raped and tortured them. Police say Angles Martins then shot them to death. On January 27, 1993 the three bodies were found in an isolated spot in Tous, Valencia. Miguel Ricart Tarrega, Angles Martins' accomplice, has been arrested and is in prison in Spain, but Angles Martins is still on the loose. He faces a maximum sentence of 30 years imprisonment. Angles Martins is a dangerous, violent drug addict who takes Rohypnol. He has been arrested several times in Spain for burglary and drug trafficking. He speaks Spanish and Portuguese. Angles Martins is 32, 5'7" and has a slim build.

**Osama Bin Laden** (Conspiracy to Murder, Murder, Destruction of a Federal Facility) -- According to the Federal Bureau of Investigations, Osama Bin Laden, "with others known and unknown", has been charged with the August 7, 1998 bombings of the U.S. Embassies in Kenya and Tanzania. These attacks killed more than 220 people and seriously injured 5,000 men, women and children. Authorities say Osama Bin Laden is the leader of "Al Qaeda", a world-wide terrorist organization, with many members. In an indictment by the U.S. Attorney's Office handed down in November of 1998, it is alleged that Bin Laden, through al Qaeda, issues "fatwahs", urging members and associates to target U.S. facilities and personnel around the world. The U.S. Government is offering a reward of up to \$5 million dollars for information leading to the arrest or conviction of Bin Laden. Bin Laden sometimes spells his first name "Usama". He wears a beard and mustache, and speaks Arabic and poor English. Bin Laden is 42 and 6'5".

**Khaled Shaikh Mohammad** (Conspiracy to Destroy U.S. Aircraft) -- Mohammad is wanted by U.S. authorities for his alleged involvement in conspiring to bomb U.S. civilian airliners in 1995. On January 6, 1995 a fire broke out in the Manila, Philippines apartment of Khaled Mohammad. Authorities say the information developed from the investigation of this fire revealed that from August 1994 through January 1995, Mohammad unlawfully and wilfully conspired to bomb U.S. civilian airliners by placing explosive devices on twelve airliners flying over the Pacific Ocean during a two day period in January 1995. The U.S. Government is offering a reward of up to \$5 million for information leading to the arrest and prosecution of Khaled Shaikh Mohammad. Mohammad's aliases include Khaled Shaikh, Salem Ali, Abu-Khuala, and Ashraf Refat Nabiah Hanim. He has a long face and wears glasses, and may have grown a beard. He is 33, 5'4" and 132 pounds.

**Abdul Rahman Yasin** (Explosives Charges) -- Yasin is wanted by U.S. authorities for his alleged involvement in the 1993 bombing of the New York World Trade Center in which six

people were killed, and over 1,000 people were injured. Federal agents say after the bombing they obtained evidence which led to the indictments and arrests of several suspected terrorists involved in the bombing. Yasin, one of those indicted, fled the United States immediately after the bombing to avoid arrest. Authorities believe he fled to Iraq. Authorities say Yasin should be considered armed and dangerous. There is a reward of up to a \$5 million being offered by the State Department for information leading to the apprehension and prosecution of Yasin. Yasin has used the aliases Abdul Rahman Said Yasin, About Yasin, Abdul Rahman S. Tahar and Abdul Rahman S. Taher. He take medication for epilepsy. He has a medium build and may have grown a beard. Yasin is 38, 5'10" and 180 pounds.

**Unknown (2) (Theft)** -- The Danish National Police are looking for the thieves who stole two unprotected paintings from the Nivaagaard Collection in January 1999. The Nivaagaard is a small museum located in a town 15 miles north of Copenhagen. According to police, the two men bought tickets and entered the museum at 2:30pm. The guard that sold them the tickets heard a noise in the exhibit area and ran in. He saw one of the thieves with a Rembrandt in his hands. According to Danish police, the men then used a pair of clippers to cut the paintings free from a thin metal wire. A guard twice tried to stop the men, but was knocked down both times. The men fled in a stolen car which was later found abandoned. Controls at airports and border crossings were increased immediately after the theft, but no one has been arrested. The paintings were not protected by motion sensors, video cameras or alarms. The only guard in the small museum was seventy years old. According to police, the two men stole "Portrait of a Lady" by Rembrandt and "Portrait of a Young Man" by Bellini. The two paintings are worth an estimated \$16 million. A reward of \$50,000 is being offered to anyone with information leading the the recovery of the paintings. Both suspects are identified as tall men in their 40's.

**Elaine Antoinette Parent (Passport Fraud)** -- Elaine Parent is wanted by the State Department for Passport Fraud and has been named a "Vital Link In A Murder Investigation" in a 1990 homicide in St. Lucie County, Florida. On July 19, 1990 the mutilated remains of 34-year-old Beverly McGowen were found in a rural canal in St. Lucie County, Florida. Deputies say a short time before she died, Beverly told her family and friends that she had a new roommate by the name of "Alice", who police believe was actually Elaine Parent. On June 16, 1990 Beverly wrote a "goodbye" letter to her brother, telling him she was going away. Her brother knew something was wrong and canceled Beverly's credit cards, hoping it would force her to call him. Deputies say she never did and her body was found a few days later. On July 23, 1990 a woman tried to use Beverly McGowen's credit card to rent a car at London's Heathrow airport. But since the card had been canceled the mystery woman, whom police believe was Parent, ended up paying cash. The canceled card raised suspicions and when Scotland Yard was informed the

Beverly's gruesome murder, they intensified their manhunt. Three days later Parent called Avis and tried to extend the rental. British authorities say Parent told them she was near Cornwall, but in reality she was near Heathrow airport, where she abandoned the car. Police boarded every U.S.-bound aircraft looking for Parent but to no avail. Authorities say Parent eventually made her way back to the United States and in May of 1991 was found sleeping in her car. At the time she was using the name Charlotte Cowan. There was a warrant for Failure to Return the Leased Vehicle. Parent was arrested but was able to post bond just a few days later and hasn't been seen since. Parent's countless aliases include Charlotte Rae Cowan, Sylvia Ann Hodgekinson, Ann Tremont, Beverly McGowen, Elaine Haviland, Alex Hart, Alexis Marshal Hart, Antonia Hamilton Russell, Victoria Dark and Bret Tremont. Police describe her as a chameleon who often dyes her hair different colors. She has a "lazy" right eyelid, and may adopt a British accent, though she was born in New York City. She loves the good life and is a gourmet cook. She supports environmental issues, and loves animals though she may be allergic to cats. She has asthma and has been known to use the medication Ventolin. She travels all over the world but always seems to return to Florida. She has worked as a real estate agent and in the telecommunications field. Parent is 56, 5'7" and 125-145 pounds.

**Arsim Istrefi (Murder)** -- Istrefi is wanted for the December 17, 1996 murder of his wife. The only witness to the cruel murder was the couple's 3-year-old daughter, Victoria. Police say Istrefi then notified authorities of the death himself. Istrefi delivered Victoria to neighbors and disappeared. Istrefi has been hunted all over the world. Police think Istrefi first flew to the former Yugoslavia, but during the last few weeks police report that he has been seen in both Norway and Sweden. Authorities believe Istrefi is probably traveling by car. Istrefi is athletic, into weightlifting, and a student of karate. He is missing a tooth in the right side of his upper jaw. Istrefi is 31 and 5'6".

**John Patrick Gillespie (Fraud)** -- Authorities in Singapore are looking for John Gillespie. Police believe Gillespie and David Korem founded a fictitious country in the South Pacific called Melchizedek. Gillespie and his accomplice convinced hundreds of Chinese and Bangladeshi victims to buy passports for \$3,500. They were promised a new life and high-paying jobs. The majority of the people involved in the scam have been arrested, but Gillespie is believed to be in the Philippines. The police confiscated application forms for dominion passports and citizenship from accomplices in this scam. They believe the name Melchizedek came from the Old Testament. Melchizedek was a model priest to whom Abraham and others paid tithes. Authorities say Gillespie was also involved in the August 18, 1984 Bisbon "Fine Cotton" scam, in which the horse "Fine Cotton" was switched in order to throw the race. Gillespie is an Australian. He has thin lips and is known to wear a beard. He drinks beer, loves to gamble -- especially on horses -- and likes to live well. Gillespie is 58-59 years old with a

**Shin Chang-Won (Escape)** -- Shin Chang-Won is South Korea's most wanted man. After a conviction for murder and robbery committed in 1989, Shin was sentenced to prison in the southern port city of Pusan in 1990. In January 1997 he escaped and has remained a fugitive ever since. There have been numerous sightings of him in South Korea. It is believed that on July 15, 1998 Shin was almost apprehended by authorities in Seoul but assaulted the arresting officers and got away. He did leave behind a diary which describes his path since his escape. This incident followed numerous other events where it appeared that Shin would be captured. Since his escape, police believe he has committed additional burglaries and thefts. Shin has curly hair, and often has female wigs and makeup with him. He has numerous ID's. Some Koreans see him as a Robin Hood figure, who once donated \$1.8 million to a facility for the disabled. He is very elusive and a fast runner. Shin is 30-31 years old, 5'8" and 163 pounds.

**Unknown (Explosives Charges)** -- The unknown suspect is wanted for the August 27, 1998 bombing at the Bobst Factory in Prilly, Switzerland. Swiss police say the suspect mailed a package from the Geneva Post Office on August 26, 1998. The package was received at the Bobst factory the next day, and it exploded when it was opened. The Director of Sales, Philippe de Preux, and his secretary were seriously injured in the explosion. The unidentified suspect is still on the loose. Police say the suspect may have ties to the box-making industry and believe de Preux was the bomber's target. The Bobst factory is offering a reward for information leading to the identity of the bomber and/or his accomplices. The suspect wore a blue t-shirt with an unidentifiable logo, red pants, tennis shoes, a large silver ring on each hand and a watch on his left wrist. He carried a blue sports bag. The suspect is 5'4"-5'6".

**Mehdi Tayeb (Rape, Aggravated Assault, Passport Fraud)** -- Officials say Mehdi Tayeb is wanted for raping over thirty women after drugging them. Tayeb, diagnosed HIV positive, also had sex with over 200 Swedish women without using protection or telling any of them that he was infected with HIV. Tayeb was known to go to discos on a nightly basis to pick up women. According to officials, the nights that he didn't meet a willing candidate he would use the "date rape" drug Rohypnol to knock out victims and rape them. One woman has been diagnosed HIV positive and police assume that her infection came from sexual contact with Tayeb. Tayeb uses faked passports to pass himself off as a U.S. or Swedish citizen. Among his known aliases are James Patrick Kimball (DOB 8/19/59, U.S. national); Hedi Ben Mohamed Mazouz (DOB 9/21/68, Swedish national); Mark Milton Eckes (DOB 1/29/57, U.S. national); and Conrad Norman Fortin (DOB unknown, U.S. national). He uses lifts to increase his height,

and may wear colored contact lenses and makeup. He has variously claimed to be a personal trainer and an agent for modeling agencies. He has driven a cab for a living. He does not drink alcohol. He speaks fluent English with a slight accent, and broken Swedish. Tayeb is 45, 5'8" and 145 pounds.
