Biblical Hospitality	Current SA01	The ladies of Current talk about showing hospitality to friends and strangers alike, sharing stories from their own experiences as well as biblical evidences that Christians are called to “love strangers.” They talk about some of the obstacles that stand in the way of making hospitality a part of everyday life, and share practical ways to show hospitality (i.e. inviting others in for a meal and conversation, taking them out to dinner, or simply starting up a conversation with those near us in the grocery store or on our kid’s playground).	10/04/19 to 12/06/19 10X / 30 min each
Finding the Purpose in Pain	Current SA02	The ladies of Current talk about pain (physical, emotional, and spiritual), and whether there is a purpose for it. They discuss pain’s ability to protect us by drawing our attention to something that is hurting us and needs tending to, and the ability of pain to point us to our need for Jesus Christ. They share stories as wives and mothers of dealing with the pain of their own families and friends, and how to help those around us who are hurting.	10/11/19 to 12/13/19 10X / 30 min each
Protecting the Environment	Current SA03	The ladies of Current talk about climate change and the role we play in taking care of the environment. Featuring special guest, Dr. Eric Smaw, Professor of Philosophy at Rollins College, they address the specific problems our planet is experiencing, how we can be part of the solution, and what the Bible has to say about taking care of the world around us. For example, they talk about the difference between “climate” and “weather,” discuss the roles of cars, eating, and fashion in climate change, and address God’s role as Creator and our role as creation.	10/18/19 to 12/20/19 10X / 30 min each
Prison Reform	Current SA04	The ladies of Current are joined by special guest Dr. Eric Smaw, Professor of Philosophy at Rollins College to talk about prison reform. They address the overcrowded prison system, the need for rehabilitation, and the death penalty. Toxic Masculinity	Current SA05	The ladies of Current are joined by special guest Dr. Eric Smaw, Professor of Philosophy at Rollins College to talk about “toxic masculinity” and practical ways to raise godly men. They first describe toxic masculinity as the “machismo” culture that promotes violence, abuse, and overexaggerated pride and self-reliance. They discuss harmful stereotypes that men are expected to conform to, and how we can combat unhealthy molds of masculinity by teaching our children to love and serve others, and by allowing men to experience a full range of emotion.	11/01/19 to 12/18/19 8X / 30 min each
Family-Appropriate Entertainment	Current SA06	The ladies of Current discuss ways that families can help protect kids and teens from inappropriate entertainment and the harmful effects of too much social media consumption. They discuss family activities as alternatives to electronic entertainment, like reading books, swimming, riding bikes, etc. They suggest practical tools where families can check reviews of entertainment to see if it’s safe for certain ages. From a biblical perspective, they also talk about what the Bible says about protecting what is filtered through our five senses.	11/08/19 to 12/31/19 8X / 30 min each
Harmful Effects of Vaping	Current SA07	The ladies of Current discuss the cultural trend of vaping. They define vaping and talk about its harmful effects on children and adults. As mothers, the ladies share personal stories of talking to their own children about the dangerous new trend. They also discuss how parents can protect kids and teens from being exposed to this harmful influence, as well as how to constructively help those who do vape quit vaping before life-threatening results ensue.	11/15/19 to 12/30/19 6X / 30 min each

Knowing Our Purpose and Gratefulness	Current SA08	The ladies of Current tackle the hard questions of “why are we here?” and “how can we live more abundantly and purposefully for the Lord?” They talk about how our ultimate purpose is to glorify God, but also some practical ways to identify God’s purpose and plan for your life, and how to live intentionally. They also discuss how we live more abundantly by being grateful to God daily and amid every situation. Practical Lessons from Women of the Bible	Current SA09	The ladies of Current discuss some of their favorite women of the Bible and share some practical applications from their lives for us in the 21 st Century. They share the stories of Hagar, Esther, Sarah, and Deborah, and how through them we can be encouraged that God sees us and is with us in difficult times, be inspired to live with “courage, confidence, and conviction,” see how we can speak life into others by speaking God’s word to them, and even be challenged to respect and honor our spouses when they make difficult decisions. Suicide and Mental Illness	Current SA10	The ladies of Current discuss the difficult topic of suicide and mental illness. They address some statistics about both suicide and mental illness (i.e. anxiety and depression), including who is at risk and what some of the warning signs are. Having a Spirit of Generosity	Current SA11	The ladies of Current are joined by special guest Shameka Daniels (pastor's wife) to discuss the topic of generosity, including how to not only be financially generous, but how to create a family culture of generosity that gives time, talent and resources as acts of love. They share experiences of witnessing their parents' spirits of generosity growing up, as well as their own ways of "giving," and how they hand down this heart of giving to their kids and teens by teaching them to value, respect, and serve others. They also talk about fun for the family on Christmas day, like nerf gun wars, Wii competitions and ping pong tournaments. They share ways they keep Christ at the center of the holiday, like baking a birthday cake for Jesus, reading the Christmas story from the Bible, and putting up a nativity scene. Their support-network model mobilizes church groups of 6-10 people that provide help in practical ways like weekly check-ins and counseling, help with the laundry, a hot-meal provided once a week, and childcare for a monthly date night. Barbara is also joined by Brad and Susan Kauffman, another couple who fosters children despite having seven biological children of their own. Sleep in Heavenly Peace is an all-volunteer non-profit charity that builds and delivers beds and bedding to children who do not have a bed. Bill and Tammy share stories of how they got involved in the ministry and moments they treasure of seeing kids receive their beds.
