"ARMED & EMPTY"- Deputy assists other officers chasing a suspect on a stolen motorcycle. After a 20 minute high speed chase, the suspect runs out of gas and attempts to flee on foot. He is quickly apprehended with the assistance of a K-9 Unit and taken into custody. "SLICE N DICE"- Sergeant of the Pierce County Sheriff's Department responds to a domestic disturbance involving a stabbing at a nearby apartment complex. At the scene, the suspect claims that she accidentally stabbed her boyfriend after he slapped her. "ROOT OF ALL EVIL"- Deputy responds to a suspicious activity call from a local motel. Large groups of people have been reported to have been carrying large jars filled with liquid into one of the motel rooms. At the scene, Officer Wulick finds three suspects in a room filled with drug paraphernalia and a suitcase containing a partial methamphetamine lab. The suspects are quickly taken into custody and the room is searched.

08:30 - 09:00P COPS "SEATTLE/TACOMA" (CP-1313) (R-11/04/2000)  
(TV-14)  
"KEEP YOUR HEADS DOWN BOYS" -A Lakewood Pierce County Sheriff's Deputy attempts to pull over a vehicle for a small infraction. The driver refuses to stop, runs a red light, and a high speed chase begins. During the pursuit, the driver shoots at the pursuing officer and then points the gun at his head while driving recklessly. "HOT CAT HOUSE" -A Deputy of the Lakewood Police Department responds to a noise complaint. In route to the call, he encounters an apartment on fire. With assistance, he investigates a report of a baby who had possibly been left behind in one of the smoldering apartments. Officers discover that a woman who had screamed "my baby, my baby!" defiantly ran back into the apartment to rescue what turned out to be her cat. "LICENSE PLATE SPECIAL" -Officer responds to a reported fight involving multiple subjects. He is also advised that one of the subjects had been struck by a minivan which fled the scene. Although the victim escaped severe injury, the suspect destroyed his garden which embraced a key piece of evidence of the assault-the suspect's license plate.

Two weeks later, the boy's body was found in a remote canyon two hours from his home. Detectives have never stopped looking for the man responsible for this brutal murder of an innocent child. Officers discover that the second suspect has given them a false name and allegedly robbed the convenience store after he was denied employment the day before

"RING AROUND THE JUNKPILE" Sheriff's Deputy is investigating a potential abduction in a remote area. At the site, Nix and the other officers spot a shirtless, tattooed man running from a trailer. "CHECK IT OUT"- Sheriff's Deputy stops a truck that's been reported as stolen. The suspect is asked to get out of the vehicle and lie on the ground. He's cuffed and questioned. At the scene, officers question a man who claims he came home and discovered that his girlfriend and her children were destroying his house. "PUPPY LOVE DOMESTIC" - An officer responds to a domestic violence call. At the scene, officers find a battered female who has been attacked by her ex-boyfriend. The suspect, who had fled, is apprehended and returned to the scene.

"STOP RESISTING" An officer responds to an assistance call. He's informed that two suspects abandoned their stolen vehicle in an apartment complex after a unit attempted to pull them over. Officers find the desperate driver hiding in his apartment. He's taken into custody after resisting arrest. "HEY YOGI" An officer of the Tucson Police Department responds to a report regarding a brown bear in a palm tree. Richard Gerhardt, Fish & Game Warden, arrives and assesses the situation. After a few tense moments, the terrified animal is safely captured and skillfully placed in a holding cage. "INNOCENTS SHOT" - When an officer arrives at the scene of a shooting, he finds a fellow officer clutching a wounded five-year-old female.
