6/21/16 WILDFIRE SAFETY "Firefighters Concerned 2 Wildfires Near IE Could Merge Into One" Firefighters continue to battle two wildfires burning perilously close to one another in the San Gabriel Mountains northwest of the Inland Empire.

- 7/5/16 LATINO ISSUES; POLITICS AND ELECTIONS "UCR Study: Latinos Are Among Least Likely To Participate In Political Process" While California may now be majority Latino, a new study out of UC Riverside finds that Latinos are among the least likely groups in the state to participate in the democratic process.
