Crime	The Shell Station on Grandview Road in Raleigh County was robbed. The search is on for a black man with a gun who robbed the store and made off with an undisclosed amount of money.	7/1/15

Superintendent Vicki Hinerman said the middle school was not targeted, and the immediate danger passed. Hinton's Chief of Police agrees the middle school was not targeted. Police are still looking for a dark red or maroon Dodge extended-cab pickup with a "loud" exhaust. Sheriff Wheeler does believe alcohol played a factor in the shooting. He also says they are not exploring the possibility of self-defense, because of statements from witnesses at the scene. Political/Economy	During the Coal Forum in Bluefield on Thursday, friends of coal from legislators to industry representatives came together to discuss how the industry has changed and what is in its future. The panel gathered to discuss the battle between the coal industry and the EPA and how they intend to fight for the industry. Crime	A man convicted of child sex crimes was supposed to be back in court today. Back in July, Johnnie Ray Champ was found guilty on two counts of soliciting a minor by computer, and one count of attempt to commit a felony of first degree sexual assault. Champ allegedly tried to pay the mother of a five-year-old girl, \$104 in exchange for sex. The mother then worked with Beckley Police to capture Champ. Champ's sentencing was postponed until a psychological evaluation is complete. No date has been set for the sentencing.	8/27/15
Economy	West Virginia's ginseng digging season gets underway tomorrow. The season will last until November 30 <sup>th</sup> . The herb grows all over West Virginia, and the State Department of Commerce says its roots sold last year for an average of \$508 a pound. After a plant's roots are removed, state law requires that its seeds and berries be replanted in the spot where it was harvested. Plants must be at least 5 years old to be harvested.	8/31/15
Education	Officials at WVU voted today to move WVU Tech from Montgomery to Beckley. The unanimous vote by the board of governors will create a new campus, called WVU Beckley, home of WVU Tech. The new location is expected to be fully operational by Fall 2017. A number of elected officials tried to persuade the board of governors to delay its vote. They were asking the board to reconsider the substantial economic backlash that Montgomery and Fayette County could now face. University officials say they did not use rash judgment.	9/1/15
