Jack since his retirement in 2001 has been on a mission to fill-up all the databases of the lost soldiers. One project is a picture of everyone lost in Vietnam from CT. He is missing only 100 pictures now. He is one of 7 people in the country allowed to enter information into the navy memorial. He changes the lost in sea –to specific information. Kimberly started off by describing New Horizons and its services. These include shelters and safe houses, family violence victims advocates for the courts and counseling. She gave us the definition of abuse: pattern of coercion and abuse in an intimate relations ship. 1 in 4 women and 1 in 7 men will victims in their lifetime. It is very pervasive in our society. Nationally 12,000 homicides a year are from DV. We need to become more comfortable in discussing. Take a non-judgmental supportive stance. Some frightening statistics boys who grow up are 2fold risk as abusers women as victims. Kimberly discussed how this manifests' during age of kids who witness domestic violence. Now there are 14. He discussed how helpful other local wineries were when opening. The state of CT has a CT Wine Trail Passport which they are one of 38. However, he also belongs to a B&B group and the Coastal Vineyards (MA,RI & CT). He discussed drinking responsible – wine tastings are only 4 oz. total. Bring food meet friends and enjoy the scenery.

They hold practices, race events and national competitions all year for kids and adults. CCAP identifies where the best places to ride in our state are. We directed viewers to their website for a list of events including the upcoming big fundraiser and ride. Mark Johnston noted that while cycling is one of the most popular sports there is very little structure and CCAP provides that structure. He then discussed his amazing bike ride across America that he just completed. He wanted to do this for over 30 years and had a window of six weeks in his schedule and went for it. He started at the pier in Santa Monica and road the mouth of the CT River 3294 miles over 35 days. The team followed in a van carrying luggage and spare bike.
