5/16-17/16 MUNICIPAL ISSUES; PUBLIC SAFETY; CITY OF SAN BERNARDINO
"Police Chief Jarrod Burguan - The KVCR Interview" KVCR FM News aired a 2-part sit-down interview with San Bernardino Police Chief Jerrod Burguan, touching on issues ranging from his high-profile role during the San Bernardino Inland Center shootings, residual issues from the Dec. 2 attack, the recent spike of murders in San Bernardino, and the affect of the San Bernardino city bankruptcy on the operation of – and morale within – SBPD.

5/16/16 MUNICIPAL ISSUES; CITY OF RIVERSIDE "Riverside Spending Freeze Through End of Fiscal Year" Inconsistent revenue streams are prompting the city of Riverside to implement a spending freeze through the end of the fiscal year.

5/18/16 SAN BERNARDINO TERROR ATTACK; LOCAL MENTAL HEALTH
"Psychotherapist Teaches How to Manage Trauma After Terror Attacks" KVCR FM News interviewed the founder of a mental health program that helps survivors of traumatic violence – such as the Dec. 2 terrorist attack in San Bernardino – cope with the PTSD symptoms, anxiety and trauma after a violent experience.

"Beaumont Learns Details Of Corruption Charges Against Former City Officials" KVCR FM News reported on the court arraignments of several former top officials with the City of Beaumont on charges of corruption, including siphoning nearly \$20 million from city accounts.
