KIIS-FM and KVV5-FM provide their listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- **Art:** The Art of Elysium is an artist organization built on the idea that through service, art becomes a catalyst for social change. Their full circle approach rewards altruistic creativity by giving back to artists who share their gifts with those in need. Art of Elysium currently serves 2,510 artists a year in Los Angeles.
- **Awareness:** CRPS Forum. Founder, Roxanne Dawn was diagnosed with CRPS (Chronic Regional Pain Syndrome) a rare neurological disease in 2011. In 2014, she created the forum to educate, support, research and raise awareness for CRPS.
- **Disability:** Easter Seals provides exceptional services, education, outreach and advocacy so that people with disabilities can live, learn, work and play in our communities. Angel City Sports is the leading Paralympic movement in Southern California, creating year-round sports opportunities for anyone with a physical disability.
- **Education:** Cal State Fullerton Communications Week (COMM) is a major event hosted by CSUF's College of Communications featuring over 50 speakers, panels and special events mostly free and open to the public. The University of Redlands connects students to opportunities through its collaborative efforts and caring learning community.
- **Empowerment:** The Next Fun Thing coordinates events that assist various charities and on 6/9/19, in collaboration with the City of Huntington Beach and Miracles For Kids, The Next Fun Thing and The Emovation Project united over 1,000 people to beat the world record for the Largest Gathering of People Dressed as a Fruit or Vegetable. Miracles for Kids benefits families with critically ill children. Las Fotos Project's mission is to elevate the voices of teenage girls from under-resourced communities. Through the lens of photography, students capture moments that inspire them and others to critically examine the world around them. This exploration empowers the students we serve to become agents of change, channeling their creativity for the benefit of themselves, their community, and future careers. Thomas House Family Shelter provides a safe, supportive environment and resources to aid homeless families with children. Pretty Woman Pray Not Prey assists underrepresented women and girls to reach their highest potential by hosting events and providing resources.

- **Environmental:** Kids Ocean Day is an annual celebration and call to action for the protection of the world's oceans. The event's goal is to allow students from underserved schools to interact with the environment in order to truly learn the importance of preserving it.
- **Humanity:** The Immigrant Family Legal Clinic is a partnership between UCLA School of Law, the UCLA School of Education and Information Studies and LAUSD, provides a range of no-cost legal support to students and families and provides information, counseling and representation for unaccompanied minors and asylum-seekers, community outreach and education, and policy research and advocacy.
- **Literacy:** Get Lit - Words Ignite is a California-based arts education nonprofit that has transformed the landscape of teen literacy by empowering new generations in literature self-expression and performing arts.
- **Mental Health:** Didi Hirsch Mental Health Services is home to the nation's first Suicide Prevention Center, serving thousands of low-income families throughout Southern California and working closely with media to reduce stigma and discrimination associated with mental illness, substance abuse and suicide. Journey Of The Heart is the journal written by seventeen-year-old Katie Williams after she lost her teenage brother to suicide. The private, raw and unedited pages of her journal are a companion for anyone who has been impacted by suicide. This book shows them they are not alone and there is hope.
- **Poverty / Homelessness:** Masters of Taste is a food and beverage festival that takes place on the Rose Bowl field with 100% of the proceeds benefitting the Union Station Homeless Services. HavASole's mission is to provide the homeless population and at-risk youth with quality footwear to encourage healthier lifestyles, and prevent disease. LA On Cloud 9 (LAC9) is a non-profit dedicated to serving the homeless community and their animals by providing basic essentials and resources, such as hygiene items, food, clothing, blankets, shoes and more. Project Hope provides guidance, resources and other social-support services to individuals in under-served areas. Corazones En Accion provides life changing programs and activities in the lives of economically disadvantaged and homeless families in the Inland Empire. Services include a 5-day food pantry, toys, clothes, school supplies and other basic items. BARE TRUTH is an L.A. based organization providing mentorship, independent living assistance and wellness services to impoverished individuals and families to help them attain healthy, purpose-driven lives, and ultimately changing the economic and living conditions of communities.
- **Volunteer:** The San Gabriel Panthers are a local team of Beep Baseball players, which is an adaptive version of America's favorite pastime for the blind, low-vision and legally blind. The Panthers began their journey with only four players and one volunteer, but after a lot of hard work, media coverage and word of mouth, within 4 months the team has grown to over twelve players with 5 coaches along with several volunteers. The Panthers will be competing in the 2019 Beep Baseball World Series in Tulsa Oklahoma.

- **Wellness:** The Lupus Research Alliance is the world's leading private funder of Lupus research whose mission is to find better treatments and ultimately prevent and cure systemic lupus.
- **Youth Empowerment:** Pedal on the Pier is a high energy annual fundraising event which benefits the Harold Robinson Foundation's efforts to improve the lives of our city's impoverished youth by providing them with a camp retreat where they participate in diverse recreational programs that are designed to strengthen confidence, independence, build character and develop leadership skills. One More Win helps underserved high school athletic programs with necessary equipment and resources. Their goal is to elevate the sports experience for youth in schools that don't receive the support or funding like others. When a school is chosen to receive a donation, they will target specific needs such as: equipment, nets, surfacing, uniforms, tournament entry fees, and other ways to help a team in need be MORE productive.
