Economy	The New River Gorge Regional Development Authority held a press conference at Tamarack today. The event highlighted the Regional Accelerator and Destination Beautification Projects. The RDA is working to extend the program to help bring more tourists and businesses to the area. Education	First year medical students at Marshall University have a chance at a new scholarship. The money comes from a loan program that was set up by Massey Energy. Yesterday, Alpha Natural Resources announced the agreement with the Joan C. Edwards School of Medicine. The program encouraged medical students to practice rural medicine after their residencies. First preference for the scholarship will be given to a son or daughter of an Alpha employee. Second preference goes to a student from a county where the company has an operation. Crime	Three people in Raleigh County are arrested on meth charges. Eric Shrewsbury, Barry Bishop, and Candy Bristow are arrested for making meth. Healthcare	Patients at the VA Clinic in Maxwelton are being relocated once again, to the Beckley VA Medical Center. According to a press release, employees reported issues with air quality of the clinic in Greenbrier County. Testing found high levels of formaldehyde in the air. Veterans will be notified of the change in location for their scheduled appointments. This is the third time this clinic has been closed within the last year because of air quality issues.	4/13/15
Crime	A man charged with running a meth lab is in court. Bradley Williams is accused of operating a meth lab at a home on Fulton Avenue in Beckley. Williams pleaded guilty to felony conspiracy. He's sentenced to one to five year in prison. That sentence was suspended. Instead, he's serving two years of supervised probation.	4/14/15
Political	The long-time mayor of one Fayette County town is resigning. Michael Martin served as mayor of Mount Hope for sixteen years. He resigned during a city council meeting yesterday. Martin had heart bypass surgery in December. His doctor suggested he resign from his post. Mike Kessinger served as interim mayor while Martin was on medical leave. The council says it plans to appoint Kessinger for the remainder of Martin's term.	4/15/15

In a news release, the US Office of Special Counsel says an investigation found that the tactic was allegedly used back in 2013 as a cost-saving effort. The counsel says it has informed the White House and Congress that the hospital put patients at risk. The report says the hospital has agreed to review medical records and conditions of patients discontinued from anti psychotic drugs.	4/23/15
Crime	A reported shooting in Mercer County leaves two people injured. Deputies tell us it happened on Beckley Road in Kegley yesterday. One person injured was taken to a local hospital. Deputies say the owner of the property told them he shot the two people in self defense because they would not leave his property. The Mercer County Sheriff's Department and State Police are investigating. No charges are being filed at this time.	4/27/15
Healthcare	New statistics show West Virginia has three times as many cases of Hepatitis as any other state. And the counties with the highest rates sit right here in southern West Virginia, Raleigh, and Mercer County, by a staggering number.
