KVCR FM News Issues and Programs from June 26 2015 through July 22 2015

From the last week of June through July, KVCR FM News provided up-to-date comprehensive coverage of an extraordinary number of public safety emergencies affecting the Inland Empire.

KVCR FM News continued to file scores of on-air reports – including national news reports for NPR – and 7-day-a-week updates on kvcrnews.org on the wrap-up of the large and long-burning Lake Fire in the San Bernardino National Forest, the Sterling Fire in north San Bernardino, the Merwyn Fire on the outskirts of Moreno Valley, and the spectacular North Fire, which got international TV and social media coverage of wildfire flames jumping lanes of I-15 near the Cajon Pass, burning cars and trucks stalled on the major route between Southern California and Las Vegas.

Also, KVCR FM News provided national reports and special local coverage of the impact of the I-10 freeway bridge collapse that closed traveler and truck traffic on the main route between Los Angeles and Phoenix.

Our website analytics showed that our constant coverage and updates to those public safety emergencies multiplied visits to kvcrnews.org by hundreds of hits.

Inland Empire Economic Partnership Chief Economist John Husing began a new weekly series, analyzing how the factors that affect international trade and retail commerce have a direct effect on the Inland logistics economy.

We also gave extra local coverage of the repercussions of the California drought, and legislation in the state Capitol affecting the interests of the Inland Empire.
