Using a taxi as a decoy, an officer poses as a "buyer" in hopes to avoid detection by the streetwise peddlers. At the scene, the officer immediately detains a female resident. The male complainant is questioned and tells an officer that woman threatened his life and then stabbed him in the arm with a pair of scissors. "CALL OUT YOUR CHILDREN" Officers David Miramontes and Paul Cervantes of the Fresno Police Department respond to a domestic disturbance call. The officers question a distraught woman who claims that her husband threatened her with a knife and threatened to kill their children. The suspect is apprehended without incident and eventually admits to assaulting and threatening his wife after she failed to return from a meeting. During a routine search of the house, the officers confiscate a large knife and a shotgun

COPS "COAST TO COAST" (CP-1821) (2R- 3/25/06) (TV-PG: V)
"NO" Detective Brian Nicholas and Detective Calvin Kennedy of the Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania Bureau of Police detain a male they see at the side window of a black truck who quickly leaves when he sees the undercover officers. Although he denies involvement in any illegal activities, crack pipes are soon discovered in his pockets. "CAN'T HIDE FROM K-9" Officer Alan Edwards and K-9 Officer Craig Hamilton of the Spokane, Washington Police Department respond to a call regarding a male who has been eluding police and burglarizing homes. The suspect is initially found hiding on the roof of a dwelling but soon climbs into an attic window and hides in a crawl space.
