While he initially denying any involvement in the shooting, the neighbor subsequently admits to to the killing as a response to residential armed robbery.

"DES MOINES: NAKED MAN II" - An officer responds to report of a violent man in a park, she spots the deranged man nude and covered in blood. Officers cautiously order the uncontrollable man to get down on the ground, but he instead charges down the street and smash a large hole in a wood fence. Officers learn that the nude man is under the influence of PCP. "CHATTANOOGA: U HAUL LOVE FEST" - An officer responds to a call regarding a suspicious vehicle in the parking lot, he spots a U Haul truck where he finds a nude couple asleep in the back of the truck. "ATLANTA: CAUGHT IN THE KUDZU" - While on routine patrol, an officer attempts to make a routine stop for a minor traffic violation. When the driver pulls over, he suddenly the suspect takes off and during the subsequent high-speed pursuit through a residential area, the driver crashes into several parked cars. He abandons his car and slips away by running into an apartment complex and is apprehended by assisting officers following the brief foot chase.

"DIDN'T DO NUTHIN" While on patrol in an area known for drug activity, officers spot a male suspect acting suspiciously. After a brief foot pursuit, the officers tackle the suspect. "COMPRESSOR CONFESSION" Officers locate a stolen piece of construction equipment in a neighborhood garage. The machinery, a compressor, is located using a Lo-Jack anti-theft device installed in the unit. "GRAB BAG" - Police respond to a call involving a purse snatching. At the scene, the officers are directed by witnesses to a male suspect fleeing the scene. The suspect is stopped by the officers and after a brief struggle he is cuffed.

"CHATTANOOGA - YOU 'BOUT STUPID" - Officers attempt to stop a stolen vehicle, a dangerous high-speed pursuit ensues, ending when the suspect slamming his vehicle into a house. After trying to escape on foot, the suspect is promptly captured. "FORT WORTH - BBQ MOTEL" - While on routine patrol, an officer spots smoke coming from a local motel and immediately evacuates the guests. A local fire company quickly arrives and successfully battles the flames. Furthermore, she is not in possession of her driver's license. She claims that is because her son-in-law was arrested for shoplifting a gift for her daughter's birthday and she needed to take his car home. "KNOCK KNOCK, WHO ME?" - Officers respond to a call for back-up in a situation where a woman is being held against her will in a man's apartment at knife-point by a man who also claims to have a gun. The officers suit up in the appropriate protective gear, make a tactical entry into the apartment and rescue the victim

"AIN'T GONNA STOP JUST YET" - A pursuit ensues after police attempt a routine traffic stop. The Deputies decide to terminate the pursuit when the chase becomes too dangerous only to have the driver lose control of his vehicle and crash. "A FRIEND IN NEED" - After a 911 hang-up call, a Deputy learns that the call is regarding a domestic dispute involving a woman battered by her drug addicted husband. "I'M IN XTC" - The Narcotics Unit sets up reverse sting operation designed to capture a suspected drug dealer. An undercover officer poses as a hospitalized drug buyer who has arranged for the dealer to make the transaction in the parking lot of the hospital.

"DES MOINES: NO PARKING ON GRASS" An officer lends assistance to the pursuit of a suspect. After spotting the suspect he promptly apprehends him without incident.
"CHATTANOOGA: NOT YOUR HOUSE" Officers respond to a report of a domestic disturbance at a local residence, they find a woman who tells them that when she arrived at the residence of her ex-husband, she found her ex-husband's girlfriend and house in total disarray. Both males are found to have warrants and are taken into custody. "MAX'S FIRST BITE" - Officer responds to a domestic call. At the scene he questions a female victim who describes how her boyfriend hit her in the face during an argument and then fled. The male suspect is considered armed and dangerous after officers are told that he may have a gun. After an extensive search, the suspect is found hiding in scrub brush by a police dog and is quickly taken into custody.

"HANG ON MICK" - An officer responds to a call regarding a stabbing and finds a male suffering from a stab wound to his stomach. The victim's friends rally around him and labor to keep him conscious until paramedics arrive. "METHOD MAN" - While on routine patrol, an Officer spots a vehicle with a busted tail light. He becomes suspicious when the driver pulls over and gets out. During a routine search, Officer Walker discovers a box in the cab of the vehicle which contains paraphernalia for a methamphetamine lab.
