"A CONCERNED CITIZEN" Officer Jason Pate of the Fort Meyers Police Department in Florida, responds to a call involving a concerned citizen who reported that he was approached by an armed man who claimed that he used his gun in a bank robbery. Officer Pate locates the suspect in the parking lot of an apartment complex and immediately takes him into custody without incident. "PEACEWALKER" Officer Ryan Cook of the Las Vegas Police Department is dispatched to a fast food restaurant where a disturbed man has reportedly threatened a customer. The officer immediately detains the suspect (white) and interviews a male victim who describes how the man disparaged him by calling him President Bush while challenging him to a fight. "TRUE CONFESSIONS" Deputy Robert Elwell & Sgt. Kim Falk of the Lee County Sheriff's Office pull over a vehicle with an equipment violation. The officers become suspicious of the occupants (a male and two females) when they give conflicting information regarding their relationship.
